The Trustees of the Charity, who are also the company directors present their Annual Report and the financial statements of the Methodist Academies and Schools Trust for the year ended 31 August 2025. The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice ("Charities SORP") (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland; FRS 102) issued in October 2019.

#### **Reference and Administrative Details**

The names of the Trustees during the period and to the date of this report and other reference and administrative details are given on page 2.

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

The governing documents of the Charity are the memorandum and articles of association of the company. The Trustees of the Charity are the directors of the company.

#### **Method of Recruitment, Appointment, Election, Induction & Training of Trustees**

The Trustees are appointed by the Methodist Conference on the recommendation of the Methodist Council. The Articles of Association provide that the Trustees shall consist of the Chair and no more than 13 other Trustees. The Trustees are also the members.

Induction and training of Board members is the responsibility of the Chair, who inducts all new members, and provides information, updates and training as necessary.

To reflect the on going financial support from Southlands Methodist Trust Dr Christopher Stephens has been appointed to be Trustee of MAST representing this one organisation.

#### **Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit**

In the name of the Methodist Church, to oversee support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) ecumenical schools in providing the best all-round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

The Charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

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#### **Achievements and Performance**

The achievements and ongoing activities during the year include:

- MAST Trustees and Leadership Team have continued to form plans for the future with a reduced income and also campaign to secure the ongoing provision of high quality support and guidance for our schools.
- Continuing to provide a local system leadership model, Regional Leaders of Education (RLE), to ensure all Methodist/joint/ecumenical schools are supported with standards and ethos. The majority of our schools engaged and benefit from this support which contributes to embedding a sense of belonging as part of the wider Methodist family. RLEs have been instrumental in Identifying and responding to vulnerable schools, working individually or with groups of schools. All schools continue to be Good (J1) or better in SIAMS inspections.
- Delivering webinars and training to schools (including MIST), governors and chaplains linked to church school ethos and inspection, leadership, curriculum and wider topics.
  - 1) Leadership and governance termly briefings continue to keep leaders abreast of the national agenda in our schools.
  - 2) Series of sessions focussing on high quality worship and the leadership of RE.
  - 3) Continued focus on preparing our schools for their SIAMS inspection.
- The development of the weekly update on key information and actions required in schools has been welcomed by schools, enabling them to respond to national changes in a timely manner.
- Working with partners in the Church of England in planning and delivery of the Section 48 inspection framework, developing a shared safeguarding policy for inspectors to enhance safeguarding in our schools.
- Visiting schools to offer pastoral support and gain an understanding of their unique circumstances linked to their size, locality, and context.
- Taking a full and active part in the Methodist Schools Committee, supporting the delivery of the Transforming Lives strategy for the development of Methodist Education.
- Collaborating with other partners in the provision of high-quality education particularly, but not exclusively, the Methodist Independent Schools Trust and the University of Roehampton.
- Working with partners in the Church of England to develop new Articles of Association for Diocesan Trusts which includes schools with a joint Methodist and Church of England ethos to support the strong partnership working in the delivery of the joint church ethos of these schools.
- Contributing to chaplaincy development within the organisation and working to support the development of centralised educational chaplaincy support through the Centre for Chaplaincy in Education.
- Continue to build on opportunities between Methodist schools and the Methodist Church to develop understanding and commitment to education through the delivery of the Transforming Lives agenda.
- Working with the DfE to shape future policies and guidance for schools nationally.
- Ensuring the vast majority of our schools have a Methodist Governor to support the living out of our ethos.
- Represented Methodist education at Buckingham Palace Education Garden Party attended by the King and Queen.

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#### **Financial Review**

During the year the Trust had a deficit of £118,035 (2024: deficit £209,604). This is mainly due to reduction in grant income. The Charity finished the year with healthy reserves and continues to enjoy the pledged support of its funders for the forthcoming year.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The Charity generates a regular income by way of grants from; the Methodist Church and Southlands Methodist Trust, which is adequate to cover the projected expenditure. In addition, the Charity seeks to maintain adequate reserves to enable it to meet any unforeseen expenditure or to cover any short term drop in income. As at 31 August 2025, the free reserves were £350,506 (2024: £468,541) and restricted reserves were £nil (2024: £nil).

#### **Plans for Future Periods**

- To ensure future sustainability and flourishing of our Methodist schools through securing long-term funding and determining a structure for delivering statutory responsibilities.
- To ensure flourishing in our schools by continuing to provide high-quality support and guidance, underpinned by Methodist values and ethos, and resourced by high quality
- To increase presence within the national education system to ensure Methodist education is not marginalised.

#### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the Charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to ensure that necessary steps are taken to mitigate these risks. In particular, they meet regularly to review investment policy, to monitor cash flow and future commitments and to approve all expenditure.

#### **Statement as to the Disclosure of Information to the Independent Examiner**

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Trust will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Trust's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Trust and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Trust and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### **NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS**

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#### **1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

##### *Legal status*

The charity (a company limited by guarantee) is incorporated in England and Wales with its registered office address being, 66 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London WC2A 3LH.

The charity's objectives and aims are disclosed in the trustees' report on page 3.

##### *Basis of accounting*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

##### *Income*

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants and donations are treated as restricted funds if restrictions on their use are stipulated by the donor. All other types of income are accounted for on an accruals basis, being recognised as income when earned by the Charity.

##### *Expenditure*

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is allocated to the charity's principal activity where the costs can be identified as being directly related to that activity. All costs that cannot be identified as relating directly to the charity's principal activity are categorised as either support costs or governance costs.

##### *Fund accounting*

The general fund comprises the accumulated surpluses of unrestricted income over expenditure, which are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors.

### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### *Going concern*

The trustees have reviewed the financial forecasts for the Trust and have in particular considered its anticipated income and expenditure commitments for a period of twelve months from the date of approval of this trustees' annual report. The trustees believe that the Trust has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for at least the next twelve months and to meet all of its liabilities during that period as they fall due. For that reason, the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### *Taxation*

The Trust is a registered charitable company and as such its income and gains falling due under section 471 to 489 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 are exempt from corporate tax to the extent that they are applied to its charitable objectives.

#### *Financial instruments*

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

All financial instruments of the charity are basic and therefore measured at amortised cost.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice ("Charities SORP") (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland; FRS 102) issued in October 2019.

#### **Reference and Administrative Details**

The names of the Trustees during the period and to the date of this report and other reference and administrative details are given on page 2.

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

The governing documents of the Charity are the memorandum and articles of association of the company. The Trustees of the Charity are the directors of the company.

#### **Method of Recruitment, Appointment, Election, Induction & Training of Trustees**

The Trustees, who are the directors of the Company, are appointed by the Methodist Conference on the recommendation of the Methodist Council. The Articles of Association provide that the Trustees shall consist of the Chair and no more than 13 other Trustees. The Trustees are also the members.

Induction and training of Board members is the responsibility of the Chair, who inducts all new members, and provides information, updates and training as necessary.

To reflect the on going financial support from Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Dr Christopher Stephens and Mrs Anne Bolton have been appointed to be Trustees of MAST representing these two organisations.

#### **Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit**

In the name of the Methodist Church, to oversee support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) ecumenical schools in providing the best all-round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

The Charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The achievements and ongoing activities during the year include:

- MAST Trustees and Leadership Team have continued to form plans for the future with a reduced income and also campaign to secure the ongoing provision of MAST activities.
- Continuing to provide a local system leadership model, Regional Leaders of Education (RLE), to ensure all Methodist/joint/ecumenical schools are supported with standards and ethos. The majority of our schools engaged and benefit from this support which contributes to embedding a sense of belonging as part of the wider Methodist family. RLEs have been instrumental in Identifying and responding to vulnerable schools, working individually or with groups of schools. All schools continue to be Good or better in SIAMS inspections.
- Delivering webinars and training to schools (including MIST), governors and chaplains linked to church school ethos and inspection, leadership, curriculum and wider topics.
  - 1) Leadership and governance termly briefings continue to keep leaders abreast of the national agenda in our schools.
  - 2) Series of sessions focussing on high quality teaching in RE.
  - 3) Focus on preparing our schools for the implementation of the new SIAMS inspection framework in 2023.
- The development of the weekly update on key information and actions required in schools has been welcomed by schools enabling them to respond to national changes in a timely manner.
- Close partnership working with The Epworth Trust, our Methodist sister organisation working in the academies sector, enabling us to offer high-quality school improvement intervention to schools experiencing vulnerability.
- Development of Inspiring Lives Education Trust as the second national Methodist trust.
- Working with partners in the Church of England in planning and delivery of the Section 48 inspection framework through the national organisation of inspections. Supporting the development of the new SIAMs framework which will be implemented in September 2023.
- Visiting schools to offer pastoral support and gain an understanding of their unique circumstances linked to their size, locality, and context.
- Taking a full and active part in the Methodist Schools Committee, supporting the delivery of the Transforming Lives strategy for the development of Methodist Education.
- Collaborating with other partners in the provision of high-quality education particularly, but not exclusively, the Methodist Independent Schools Trust and the University of Roehampton.
- Working with partners in the Church of England to develop new Articles of Association for Diocesan Trusts which includes schools with a joint Methodist and Church of England ethos to support the strong partnership working in the delivery of the joint church ethos of these schools.
- Contributing to chaplaincy development within the organisation and working to support the development of centralised educational chaplaincy support through the Centre for Chaplaincy in Education.
- Taking a full and active part in the planning and delivery of the International Methodist Conference in April 2023, collaborating with partners in Methodist Independent Schools Trust, Epworth Education Trust and International Association of Methodist Schools, Colleges, and Universities (IAMSCU).
- Continue to build on opportunities between Methodist schools and the Methodist Church to develop understanding and commitment to education through the delivery of the Transforming Lives agenda.

