A.G.M. 8 March 2023

It's a much more pleasant task to report on the accounts for 2022 this year than it has been in the recent past. Although not a brilliantly sunny day nevertheless after a bit of early drizzle the crowds turned up in their thousands and it must have been close to record numbers by the end of the day. A few more days like this in the next few years would certainly not go amiss.

Turning to the accounts, the figure that really stands out is that for the gate. I could not believe it when I had done the final calculations and arrived at a figure of £39,911. To put this into context, the previous record was £25,194 back in 2014! The card machine at the main gate was definitely a great help and it was just a pity that the signal was not strong enough for their use at the other two gates. Our thanks must go to the Herdwick Sheepbreeders Association, in particular Roy Jenkinson, for providing the equipment for only small donation in return as well as all the gatekeepers who were kept going all day. Art & Craft and Trade Stands also held up well and the Blencathra Foxhounds had a very busy day with the Bar. Thanks must also go to Sal and her team for their great efforts in the industrial tent and also for running a very successful raffle. After a record surplus of £20,151 (deficit £1,580) our net assets at the end of the year stood at £54,786 as against £36,214 at the start.

Costs, of course, continue to increase and, in view of what has happened to the economy since last August, I would imagine that there will be a dramatic increase this year. So, despite the surplus, we must continue to spend money wisely. However, at least we now have a balance to absorb two consecutive bad years which is a great comfort.

Our accounts have once again been prepared by Lamont Pridmore and our thanks go to them. I don't know if you are aware but they do not charge for their services.

There is one person yet to mention and that is, of course, our long serving secretary although she keeps on telling me that 2022 was her last year! For so many years now Judith has been the face of Keswick Show and we could not have operated without her magnificent efforts and so ably backed up by Trevor. If 2022 was indeed her last year then we all owe Judith a deep debt

of gratitude and, if Fleur does indeed take the reins then she will have an expert in teaching her all the ins and outs involved.

1 General information

2 Statement of compliance

3 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Keswick Agricultural Society meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied in particular categories of income.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Current assets

Current assets are included within the financial statements at the lower of costs and net realisable value.
