Introduction

Over the past year, CAD Brent has continued to demonstrate that the Hubs Team is not only essential but transformative for the dementia community in Brent. Our strong and evolving partnership with Brent Memory Services has ensured a steady stream of referrals, enabling us to provide timely, compassionate, and practical support to families navigating the complexities of dementia care.

In May 2025, CAD Brent proudly celebrated its 10th anniversary with a vibrant community talent show. This milestone marks a decade of unwavering commitment to people living with dementia (PLWD) and their families. From a borough once devoid of community support, we have grown into a lifeline—delivering 18 dementia cafés across Brent, offering safe, welcoming spaces where isolation is replaced with connection, care, and joy.



De-Café Network

Our café network has expanded to 18 active dementia cafés (“de-cafs”) across Brent, each offering a rich tapestry of activities, workshops, and support. These cafés are the beating heart of our community outreach, bringing advice and wellbeing directly to those who need it most.

Highlights include:

- Two thriving Gujarati-speaking cafés, serving over 80 attendees weekly—breaking down language barriers and stigma associated with a diagnosis.

- New grants secured for regular exercise sessions at four cafés, carer training, and health workshops.
- Current funding applications made and awaiting outcome for enrichment activities such as Art workshops.
- Regular activities that bring together this community to share ideas resources and build a resourceful supportive community.



Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG)

The Hubs Team continues to be a trusted source of support post-diagnosis, helping families navigate a fragmented care system with empathy and expertise.

Yearly Impact:

- 335 new referrals
- 459 unique clients supported
- 2,314 episodes of advice delivered
- £469,368.49 in additional income raised for clients

We would not have made as much progress without CAD Brent. Navigating the various medical Services, councils, and the plethora of organisations that one has to deal with. We are far more aware of what we are entitled to, how various agencies should behave and what we should expect and/or should ask for. Social Activities and Creative Health

From Bollywood dancing to Tai Chi, our activities cater to diverse interests and needs. The launch of our community choir, Songs of Joy, has been a highlight—enhancing cognitive function and fostering belonging.



Communication and Peer Support

Our WhatsApp group (currently has 260 members) continues to be a vital tool for communication, peer support, and engagement. It enables real-time updates, surveys, and recruitment for events, while fostering a sense of community among carers and PLWD.



Dementia Hub Project

The Dementia Hubs Team has secured a further 3 years of funding from the Lottery Fund, meaning the good work of the project will continue until at least June 2025.

This year the project has gone from strength to strength, building on the firm foundations made during the first 3 years of funding. We have been able to establish ourselves as the leading community resource in Brent for people living with dementia and their families. We are a respected and valued partner to the statutory services, offering families impacted by dementia a lifeline when they most need it. Our well-established referral pathway with the memory clinic ensures we receive regular referrals from the clinical team who understand the benefit and worth of the work we do. Our focus is to improve the life of people living with dementia (PLWD) allowing them to remain living at home as long as possible, and ensuring they have access to physical and mental stimulation.

The Hubs Team is experienced and professional, and we are able to draw on the strengths and enthusiasm of our individual team members to create an award winning team. Last summer we were fortunate enough to be given the 'Team of the Year' award in the Brent Social Care awards.

We continue to support and extend the Dementia Café network in Brent, with 16 active groups accommodating some 350 café guests each week. We are also working with 2 new community venues who are keen to start a dementia café; supporting them to get these new cafés established. The IAG team continue to work from the café settings – ensuring we are able to reach as many people as possible who need our support. In addition to this we continue to source and arrange additional wellbeing activities and training for the café network. This year we have been able to offer First Aid training for carers, Lasting Power Of Attorney workshops as well as some enrichment events from the Royal Albert Hall and the Wallace collection to name just a few.

Community events are regularly arranged bringing together café guests from across the network to share stories, light exercise and lunch. These quarterly events are a great way to gather information from our community and provides us with the opportunity to get feedback on services, helping us plan for the future. We will continue to be led by our community, ensuring we keep PLWD at the heart of all we do.

Both Danny Maher and Debbie Howe attend the Brent Dementia Steering group and are able to feed back to the group the concerns of the community. This helps statutory services plan for the future with PLWD in mind. We continue to work towards Brent being a dementia friendly borough by offering dementia friends training and reaching out to hard to reach communities, such as the Gujarati community who we recently presented to some 150+ elders alongside the Memory Service.