#### **Financial Review**

During the year the Trust had a deficit of £209,604 (2023: deficit £96,831). This is mainly due to reduction in grant income. The Charity finished the year with healthy reserves and continues to enjoy the pledged support of its funders for the forthcoming year.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The Charity generates a regular income by way of grants from; the Methodist Church and Southlands Methodist Trust, which is adequate to cover the projected expenditure. In addition, the Charity seeks to maintain adequate reserves to enable it to meet any unforeseen expenditure or to cover any short term drop in income. As at 31 August 2024, the free reserves were £468,541 (2023: £678,145) and restricted reserves were £nil (2023: £nil).

#### **Plans for Future Periods**

- To ensure future sustainability and flourishing of our Methodist schools through securing long-term funding and determining a structure for delivering statutory responsibilities.
- Deliver the Department of Education approved plan by opening a second Methodist Trust (Inspiring Lives Education Trust) to ensure contestability within a national system for the academisation of all Methodist schools.
- To ensure flourishing in our schools by continuing to provide high-quality support and guidance, underpinned by Methodist values and ethos, and resourced by high quality
- To increase presence within the national education system to ensure Methodist education is not marginalised.

#### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the Charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to ensure that necessary steps are taken to mitigate these risks. In particular, they meet regularly to review investment policy, to monitor cash flow and future commitments and to approve all expenditure.

#### **Statement as to the Disclosure of Information to the Independent Examiner**


- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

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#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### *Legal status*

The charity (a company limited by guarantee) is incorporated in England and Wales with its registered office address being, 66 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London WC2A 3LH.

The charity's objectives and aims are disclosed in the trustees' report on page 3.

##### *Basis of accounting*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

##### *Income*

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants and donations are treated as restricted funds if restrictions on their use are stipulated by the donor. All other types of income are accounted for on an accruals basis, being recognised as income when earned by the Charity.

##### *Expenditure*

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is allocated to the charity's principal activity where the costs can be identified as being directly related to that activity. All costs that cannot be identified as relating directly to the charity's principal activity are categorised as either support costs or governance costs.

##### *Fund accounting*

The general fund comprises the accumulated surpluses of unrestricted income over expenditure, which are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors.

#### *Going concern*

The trustees have reviewed the financial forecasts for the Trust and have in particular considered its anticipated income and expenditure commitments for a period of twelve months from the date of approval of this trustees' annual report. The trustees believe that the Trust has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for at least the next twelve months and to meet all of its liabilities during that period as they fall due. For that reason, the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### *Taxation*

The Trust is a registered charitable company and as such its income and gains falling due under section 471 to 489 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 are exempt from corporate tax to the extent that they are applied to its charitable objectives.

#### *Financial instruments*

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

All financial instruments of the charity are basic and therefore measured at amortised cost.

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

The governing documents of the Charity are the memorandum and articles of association of the company. The Trustees of the Charity are the directors of the company.

#### **Method of Recruitment, Appointment, Election, Induction & Training of Trustees**

The Trustees, who are the directors of the Company, are appointed by the Methodist Conference on the recommendation of the Methodist Council. The Articles of Association provide that the Trustees shall consist of the Chair and no more than 13 other Trustees. The Trustees are also the members.

Induction and training of Board members is the responsibility of the Chair, who inducts all new members, and provides information, updates and training as necessary.

