The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Objects and activities of the charity

The relief of sickness and the promotion of health, the prevention and relief of poverty.

The main activities undertaken in relation to those purposes during the period

Medical Relief international undertook numerous projects to further the objectives of the charity during the last year. In Jordan we continued to fund educational materials and food aid distribution. We also delivered monthly food packs for poor families and distributed several hundred powdered milk bags for children.

The main activities undertaken during the period to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit

TURKEY FOOD PROJECT – During the year 2024/25, Medical Relief International spent 95% of its funds on helping Syrian refugee families. Funds went to help and support disabled children, children who were terminally ill and their families with food, water and basic clothing needs.

Medical Relief International is registered with the Charity commission (Registration Number 1161299) and constituted by the deed of trust.





Trustees' Report for the year ended 31 March 2021

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Objects and activities of the charity

The relief of sickness and the promotion of health, the prevention and relief of poverty.

The main activities undertaken in relation to those purposes during the period

Medical Relief international undertook numerous projects to further the objectives of the charity during the last year. In Jordan we continued to fund educational materials and food aid distribution. We also delivered monthly food packs for poor families and distributed several hundred powdered milk bags for children.

The main activities undertaken during the period to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit

JORDON FOOD PROJECT - Food parcels were distributed to poor households which included staple dietary foods and rice, lentils and cooking oil. We also supported poor families throughout the year with monthly food packages and bread.

Structure, governance and management of the charity

Governing document

Medical Relief International is registered with the Charity commission (Registration Number 1161299) and constituted by the deed of trust.

Organisational Structure

The Charity trustees are responsible for the general control and management of the charity. The trustees give their time freely and receive no remuneration or other financial benefits. The trustees meet together as a body quarterly and are responsible for all decision taken in relating to running the organisation facilities and the activities provided by the charity.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities Act 2011 and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. Notwithstanding the explicit requirement in the extant statutory regulations, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008, to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the SORP 2005, in view of the fact that the SORP 2005 has been withdrawn, the Trustees determined to interpret this responsibility as requiring them to follow current best practice and prepare the accounts according to the FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), .

In particular, charity law requires the Trustees, if they prepare accounts on an accruals basis, to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the end of the financial year and of the surplus or deficit of the charity. In preparing those financial statements the Trustees are required to:-

- to prepare the accounts in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law).
- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;

The law requires that the trustees must not approve the accounts unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for the year.

The Trustees are also responsible for maintaining adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which are sufficient to show and explain the charity's transactions and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with regulations made under the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The Trustees are also responsible for the contents of the Trustees' report, and the statutory responsibility of the Independent Examiner in relation to the Trustees' report is limited to examining the report and ensuring that, on the face of the report, there are no material inconsistencies with the figures disclosed in the financial statements.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis under the following headings.

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets to their anticipated residual value over their estimated useful lives.
