Friends of Anfield's Chair's Report - April 2024 - 2025

We continue to consolidate 'Friends', establishing contacts and raising awareness of our aims and objectives.

a. New Trustee:

Our Trustees gave a warm welcome to Linda McDermott and unanimously appointed her as one of Friends of Anfield's Trustees. Linda is an English radio presenter and former broadcast journalist from Liverpool, best known for her Late Night Show on Liverpool Live Radio and previously BBC Radio Merseyside.

She has worked as a journalist and reporter for the Liverpool Echo. As a presenter, she has presented other shows such as Morning Merseyside for a number of years. Linda trained with the Army for one week, in which she was given the role of Major. She has interviewed the likes of Oprah Winfrey. In 2008, Linda broadcast live for three hours in storm force seas during the 50th Battle of the Atlantic commemorations and also hosted coverage of the Tall Ships parade in the same year. She has hosted shows on BBC Radio 5 Live and previously written and narrated documentaries for the National Geographic's Discovery Channel.

In 2017, Linda was awarded a Liverpool Citizen Of Honour for her work at BBC Radio Merseyside and elected only the second woman President in the 138-year history of the Liverpool Press Club.

b. Blitz War Memorial:

LCC have verbally given their support for the replacement of Anfield Cemetery's Liverpool Blitz Memorial: now 'beyond repair'.

c. Facebook:

We have over 1,000 Facebook followers now.

d. Find a Grave:

Our 'thank you' to Karan, who continues to respond to our 'Find a Grave' enquiries.

e. Information Boards:

One of our two 6' x 3' information boards, informing the public about our aim to build an International Heritage and Visitor Centre was damaged in sustained high winds and is now secure thanks to Terry.

f. National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) Application:

A new NLHF bid is being compiled. Discussions with Hope University, People First, St Francis de Sales, Positive Futures, Maricourt High School, St Vincent's School for the visually impaired, the Chinese Community and others are being pursued.

g. Possible New Patron:

Through the 'good offices' of Professor Brennan, Hope University are considering becoming one of our Patrons.

h. Pre Planning Advice:

We have Pre-Planning Advice about our Heritage Centre build and LCC have recently included Anfield Cemetery's South Chapel (the focus of our 'Centre' on their Asset Transfer list. We now need to raise £40k - £50k for a Planning Application. More information can be found on last year's Chair's Report. Letters requesting financial support have been sent to three of our Patrons: EFC, LFC and Steve Rotheram (Mayor of the Liverpool City Region.

After a meeting with Catherine McNeil, LCC offered to invite various LCC Departments to join a Working Party to forward Friends' Heritage Centre project. The intention is to discuss such things as Community Asset Transfer, strengthening Friends' management team, Planning Application, future funding and in-kind support from LCC. These help to address Kate Kendal's (National Lottery Heritage Fund area representative), 'What else, other than an Asset Transfer are LCC prepared to do?'

Anton of The Reader Group has agreed to consider a partnership with Friends for the catering side of our Heritage Centre.

i. Central Site for Friends' Essential Literature:

A 'Trustee access only' website for Friends' essential literature still needs attention.

j. Meeting Venues:

We now have a choice of the Crem Chapel and the Cabbage Hall Hotel in which to hold our meetings. Our 'Thank you' to Alan Sheldon and the Cabbage Hall for allowing us to do so.

k. Storage Container:

Alan is organising an on-site storage container for Friend's tools and equipment.

l. Dyno-rod Volunteers:

As part of their community volunteering scheme, a team from Dyno-rod spent a whole day applying wood preservative to our Heritage Boards, cleaning around the South Chapel and unblocking its drains. They purchased the materials and did a fantastic job.

m. Clock Tower

We still need funding to reinstate the a clock in the clock tower.

n. insurance:

We have insurance cover (APPROX £90 / YEAR) for tours but not for any physical work within the cemetery; this includes litter collections and gardening. Alan confirmed that LCC can not help. If / when we include the above in our activities our insurance cover will be in the region of £180.

o. Dog Fouling:

Alan agreed to see how the situation can be improved.

p.