To reflect the on going financial support from Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Dr Christopher Stephens and Mrs Anne Bolton have been appointed to be Trustees of MAST representing these two organisations.

#### **Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit**

In the name of the Methodist Church, to oversee support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) ecumenical schools in providing the best all-round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

The Charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The achievements and ongoing activities during the year include:

-MAST Trustees and Leadership Team have continued to form plans for the future with a reduced income and also campaign to secure the ongoing provision of MAST activities.

-Continuing to provide a local system leadership model, Regional Leaders of Education (RLE), to ensure all Methodist/joint/ecumenical schools are supported with standards and ethos. The majority of our schools engaged and benefit from this support which contributes to embedding a sense of belonging as part of the wider Methodist family. RLEs have been instrumental in Identifying and responding to vulnerable schools, working individually or with groups of schools. All schools continue to be Good or better in SIAMS inspections.

-Delivering webinars and training to schools (including MIST), governors and chaplains linked to church school ethos and inspection, leadership, curriculum and wider topics.

1)Leadership and governance termly briefings continue to keep leaders abreast of the national agenda in our schools.

2)Series of sessions focussing on high quality teaching in RE.

3)Focus on preparing our schools for the implementation of the new SIAMS inspection framework in 2023.

- The development of the weekly update on key information and actions required in schools has been welcomed by schools enabling them to respond to national changes in a timely manner.

- Close partnership working with The Epworth Trust, our Methodist sister organisation working in the academies sector, enabling us to offer high-quality school improvement intervention to schools experiencing vulnerability.

- Development of Inspiring Lives Education Trust as the second national Methodist trust.

- Working with partners in the Church of England in planning and delivery of the Section 48 inspection framework through the national organisation of inspections. Supporting the development of the new SIAMS framework which will be implemented in September 2023.

- Visiting schools to offer pastoral support and gain an understanding of their unique circumstances linked to their size, locality, and context.

-Taking a full and active part in the Methodist Schools Committee, supporting the delivery of the Transforming Lives strategy for the development of Methodist Education.

- Collaborating with other partners in the provision of high-quality education particularly, but not exclusively, the Methodist Independent Schools Trust and the University of Roehampton.

-Working with partners in the Church of England to develop new Articles of Association for Diocesan Trusts which includes schools with a joint Methodist and Church of England ethos to support the strong partnership working in the delivery of the joint church ethos of these schools.

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- Contributing to chaplaincy development within the organisation and working to support the development of centralised educational chaplaincy support through the Centre for Chaplaincy in Education.

- Taking a full and active part in the planning and delivery of the International Methodist Conference in April 2023, collaborating with partners in Methodist Independent Schools Trust, Epworth Education Trust and International Association of Methodist Schools, Colleges, and Universities (IAMSCU).

-Continue to build on opportunities between Methodist schools and the Methodist Church to develop understanding and commitment to education through the delivery of the Transforming Lives agenda.

### **Financial Review**

During the year the Trust had a deficit of £96,831 (2022: surplus £492,971). This is mainly due to reduction in grant income. The Charity finished the year with healthy reserves and continues to enjoy the pledged support of its funders for the forthcoming year.

### **Reserves Policy**

The Charity generates a regular income by way of grants from; the Methodist Church, Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Ltd, which is adequate to cover the projected expenditure. In addition, the Charity seeks to maintain adequate reserves to enable it to meet any unforeseen expenditure or to cover any short term drop in income. As at 31 August 2023, the free reserves were £678,145 (2022: £774,976) and restricted reserves were £nil (2022: £nil).

### **Plans for Future Periods**

-To ensure future sustainability and flourishing of our Methodist schools through securing long-term funding and determining a structure for delivering statutory responsibilities.

-Deliver the Department of Education approved plan by opening a second Methodist Trust (Inspiring Lives Education Trust) to ensure contestability within a national system for the academisation of all Methodist schools.

-To ensure flourishing in our schools by continuing to provide high-quality support and guidance, underpinned by Methodist values and ethos, and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

-To increase presence within the national education system to ensure Methodist education is not marginalised.

### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the Charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to ensure that necessary steps are taken to mitigate these risks. In particular, they meet regularly to review investment policy, to monitor cash flow and future commitments and to approve all expenditure.




## **Independent examiner's statement**

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### *Legal status*

The charity (a company limited by guarantee) is incorporated in England and Wales with its registered office address being, 66 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London WC2A 3LH.