In the last year we have:

- received 413 new referrals.
 - Raised the income of our clients by £474,561.00.
 - Grown our Whatsapp community to over 200 people.
 - Offered 192 advice clinics at the de-café venues.




CAD-Brent Annual Report April 2022

The Trust for London funding of the Dementia Voices Project continued through lockdown and reopening; aiming to improve the lives of people living with dementia in Brent by giving Dementia a voice through influencing on policy and decision making that affects them. This improves the health and wellbeing of people living with dementia through enabling them to have contact with and offer support to each other. The activities undertaken include working with statutory bodies and service providers, organizing site visits to audit their facilities and having a peer support network of people with dementia.

As we came out of the strict lockdown the team worked to support the Covid vulnerable clients who had suffered stress and potential isolation, both of which aggravate symptoms of dementia and can increase the speed of progression.

The number of users attending local service provider meetings was restricted during lockdown but online CCG Dementia Steering Group meetings continued monthly and users attended four meetings. Participants increased their involvement in decision-making by CAD attending the online All-Party Parliamentary Group on Dementia (APPG) and the GLA/Alzheimer's Society People's Panel.

CAD also set up three in-person Dementia Friends sessions working with Brent Council, with one further session to be delivered in June.

It has been a fast paced and exceptionally busy year for the Hubs Team project responding to the ever-changing landscape. After a difficult start to 2021 with lockdowns and worrying covid numbers, the covid restriction started to lift and the dementia community needed the support of the Hubs team more than ever. A review in the spring of 2021 ensured we increased the Advice Team by adding 2 part-time roles to ensure CAD reached more of the community with hands-on support.

The need for good quality Information, advice and guidance increased as statutory services re-opened. CAD-Brent staff established good links with the memory service in Brent where there was a backlog of patients. A referral pathway from the memory clinic to the Hubs Team was put in place to ensure continuation of support after diagnosis. The IAG officers saw patients referred by the clinical team; they were made aware of their rights at diagnosis stage and encouraged to access services in Brent, such as the Dementia Café network. The CAD-Brent team have established a further referral pathway from the memory service for people with memory concerns on their waiting list.

The Hubs team are now seen as a key player in dementia support in Brent with a programme of workshops for those receiving a diagnosis to ensure they understand the condition and the help available in the community. They will then be offered a programme of CST (cognitive stimulation therapy) which will end with a session at a local De-café – meaning clients are introduced to the concept of De-cafes, making that transition to community services easier. Their Dementia Friends workshops included 30 LFB staff at Wembley Fire Station and sessions at Brent Council and at community venues in Brent.

Working with Dementia Carers Count training provided to 35 dementia carers in a 7 week programme at the CAD-Brent Hub sites resulting in carers establishing a carer peer support network. They have continued to meet weekly, raising the profile of dementia carers in Brent.

Some De-cafes did not re-open after lockdown but CAD-Brent are supporting the opening of new community cafes following requests from clients; currently there are 12 including a new Gujarati speaking café, Ascension Church, St Johns Church and an Early Onset group for people living with early onset memory loss – who feel the current de-cafes do not meet their specific needs.

The Hubs Team encourage new cafes to open and supporting them to be a resilient and sustainable part of the De-Café network. The CAD-Brent Business Support Officer created a library of business documents to support them and raised funds and sponsorship for them.

The Peer support group discussed client's needs when using GP surgeries and theatres. Four users made site visits to review two GP surgeries and ten users made a site visit to the Troubadour theatre to review its facilities.

CAD-Brent community links have resulted in organising free workshops and activities such as 'Energy Efficiency' by The Green Doctor and interactive learning sessions with the Wallace Museum for the De-Cafes. These enrichment activities have been well received and further workshops are planned with the Fire Brigade, Police and St Johns Ambulance.

Recognising the importance of exercise provision for physical and mental health for clients and carers, Silver Jubilee Park and Ashford Place provide such exercise programmes to the De-cafes who currently do not have an exercise provision.

The successful dementia walking group is well established; CAD-Brent has organised several outings to museums, Kew gardens, theatre and music venues which are popular with the community; fund raising provides these opportunities.

CAD-Brent continues to work with statutory and voluntary partners to raise the profile of dementia in Brent and will continue to work towards Brent being a dementia friendly borough.