The £30k plus Anfield Cemetery Conservation Management Plan produced by Purcell's (approx 2021) has not been passed by LCC.

q. Enhanced DBS:

If people wish to become an Anfield Cemetery Tour Guide they will need an EDDBS. It simply means visiting gov.uk and filling in the application form. It is free to volunteers.

Chair's Report March 2023 - March 2024

This has been more of a consolidating year for Friends. We have been establishing contacts and raising awareness of our aims and objectives.

a. New Trustee:

Our Trustees gave a warm welcome to David Prentice (EFC) and unanimously appointed him as one of Friends of Anfield's Trustees. David's experience includes: 36 years in Liverpool's media - Echo and Daily Post - progressing to Chief Sports Writer, then Sports Editor of the Liverpool Echo. David was offered a job he couldn't refuse: Communications Manager at Everton Football Club. David is a member of Everton Heritage Society and has written books about football and boxing. His knowledge, experience and advice will be invaluable.

b. Blitz War Memorial:

Liverpool's Blitz War Memorial is beyond repair. LCC has invited Friends to replace the existing with a new design. Graham and John are following this up and are to seek funding.

c. Facebook:

We have over 1,000 Facebook followers now.

d. Find a Grave:

Our 'thank you' to Karan and Steve, who continue to respond to our 'Find a Grave' enquiries.

e. Information Boards:

Our two 6' x 3' information boards, informing the public about our aim to build an International Heritage and Visitor Centre were erected in the cemetery grounds, with one (on the ex Church of England site) needing securing after sustained strong winds.

f. National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) Application:

Friends submitted an unsuccessful £250k National Lottery bid in November. It was strongly supported by Hope University, local schools, charities and Walter Fong, a representative of the Chinese Community. Moira and John of the Sound Agents were also present. All confirmed their support and sent letters of commitment. The bid contained 8 mini projects. A revised application is to be submitted later in 2024.

g. Pre Planning Advice:

Two pieces of advice were received in response to our Pre Planning Advice application - (i) employ a Planning Consultant and (ii) an Arboretum Impact Assessment (AIA) would need to be submitted with any Planning Application as there are some trees close to the proposed build. The removal of any trees would need a mitigation plan.

Bids for compiling and submitting a Planning Application with the necessary requirements for a Grade II* cemetery were sort. Friends will need to raise approx £50k. It includes the services of Mark Kitts (ex LCC Director of Development) with whom we've established an excellent relationship over the years. Mark has also offered to be part of our Team when we submit our Lottery Stages One and Two bids. The former is for pre-build work and the latter is for the build. Alan Smith, LCC's Heritage Lead, also offered to join our Team. As part of a Stage One bid, we will need LCC to provide a letter of support for the Asset Transfer of the South Chapel from LCC to Friends, if Lottery funding was secured.

h. Central Site for Friends' Essential Literature:

A 'Trustee access only' website for Friends' essential literature still needs attention.

i. Growing up in Anfield Cemetery:

Karan, Cathie and Tom met Arthur, Joy and Arthur's sister. Karan gave a brilliant account of Arthur's memories having put them in writing for our archives. Arthur lived on site with his parents during his youth.

j. Rededication: EFC Heritage Society (via Jamie) arranged a rededication ceremony for Thomas Keates (1850 - 1928). Thomas was an EFC Director and Everton's first official historian. After the rededication, Friends representatives attended a gathering with EFC's Heritage Society members in the Isla Gladstone.

k. St Vincent's School for the visually impaired and other issues were given a cemetery tour. They produced booklets with large fonts and in braille, presenting them to Friends. They resisted the War Memorial where they laid photos and flowers of two children buried there. Relatives of the children also attended. The booklets were circulated at our meeting.

l. The Cabbage Hall Hotel:

The Cabbage Hall Hotels' willingness to open their doors at 10:00 on Saturday mornings to allow us to hold our meetings to take place should not go without a 'Thank you' and it would be fitting if our Secretary write to The Cabbage Hall to thank them on our behalf.