The charity's objectives and aims are disclosed in the trustees' report on page 3.

##### *Basis of accounting*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

##### *Income*

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants and donations are treated as restricted funds if restrictions on their use are stipulated by the donor. All other types of income are accounted for on an accruals basis, being recognised as income when earned by the Charity.

##### *Expenditure*

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is allocated to the charity's principal activity where the costs can be identified as being directly related to that activity. All costs that cannot be identified as relating directly to the charity's principal activity are categorised as either support costs or governance costs.

##### *Fund accounting*

The general fund comprises the accumulated surpluses of unrestricted income over expenditure, which are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors.

#### *Going concern*

The trustees have reviewed the financial forecasts for the Trust and have in particular considered its anticipated income and expenditure commitments for a period of twelve months from the date of approval of this trustees' annual report. The trustees believe that the Trust has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for at least the next twelve months and to meet all of its liabilities during that period as they fall due. For that reason, the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### *Taxation*

The Trust is a registered charitable company and as such its income and gains falling due under section 471 to 489 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 are exempt from corporate tax to the extent that they are applied to its charitable objectives.

#### *Financial instruments*

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

All financial instruments of the charity are basic and therefore measured at amortised cost.

The Trustees, who are the directors of the Company, are appointed by the Methodist Conference on the recommendation of the Methodist Council. The Articles of Association provide that the Trustees shall consist of the Chair and no more than 13 other Trustees. The Trustees are also the members.

Induction and training of Board members is the responsibility of the Chair, who inducts all new members, and provides information, updates and training as necessary.

To reflect the on going financial support from Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Dr Christopher Stephens and Mrs Anne Bolton have been appointed to be Trustees of MAST representing these two organisations.

#### **Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit**

In the name of the Methodist Church, to oversee support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) ecumenical schools in providing the best all-round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

The Charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The achievements and ongoing activities during the year include:

- Building stronger relationships with schools by continuing to strengthen the work of the Regional Leaders of Education (RLEs) through the appointment and training of locally based, highly skilled practitioners. Enabling schools to receive pastoral care and targeted support as requested or identified.
  
- Delivering webinars and training to schools, governors and chaplains on a range of pertinent topics linked to church school ethos, curriculum and wider issues. The development of the weekly update on key information and actions required in schools delivered alongside a termly briefing has been welcomed by schools and has provided Headteachers with the information in a timely manner. Webinars continue to be held on the MAST YouTube channel to allow them to be revisited.
  
- Close partnership working with The Epworth Trust, our Methodist sister organisation working in the academies sector, enabling us to offer high-quality school improvement intervention to schools experiencing particular vulnerability.
  
- Continued development of materials for the teaching of Religious Education with a particular focus on the distinctive ethos of Methodist schools.
  
- Mentoring and support for Headteachers in their first two years of Headship in a Methodist school, supporting their growing understanding of leading a church school. Including group training and 1:1 support.
  
- Working with partners in the Church of England in planning and delivery of the Section 48 inspection framework through the national organisation of inspections. Supporting the development of the new SIAMs framework which will be implemented in September 2023.
  
- Visiting schools to offer pastoral support and gain an understanding of their unique circumstances linked to their size, locality, and context.
  
- Taking a full and active part in the Methodist Schools Committee, supporting the delivery of the Transforming Live strategy for the development of Methodist Education.
  
- Collaborating with other partners in the provision of high-quality education particularly, but not exclusively, the Methodist Independent Schools Trust and the University of Roehampton.
  
- Responding to Government encouragement to strengthen the national academisation process by supporting Methodist schools looking to become academies and working closely with our Methodist Academy colleagues at The Epworth Trust in developing a strategy for a full Trust led sector. Including the plan to create a second Trust in the South of the country.

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- Working with partners in the Church of England to develop new Articles of Association for Diocesan Trusts which includes schools with a joint Methodist and Church of England ethos to support the strong partnership working in the delivery of the joint church ethos of these schools.

- Contributing to chaplaincy development within the organisation and working to support the development of centralised educational chaplaincy support through the Centre for Chaplaincy in Education.

- Taking a full and active part in the planning and delivery of the International Methodist Conference in April 2023, collaborating with partners in Methodist Independent Schools Trust, Epworth Education Trust and IAMSCU.

- Working with the Methodist Church to establish understanding and commitment to schools in a practical and purposeful way.

