- 4 May 2024 - Vivaldi Four Seasons and Faure Requiem - Romsey Abbey, Romsey
- 16/23 March 2024 - Faure Requiem and Stravinsky Symphony of Psalms - St Peter's Church, Stockbridge and Church of St Mary and St Nicholas, Wilton

We also took part in the Salisbury Festival of Choirs on 26<sup>th</sup> April which raised nearly £8,000 in aid of the Salisbury Hospice and St Thomas' Church Salisbury who hosted the festival.




statement