Chair's Report March 2022 - March 2023

Pleasingly, Friends have made good progress this year.

a. Everton FC has become one of our Patrons, alongside Liverpool FC.

b. LCC's Lead on Heritage and LCC's Cems and Crems Manager are helping to drive our projects along.

c. Replacement Clock Tower Mechanism:

Terry is seeking a quote, to fit a replacement clock mechanism in the iconic clock tower, after LCC produced a positive tower safety structural report.

d. Blitz War Memorial:

Liverpool's Blitz War Memorial is beyond repair. LCC has invited Friends to replace the existing with a new design. Graham and John are following this up and are to seek funding.

e. Facebook:

Paul Senar is a joint admin for a separate Facebook page using our name. LCC is monitoring the activity. Meanwhile, our Facebook members are approaching 1,000, thanks to Karan and Terry.

f. Find a Grave:

Our 'thank you' to Karan and Steve, who continue to respond to our 'Find a Grave' enquiries. Perhaps the most significant 'Find a Grave' this year was that of William Powell, who served in the Federal army during the American Civil War, where he became one of only thirteen African American surgeons. Gina Williams (enquirer) intends to approach Washington

DC with the intention of getting some recognition for him - all subject to LCC approval, of course.

g. Information Boards:

Our two 6' x 3' information boards, informing the public about our aim to build an International Heritage and Visitor Centre were passed by Planning and installed by Crosby Memorials. Very encouraging comments have been received so far.

h. National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) Application:

With the aid of Alan Smith (LCC's Heritage Lead) Friends intend to submit a National Lottery Expression of Interest (up to £250k) to engage 'a wider range of people' with the history of Liverpool and heritage of the cemetery. To engage people properly, we need an onsite presence. After Planning advised that an application for a cabin (sited near the chapel) was unlikely to get consent, Alan (Cems and Crems) suggested that if it were possible, Friends could use part of the South elevation of the chapel. Power, water, drainage, asbestos and structural issues are to be checked.

i. Pre Planning Advice:

Two pieces of advice were received in response to our Pre Planning Advice application - (i) employ a Planning Consultant and (ii) an Arboretum Impact Assessment (AIA) would need to be submitted with any Planning Application as there are some trees close to the proposed build. The removal of any trees would need a mitigation plan.

j. Funding for a Full Planning Application:

It's worth remembering that when we employed a professional fund raiser during our £50,300 Resilient Heritage grant, it became clear that large funding packages would not be forthcoming unless we had Planning Permission. A meeting with Steve Rotheram confirmed that to be the case.

To continue, we need:

- i. full Planning Permission (approx £7k)
- ii. to clarify who should apply for Planning Permission, Friends or LCC as owners of the property and land
- iii. a Planning Consultant (cost being sort)
- iv. an Arboretum Impact Assessment (approx £7k)
- v. a Mitigation Plan (cost being sort)
- vi. seek a Partnership Agreement with LCC and a 'Parent Company Guarantor' element, due to Friends' lack of equity.

k. Central Site for Friends' Essential Literature:

A 'Trustee access only' site has been set up on the web to store Friends' essential literature and needs to be developed.

l. Bank Statement:

Treasurer provided copies of the current accounts. The accounts can be signed off when the final Bank Statement covering up to the 31st March arrives.

m. Voting / confirming Trustees as per Constitution:

Our Constitution requires that 1/3 of our Trustees stand for re-election every year after three years of our formation. — — — This year it's: Cathie, Bill and Terry

CHAIR'S REPORT - NOVEMBER 2022

Further details of the items below can be viewed in the appropriate Minutes.

