Street Pastor patrols continue weekly and at various other special events with the normal aims. The provision of items to improve safety, health and the condition of the people the Street Pastors meet, including flip flops, bottles of water, foil space blankets, spikeys, handwarmers and lollypops.

They take time to listen to talk with people we meet whilst on patrol, including but not exclusively to those attending night clubs, door staff, shop and restaurant staff and rough sleepers.

Provision of practical advice, support, including prayer, when requested, enabling people to enjoy their time out and to get home safely.

Part of their aim is to be able to leave someone in a safer position than when they were first met and for them to be kept safe from sources of harm.

**Partner and Community Links**

Street Pastors enjoy very good links and work closely with partner organisations. These include the Northamptonshire Police, Northampton Town Centre Task Group, Pub Watch, Single homeless forum, the Guardians (Safer Nights Out Van) and venue security staff. Street Pastors are well regarded and appreciated by these partners and everyone who works within the Night Time Economy (NTE)

The Trustees have successfully trained and commissioned three new Street Pastors and one other and training started. Patrols continue regularly to patrol the streets of Northampton.

During this year Northampton Street Pastors celebrated 16 years of service to Northampton.

**Volunteers**

All patrols are carried out on a voluntary basis and each team has a senior Street Pastor. Northampton Street Pastors have 23 active volunteers. Collectively they patrolled on the streets particularly in the night time economy for 791 hours

## Section D

Current volunteers undertook Refresher training.

### Interventions

Street Pastors continue to have interventions with everyone in the night time economy in particular those who have been clubbing.

Street Pastors dealt with over 50 vulnerable females and 67 vulnerable males.

They removed 2201 glass bottles from the streets and swept up over 99 lots of glass. This protects the vulnerable on the street and helps prevent the bottles being used as a weapon.

They intervened in many cases of men stalking girls coming out of night clubs

### Recruitment

Three new Street Pastors were recruited, trained and are patrolling. One new Street Pastor is undergoing training. Recruitment is ongoing in Northampton to help maintain the level of volunteers working within Northampton Street Pastors.

### Staffing

Keith Holland-Delamere coordinated the initiative supported by Louis Wright as Administrator. They are both supported by Sarah Williams, one of the Trustees

### Students

Relations continue with the University of Northampton as the students venture into the town centre to experience the night time economy

### Interventions

Street Pastors continue to have interventions with everyone in the night time economy in particular those who have been clubbing.

Street Pastors dealt with over 130 vulnerable females and 60 vulnerable males.

They removed 18,069 glass bottles from the streets and swept up over 80 lots of glass. This protects the vulnerable on the street and helps prevent the bottles being used as a weapon.

They intervened in 2 cases with people wishing to commit suicide, preventing real tragedies.

### Recruitment

Two new Street Pastors were recruited, trained and commissioned. Recruiting continues around Northampton to help maintain the level of volunteers working within Northampton Street Pastors.

### Staffing

Teresa Brown stepped down after several years supporting Northampton Street Pastors. She was replaced by Keith Holland-Delamere as coordinator and Louis Wright as Administrator. They are both supported by Sarah Williams, one of the Trustees

### Students

Relations continue with the University of Northampton and as other years a team of Street Pastors was invited in December 2023 to patrol on a special Wednesday night student event. The appreciation for this was expressed by students and staff.



Street Pastors enjoy very good links and work closely with partner organisations - these include the Northamptonshire Police, Northampton Town Centre Task Group, Pub Watch, Single homelessness and the Guardians. Street Pastors are well regarded and very much appreciated by these partners and particularly in the NTE (Night Time Economy).

The trust has successfully completed the training of two new Street Pastor recruits and patrols continue to be fully operational.



We have recruited and trained three new Street Pastors. Funding has been secured and video commissioned to help promote the work of Street Pastors and to recruit others into this valuable work from local churches.

**Staffing**

#### **Street Pastors**

Patrols on Saturday and the last Friday night nearest to "pay-day" on the streets of Northampton town centre between the hours of approximately 22.30- 03.30. Additional evenings are arranged for specific events or "risk" nights by agreement with the management committee, police and local authority.

Provision of items to improve safety, health and the condition of the people the Street Pastors encounter, including flip-flops, bottles of water, space blankets and lollipops.

Taking time to listen to and talk with people we meet whilst on patrol, including but not limited to those attending night clubs, door staff, shop and restaurant staff and homeless people.

Provision of practical advice and support, including prayer, when requested, enabling people to enjoy their evening out and get home safely.

#### **School Pastors**

Patrols have operated, when possible due to Covid regulations, (ie schools have been open) in two secondary schools in Northampton. One on a Thursday and a second on Friday afternoons between the hours of 3.00- 5.00pm. At times patrols have been confined to the local Shopping Centre, when access to school sites has been restricted.

Patrols are in around the vicinity of the schools as well as the major routes used by students at the end of the day and a near by shopping centre where students gather.

School Pastors provide a "listening ear" as they engage with students and their presence contributes to providing a safer and more reassuring atmosphere.

#### **General**

The trustees have paid due regard to the guidance provided by the Charity Commission on public benefit in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

#### Results for 2020

##### Partner and Community Links

Street and School Pastors enjoy very good links and work closely with partner organisations - these include the Northamptonshire Police, Northampton Town Centre Task Group and the schools they are involved with. Street and School Pastors are well regarded and very much appreciated by these partners and particularly in the NTE (Night Time Economy).

##### Covid-19 pandemic

Due to the pandemic we suspended operations in March, Street Pastors restarted in August. A number of our volunteers needed to shield or had family who were vulnerable and were unable to volunteer. The Street Pastors coordinator liaised with the local authority and Pub watch. Trustee Sarah Williams worked on our Covid guidance and successfully organised the fielding of teams most weeks. We had flexible timings that supported the NTE during the more restricted opening hours laid down by the government. We ensured we complied with guidance changing our approach as appropriate to remain safe for all. Expressions of thanks and appreciation were received. The coordinators were furloughed at times during this year.

##### Our Volunteers

All patrols are carried out on a voluntary basis, there are 20 active Street Pastors and 12 active School Pastors. Street Pastors have collectively done 283 hours patrolling the streets (reduced due to Covid) and School Pastors 51 hours in the vicinity of the linked schools.

##### Interventions

Interventions continue between Street Pastors and clubbers along with anyone in the night time economy, also School Pastors and students, teachers and workers in the local vicinity. Street Pastors escorted over 16 people to taxis, so they got home safely, and calmed several situations that may have escalated into fights, contacted friends and family so individuals were passed into safe hands, and called paramedics on numerous occasions. School Pastors communicated with 126 people and intervened with 16 situations.

##### Trustees

A change of chairperson from Paul Worth to Adam Eakins in March 2020. Anne Davis stepped down from the Trustee Board in September of 2020. They worked within the Covid guidelines during the year.

##### Recruitment

The pandemic provided issues with recruitment. Plans were put into place to deliver an on-line recruitment early in 2021. The trustees continue to support the development of recruitment strategies.

##### Staffing

No appointments were made during 2020. The following staff remain in post. Keith Holland-Delamere as Street Pastor Coordinator, Tim Briggs as School Pastor Coordinator and Teresa Brown as Administrator.

##### Students

Relationships continue with the University. In January 2020 a team was fielded for a special Wednesday night student event, this was received well by university staff and students alike.

Expenditure also includes the payment of an additional 20 hours per month administrative support. The coordinators were furloughed for 4 months. There is a facility for people to donate via our web site which recovers Gift Aid for us.