### **Financial Review**

During the year the Trust had net income of £492,971 (2021: net expenditure of £85,262). Westminster College Oxford Trust Ltd was able to bring forward grants it had originally earmarked for future years, and this accounted for the increase in income in the current year. The Charity finished the year with healthy reserves and continues to enjoy the pledged support of its funders for the forthcoming year.

### **Reserves Policy**

The Charity generates a regular income by way of grants from; the Methodist Church, Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Ltd, which is adequate to cover the projected expenditure. In addition, the Charity seeks to maintain adequate reserves to enable it to meet any unforeseen expenditure or to cover any short term drop in income. As at 31 August 2022, the free reserves were £774,976 (2021: £282,005) and restricted reserves were £nil (2021: £nil). The increase in free reserves was driven by the unexpected large grant from Westminster College Oxford Trust Ltd in this financial year, and this will be dispensed on MAST's operations in future years.

### **Plans for Future Periods**

- To continue to provide support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) for ecumenical schools in providing the best all round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

- To open a second Methodist Trust (Inspiring Lives Education Trust) in order to deliver the Department of Education approved plan from the Next Steps for Methodist Schools.

### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the Charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to ensure that necessary steps are taken to mitigate these risks. In particular, they meet regularly to review investment policy, to monitor cash flow and future commitments and to approve all expenditure.



#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### *Legal status*

The charity (a company limited by guarantee) is incorporated in England and Wales with its registered office address being, 66 Lincoln's Inn Fields, London WC2A 3LH.

The charity's objectives and aims are disclosed in the trustees' report on page 3.

##### *Basis of accounting*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

##### *Income*

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants and donations are treated as restricted funds if restrictions on their use are stipulated by the donor. All other types of income are accounted for on an accruals basis, being recognised as income when earned by the Charity.

##### *Expenditure*

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is allocated to the charity's principal activity where the costs can be identified as being directly related to that activity. All costs that cannot be identified as relating directly to the charity's principal activity are categorised as either support costs or governance costs.

##### *Fund accounting*

The general fund comprises the accumulated surpluses of unrestricted income over expenditure, which are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors.

#### *Going concern*

The trustees have reviewed the financial forecasts for the Trust and have in particular considered its anticipated income and expenditure commitments for a period of twelve months from the date of approval of this trustees' annual report. To reflect the on going financial support from Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Dr Christopher Stephens and Mrs Anne Bolton have been appointed to be trustees of MAST representing these two organisations.

### **Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit**

In the name of the Methodist Church, to oversee support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with the Church of England) ecumenical schools in providing the best all-round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

The charity trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The achievements and ongoing activities of the organisation were set in the context of the Covid pandemic and its uneven impacts on schooling at different times in the year and different parts of the country. Achievements and performance therefore include:

- Strong pastoral support for Methodist school leaders in response to the extra stress and strain of the role in covid times.
- Strong practical support so that our Headteachers and Governors could lead schools most effectively at different phases of the pandemic, applying national guidance to individual contexts.
- Developing an increasingly strong and popular series of webinars for schools and adding a YouTube channel to allow for 'watch again'. By the end of the year MAST had over 30 webinars in the online library for people in schools to watch at their convenience, or as a resource for school leaders to use in whole-staff/Governor training. The webinars cover a range of training needs: general curriculum provision; subject specific training (such as 'excellence in teaching numeracy' and 'liven up your literacy'); church school ethos, worship and religious education; Covid-specific support. Because of the online availability we have been able to share training extensively beyond the group with no additional effort, including internationally with worldwide Methodist partners.
- Embedding closer relationships with our schools begun in the previous year by the appointment of locally based Regional Leaders in Education and development of improved systems for information sharing. The restrictions of the pandemic impacted the further development of our support programme for early headship but the provision, though limited, was still welcomed.
- Close partnership working with The Epworth Trust, our Methodist sister organisation working in the academies sector, enabling us to offer high-quality school improvement intervention to schools experiencing particular vulnerability.
- Following the initiation of a suite of anti-racist RE resources in 2019/20 (developed for us by the National Association of Teachers of Religious Education – NATRE), MAST was part of the roll-out and promotion of the materials throughout the year. By the end of the academic year, they were being used in an estimated 1200 schools across the country.
- Working with partners in the Church of England to re-work the current Section 48 inspection framework ready for the recommencement of inspections in September 2021.
- Additionally, working with our Anglican partners to introduce a centralised system for SIAMS which will avoid some of the inconsistencies of the present system and enhance the quality of Section 48 inspections across the Church of England and Methodist schools sector.
- Welcoming the new Chair of MAST and plotting a course for an active organisation in uncertain times.
- Taking a full and active part in the Methodist Schools Committee, supporting the development of a strategy for education within the overall work of the Methodist Church, bringing this successfully to the Methodist Conference of 2021 and beginning the work of delivery.