- i. Friends have made good progress since our last AGM (27th June 2021), with the help of LCC's Cems and Crems Department and other LCC officials, the National Lottery Fund and Liverpool City Region officials**
- ii. Contacts have also been made with Edge Hill University (Andrea Edge Hill Uni) and St Vincent's School (Connor) for the visually impaired, with the possibility of future collaboration and Everton FC are considering becoming one of our Patrons (Jamie EFC)**
- iii. Our website Find a Grave facility continues to provide funding to cover our insurance, website and events etc thanks to the work of James and Steve**
- iv. St Francis de Sales won our inaugural School Photo Competition organised by Christine of LFC, who also generously provided the prizes for First, Second and Third, saving Friends £100 (originally first prize). The children's work is to be kept by Friends for possible future displays**
- v. A replacement Clock Tower clock mechanism is in the offing but we are still waiting for LCC's Structural Engineer to report the condition of the tower (Terry and Brendan LCC)**
- vi. LCC Cems and Crems have invited Friends to partner them to redesign / replace the Blitz War Memorial (Graham, - John who initiated this - and Alan LCC)**
- vii. LCC has offered access to their (to be completed) on line Grave Location System, which accurately identifies the location of a grave using interactive mapping (Alan LCC)**

viii. Our pleasing wild-flower planting project display, following the 'lost' pathways designed by Kemp has been appreciated by Friends and visitors alike and will be on display in the coming years (Jane and Brendan LCC)

ix. Tidy Up / Litter Picking dates are to be determined and hot water urns have been purchased to provide drinks to volunteers (Terry and Karan)

x. Two 6ft x 3ft information boards, informing visitors of our intention to build an International Heritage and Visitor Centre (the Centre), have been passed by LCC Planning and installed in the cemetery grounds (Brendan LCC and Crosby Memorials)

xi. LCC's Pre Planning Advice about the Centre has been given and will inform any future Planning Application (Friends)

xii. LCC Comms can help with an on-line public consultation about our proposed Centre (Alan LCC and Friends)

xiii. LCC have encouraged Friends to submit an application for the Asset Transfer of the South Chapel and its curtilage from LCC to Friends, using LCC's new Asset Transfer policy. The new policy has been passed by Council and is about to be published (Alan LCC and Friends)

NOTE - An Asset Transfer commitment is vital for applications to the NLHF and the Levelling Up Fund - and Planning Permission is vital for attracting a wider range of funding streams as we discovered in our previously NLHF funded Resilient Heritage project

xiv. After meeting with Roy Gladden (Lord Mayor of Liverpool) and Alan Smith (LCC's Heritage Lead) last year, Alan hosted a meeting in Liverpool's St George's Hall on Wednesday 2nd November 2022. The meeting was initiated by NLHF's Kate Kendall (ex Historic England and now with the NLHF) and Louise Sutherland (NLHF) to discuss Friends' EOI in a £220k Development Stage application. If successful, it will prepare Friends for a £5m Delivery Stage application. Each application needs to satisfy NLHF's requirements and there are no guarantees.

Kate and Louise are long-term supporters of our aim and responding to their advice is crucial.

xv. After a meeting with Daniel Bimpson, Steve Rotheram's representative at LCRCA, Daniel emailed Erica Rushton of Kindred LCR - stating -

'... on behalf of Friends of Anfield Cemetery Trust, regarding the Trust's exciting plans around a heritage/visitor attraction and funeral service enterprise within the grounds.

'The Trust have previously been successful in raising substantial funds for development of the project to-date and are in discussions with Liverpool City Council regarding the potential transfer of assets. The Trust has approached LCRCA as potential match funders against a National Lottery Heritage Fund submission, which we can consider more fully in due course, although I have noted the significant over-programming of SIF funds of which you are aware.

'Tom has shared extensive information with us, including a business plan, which indicates a commercial model generating an operating surplus. In light of this, in addition to the social ethos of the Trust and the dimension around land transfer, I thought the Trust could stand to benefit immensely from support and advice via Kindred ...'

xvi. Cemetery Section Markers will be re-fitted when LCC funding allows (Martin LCC)

xvii. Our Friends of Anfield Cemetery Facebook continues to grow with 963 members thanks to admins: Karan, Jane, Terry and Ray

xviii. LCC Comms are to follow-up on the more recent Friends of Anfield Cemetery Facebook set up by a previous Trustee, with a view of shutting it down (Alan LCC)

xix. Friends' 'Famous Name Book' has been started and contributions are welcome (Karan)

xx. Black History stories provide links with the BME groups. One of our Find a Grave enquirers is approaching

