Trustees Annual Report

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charitable company for the year to 28 February 2023.

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

The charity's purposes as set out in the objects contained in the company's memorandum of association are:-

- To relieve those in need by reason of financial hardship, in particular (but without limitation), any partner, former partner, employee or former employee of Francis Clark (or any associated company), or any spouse, brother, sister, stepbrother, stepsister, ancestor or descendant of such employee, or any other person who, in the opinion of the Trustee, is dependent upon such partner, former partner, employee or former employee.
- Such other general charitable purposes for the benefit of the general public as the Trustees in their absolute discretion think fit to support.

The charity's sponsor is Francis Clark LLP.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's objective, in planning its future activities and setting the grant making policy.

The charity furthers its charitable purposes for the public benefit through its grant making policy.

The trustees have liaised with the charity's sponsor and details of the charity's purpose and how the trustees may be contacted have been published on its staff intranet. In the period, a small number of applications for grants have been received and considered.

Achievements and Performance

During the year the charity made awards totalling £31,121 from unrestricted funds to ten individuals to relieve financial hardship. Awards of £30,000 were made from the restricted fund to assist Ukrainian families seeking refuge in the UK.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

The charity receives funding from its sponsor and does not solicit funding from other sources. During the year restricted grants, and associated Gift Aid, of £62,500 were receivable with the restriction that they should be applied to provide relief for people fleeing their homes in Ukraine as a result of the conflict and seeking refuge in the UK. Expenditure totalled £61,316 and included grants of £30,000 paid from restricted funds and £31,121 paid from brought forward unrestricted funds. This produced net income of £ 1,184. Total reserves at the year end amounted to £184,762 of which £32,500 was restricted. The trustees have decided the holding of significant reserves is unnecessary, as the trustees provide their time without charge and the level of administrative expenditure is minimal.

Structure Governance and Management

Governing Document

The charity is constituted as a private company limited by guarantee and its governing document is its memorandum and articles of association.

Trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law.

As at 28 February 2023, the trustees comprise former partners and staff of the sponsor (6), current members of staff of the sponsor (4). New trustees will be recruited and appointed by the existing trustees based on their suitability for carrying out the objectives of the charity and are likely to be selected from the groups refer to above.

Trustees Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and the net income or expenditure of the charitable company for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Small Company Charity Provisions

This report has been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) and in accordance with the special provisions for small companies under Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006.

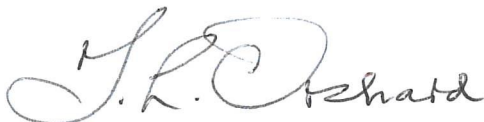

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Francis Clark Charitable Foundation meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

b) Income

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure includes irrecoverable VAT.

d) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are funds that can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Trustees. Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for a specific purpose.

2. Legal status of the charity

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. It is incorporated in England and Wales. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability of the members is limited to £10 each. Under the provisions of Section 60 of the Companies Act 2006, the company is entitled to omit the word "Limited" from its name.

3. Charitable Grants

During the year grants from unrestricted funds totalling £31,121 were paid to ten individuals to relieve financial hardship (2022: £14,004 were paid to 6 individuals) and a further £nil (2022: £250) was paid to a charity that assisted a member of staff. Awards of £30,000 (2022: nil) were made from the restricted fund to assist Ukrainian families seeking refuge in the UK.

4. Administration expenditure

Administration expenditure includes £175 (2022: £175) in respect of amounts payable for the independent examination.

5. Trustees remuneration

No trustees received remuneration or were reimbursed for expenses during the year (2022: £nil).

6. Control and Related Party Transactions

The charity is under the control of its Trustees.

During the period the charity received donations, including Gift Aid, of £62,500 (2022 - £62,500) from Francis Clark LLP, an organisation in which the majority of the trustees are either employees or former partners. There were no conditions attached to the donations.
