The main activity undertaken by the NUHA Foundation was to run the Blogging Prizes, namely an annual writing competition designed in accordance with the objects of the charity, as set out above. The Blogging Prizes were held annually from 2011 to 2019, and interrupted these past two years due to the pandemic. We hope to resume them again in the next financial/reporting year.