Accounts

The start of the Covid crisis in March 2020 coincided with the Dementia Hubs project launch so from the start the team had to be flexible in their approach to supporting the dementia community and adapt services to be in line with covid lockdown rules. Information Advice and Guidance (IAG) was provided remotely by phone initially, but later by a combination of digital means. The team used the time during the first lockdown to contact and support isolated vulnerable clients who had little or no family support and who were confused and anxious about the future. The first lockdown was particularly challenging as our clients found it difficult to organise practical support like food or medicine deliveries; our IAG Lead ensured these services were in place. Clients reported the comfort of hearing a friendly voice or see a familiar face.

The Hubs team also supported the network of established dementia cafés in Brent to interpret the complex covid guidance, providing regular updates and practical help when needed. The Development and Sustainability Lead worked with the café leads to apply for relevant funding that allowed them to adapt their services to digital and provide relevant equipment and support to their guests. This meant that the cafes could continue to keep connected during lockdown with those guests that may otherwise have felt isolated.

During the lift in the lockdown in the summer of 2020 a Brent-wide Dementia Picnic was organised to re-launch the in-person café services which provided a great opportunity for the dementia community to come together (for those comfortable to do so) after several months of isolation. Fundraising was undertaken to provide treats and activities for each participant. A Zoom picnic was provided for those who couldn't attend in person; this virtual picnic was a great success with some dementia care homes joining in the fun, with more than 120 people from the community taking part.

Further fundraising provided well-deserved treats during the year which were distributed to the community by the café leads, including a special festive gift and voucher in December and a lovely chocolate egg to coincide with Easter. Over 120 people from the dementia community received a gift on the doorstep. The feedback from the community about these small gifts was fantastic and the recipients felt it made a real difference to how they felt and their overall wellbeing. The team continued to work with professionals to ensure issues raised by our clients are at the heart of what we do.

CAD-Brent successfully met the standards required to achieve 'working to become dementia friendly' accreditation from the Alzheimer's Society in December 2020. We are committed to advancing our work to a point

where dementia is fully understood and respected across our borough, where people living with dementia feel that they are valued and listened to, where they are key contributors to the design and delivery of support services, and where the community works together and we have equal access to health and wellbeing opportunities. This is a just reward for the considerable work that people living with dementia, carers and other partners had been doing collectively, under the banner of CAD-Brent, since 2017 when the idea of a dementia friendly borough was first discussed.

CAD-Brent have agreed to provide regular updates on activities and actions via the online community dashboard, complete an annual self-assessment of progress towards meeting the [criteria](#), comply with the terms and conditions of use for the 'working to become dementia friendly' logo and comply with the Dementia Friendly Communities Code of Conduct. There are key targets to achieve by the end of 2021.

CAD-Brent will continue to work with and on behalf of the dementia community striving to make Brent a dementia friendly borough. Two key projects include:

Dementia Voices Project which works with people living with Dementia to ensure they are involved in decision making about services they use including co-producing material, working with GPs, the NHS clinical commissioning groups, the GLA or museums, theatres and Transport for London and other dementia charities in Brent, across London and UK wide. Dementia Voices Project works alongside the Dementia Peer Support Service in Brent, to help people living with dementia get the most out of their lives and working to make Brent a Dementia Friendly Borough. Dementia Voices Project is supported by Trust for London.

The Brent Dementia Peer Support Service, run by Ashford Place, supporting people living with dementia to support others living with the diagnosis. The service is suitable for people who can engage in a peer support role. The Dementia Peer Support Service is the result of feedback and consultation with Brent residents living with dementia and their carers. The service aims to help and provide appropriate support available in the community following a diagnosis of dementia

Dementia Voices and the Peer Support Service provide a number of services developed by, with and for, people living with dementia/memory loss and their carers including organised activities, visits and classes to improve personal independence, support to continue with hobbies and/or develop new ones with peers, support to help individuals reduce stress and understand complex feelings after their dementia diagnosis, one-to-one support between people with experience of living with or caring for someone with dementia/memory loss and access to independent information, advice and guidance as well as guided support to access services in Brent. <https://www.cad-brent.org.uk/cad-brent-our-services/>

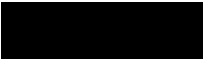