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- Responding to Government encouragement to strengthen the national academisation process by supporting Methodist schools looking to become academies and working closely with our Methodist Academy colleagues at The Epworth Trust.
- Working with the Free Church Education Committee, especially in the provision of resources and contributing, with them, to teacher training in Religious Education.
- contributing to chaplaincy development within the organisation and working to support the development of centralised educational chaplaincy support through the Centre for Chaplaincy in Education.
- Working closely with other partners in the provision of high quality education particularly, but not exclusively, the Methodist Independent Schools Trust and the University of Roehampton.
- Working with the Methodist Church to establish understanding and commitment to schools in a practical and purposeful way despite an uncertain future.

### Financial Review

During the year the Trust had net expenditure of £85,262 (2020: net income of £105,852). The net expenditure outcome for the year was expected, and was the result of a 'grant holiday' taken by one of our main funders in light of the significant reserves built up in MAST, and a reduction in costs in 20/21 as a result of the pandemic. The charity finished the year with healthy reserves and continues to enjoy the pledged support of its funders for the forthcoming year.

### Reserves Policy

The charity generates a regular income by way of grants from; the Methodist Church, Southlands Methodist Trust and Westminster College Oxford Trust Ltd, which is adequate to cover the projected expenditure. In addition, the charity seeks to maintain adequate reserves to enable it to meet any unforeseen expenditure or to cover any short term drop in income. As at 31 August 2021, the free reserves were £282,005 (2020: £367,267) and restricted reserves were £nil (2020: £nil).

### Plans for Future Periods

During the forthcoming year the trustees will continue to provide support and guidance for Methodist schools in the state sector and (jointly with The Epworth Trust and the Church of England) for ecumenical schools in providing the best all round education for all their pupils, inspired by Methodist values and ethos and resourced by high quality professional expertise.

### Risk Management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the Charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to ensure that necessary steps are taken to mitigate these risks. In particular, they meet regularly to review investment policy, to monitor cash flow and future commitments and to approve all expenditure.

### Statement as to the Disclosure of Information to the Independent Examiner

The trustees at the date of approval of this trustees' annual report confirm that so far as each of them is aware, there is no relevant information of which the charity's independent examiner is unaware, and the trustees have taken all steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant information and to establish that the independent examiner is aware of that information.

Independent examiner, Nicholas Sladden of RSM UK Tax and Accounting Limited, has indicated his willingness to continue in office.

#### **Trustees' responsibilities in the preparation of financial statements**

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Trust will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Trust's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Trust and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Trust and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.


### **Independent examiner's statement**

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#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### *Legal status*

The charity (a company limited by guarantee) is incorporated in England and Wales with its registered office address being, 25 Marylebone Road, London NW1 5JR.

The charity's objectives and aims are disclosed in the trustees' report on page 3.

##### *Basis of accounting*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)) (issued in October 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

##### *Income*

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants and donations are treated as restricted funds if restrictions on their use are stipulated by the donor. All other types of income are accounted for on an accruals basis, being recognised as income when earned by the Charity.

##### *Expenditure*

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is allocated to the charity's principal activity where the costs can be identified as being directly related to that activity. All costs that cannot be identified as relating directly to the charity's principal activity are categorised as either support costs or governance costs.

##### *Fund accounting*

The general fund comprises the accumulated surpluses of unrestricted income over expenditure, which are available for use in furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific conditions imposed by donors.

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#### *Going concern*

The trustees have reviewed the financial forecasts for the Trust and have in particular considered its anticipated income and expenditure commitments for a period of twelve months from the date of approval of this trustees' annual report. The trustees believe that the Trust has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for at least the next twelve months and to meet all of its liabilities during that period as they fall due. For that reason, the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### *Taxation*

The Trust is a registered charitable company and as such its income and gains falling due under section 471 to 489 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 are exempt from corporate tax to the extent that they are applied to its charitable objectives.

#### *Financial instruments*

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

All financial instruments of the charity are basic and therefore measured at amortised cost.