Washington DC with a view to have a headstone on the grave of one of the very few black surgeons who served on the Union side during the American Civil War and is buried in Anfield Cemetery. His family had links with the Underground Railway, an organisation helping black slaves to escape from Confederate states (Bill)

d. Father Daniel has had to offer his resignation to Friends due to the extra church commitments he has been asked to take on and the good news that he and his wife are expecting their first baby in March.

Chair's Report March 2020 - March 2021

As Terry pointed out, we are now able to meet and build on our previous successes. This has been a landmark year for several reasons.

- i. We welcome Father Daniel and Mr Stephen Done to our Trustees. Father is the vicar of St Columba's Church (and possibly others) and Stephen is the Senior Specialist Museum Curator of the LFC Museum. We hope they too will enjoy working with us, to give Anfield a better future.
- ii. Largely due to Stephen's and Christine Mounsey's (Senior Coordinator, CorpSocial Responsibility) efforts, it's pleasing to announce that LFC is now one of our Patrons.
- iii. Our National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) £50,300 grant was completed within budget, has been submitted and (hopefully) it will be signed off soon. The details of the work done are summarised in the end of grant Project Plan. If the completed grant is signed off, we will begin a NLHF (Stage One) Development application. If successful, we'll then apply for Stage Two funding to build the Heritage Centre.
- iv. Our Find a Grave service, supported by Ray, Karan and Steve, continues to help people from all over the world. The time and effort devoted to each search, the detail given, how it's presented, are really appreciated by the families requesting the information.
- v. Three new projects are underway.

Firstly, Terry is pursuing a replacement clock for the clock-tower. The original clock was taken away decades ago. LCC and Historic England have agreed to the replacement as long as there's no obvious external changes.

Secondly, Graham has volunteered to explore the possibility of tree planting on the South side of the cemetery, to reflect Kemp's original layout to the North, East and West.

Thirdly, Jane is looking into the possibility of introducing wildflowers to the cemetery grounds to encourage wildlife, its ecology and its appearance.

vi. Planning Permission for the installation of two information boards has been applied for. If granted, the boards will inform visitors of our aim to build an International Heritage and Visitor Centre at the South Chapel. In particular, they will be seeking the opinions of grave owners within 100 yards of the build (a legal necessity) and those of visitors.

vii. A request for 'Pre Planning Application' advice about the Heritage Centre is being sorted. This will help prepare the way for the actual Planning Application when a variety of organisations will need to be consulted.

viii. Interested Parties' meetings with LCC and Historic England have been put on hold due to C19. However, it is hoped they will begin again some time after 21st June. These meetings discuss the progress of our Heritage Centre and Friends' activities.

ix. LCC have provided £12,000 of temporary internal structural support for the South Chapel. This is a real indication of LCC's continued support for Friends' ambitions and will strengthen our future funding applications.

x. Our Facebook membership has increased to **xxxxx and** thanks to the vigilance of our Admins, **Karan, Jane, Ray and Terry**, we've kept our membership informed and avoided controversies.

xi. An Expression of Interest for the Asset Transfer of the South Chapel will be discussed, now that we have a 5 Year Business and Cash Flow Plan from our Chartered Accountants. Note, we are not pursuing an actual Asset Transfer at this time. That will take place when we are in a position to do so.

xii. Hard copies of the plans for the Ground Floor of the chapel and the extension, comprising of a Ground Floor and First Floor are to be made available during this meeting.

There is also a 3D 'fly-past and fly-through' video available which can be sent to anyone who wishes to see it.

Once COVID 19 restrictions are lifted we hope to attract new members / participants. Suggestions include: photography, Art, litter picking, cleaning, gardening, nature watch, Find a Grave, historical research, organising tours or events and generally supporting our aim to establish an International Heritage and Visitor Centre.
