Trustees Annual report

Introduction and aims

"The Staffordshire Moorlands Methodist Circuit is committed to constantly seeking opportunities to transform people's lives through an active and living faith in Jesus Christ".

The work of our circuit is to prayerfully discern the very particular ways and partnerships through which these aims might be most fruitful in transforming lives and communities.

Our circuit profile rejoices in one Ecumenical Partnership between the Methodist Church and the United Reformed Church, self-governing Methodist Churches and class fellowships. In community life together in market towns, rural villages and semi-urban settings we seek to live out our faith, supporting and encouraging each other in outreach, mission and evangelism.

The latter part of the past year has been like no other and has made demands upon the imagination and creativity of the Methodist people in thinking through and praying about 'different' ways of worshipping and serving. Much of our worship has been online, our buildings open only for essential community provision, and our people encouraged to find new ways of being in fellowship with one another. We have suffered loss, but we have learned too – and we carry all this with us into the future.

Brief financial review of the year

The financial offering of individual churches to our Circuit budget is supplemented in our commitment to investing in people by a regular and planned withdrawal from what have been significant reserves. We are pleased to have a team of staff whose gifts are many and varied and we are thankful for the ministry of those who work with us as part of a 'District Team' alongside ordained staff. At the end of this year that team comprises 3 children and family's workers (2 full time equivalent posts), 1 pastoral visitor, 1 administrator, 3 ordained Ministers. This continues to be a significant investment, but the Circuit remains committed to this level of church and community engagement which is even more challenging given that we have many churches scattered over a wide area.

Income and expenditure were broadly in line with our mission statement and policy, our working deficit to be withdrawn from reserves of £88,089 for investment in staffing. This, combined with sale proceeds of a manse sold of £255,747 and a negative revaluation on the remaining 4 manses leaves the resulting surplus of £54,383 for the year.

The level of reserves is under constant review by the Circuit Treasurer and Leadership Team.

The work of ministry in the circuit is a partnership between lay and ordained, paid and volunteer workers, and we offer our grateful thanks to each one. During the year to August 2020, we remember and give thanks for the ministry of Debbie Beville, Circuit Administrator whose work supported ministry in so many and varied ways, and Don Haslam who served the circuit faithfully as volunteer Lay Worker over many years.

Income trends

Circuit income is primarily drawn from the assessment paid by the circuit churches. This has seen a slight decrease over the year because of reduced numbers in many of the churches, and the challenge of keeping individual properties in good order and compliant with Methodist Standing Orders. In addition, the closure of many buildings in the latter part of the year had an impact upon giving, but we are grateful to the many people who felt able to carry on supporting the work in local churches.

Expenditure trends

Stipend expenditure has increased each financial year in line with the Methodist Conference approved increases.

15.2% of expenditure is the Circuit contribution to the District and Connexion, of which a significant part is used to fund the work of the wider Methodist Church.

The Circuit currently has one manse sale pending.

The balance on Circuit Model Trust Fund balance amounted to £76,993 which was held on deposit with the Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes.

The circuit recruited as part of our ministry team a Lay Mission Enabler part way through the year.

Plans for 2020/21

Circuit financial plans for the coming year have been prepared on the basis that there remain 3 full time ordained staff with anticipated cost of living stipend increases combined with the assessment paid to the district.

We are in the process of transferring the staff we have had sharing with us as District Team into Circuit employment, recognising their significant contribution to the overall ministry of the circuit.

The basis for fulfilling these commitments remains a pledge system for individual churches. This system will be reviewed if it continues to fall short of the budget required, in the longer term.

We continue to review our calling in the light of the restrictions faced by society at large, the age profile of our congregations and likely resources going forward. We will be aiming to work more closely together as local congregations over the coming years.

Aims and organisation

Charity objective is to act as a Resource provider within the area around Leek and Cheadle, Staffordshire for the Methodist Church:

"The purposes of the Methodist Church are and shall be deemed to have been since the Date of Union the advancement of:

- a) The Christian faith in accordance with the doctrinal standards and discipline of The Methodist Church;
- b) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any Connexional, District, Circuit. local or other organisation of The Methodist Church;
- c) Any charitable purpose for the time being of any society or institution subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church;
- d) Any purpose for the time being of any charity being a charity subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church

The organisation and resourcing of regular public acts of worship open to members of the church and non members alike.

The teaching of Christianity through sermons, courses and small groups.

The resourcing of pastoral work including visiting the sick and bereaved.

Taking religious assemblies in local schools.

Promotion of Christianity through the staging of events and services.

Provision of chaplaincy services to the local university and other institutions

Public Benefit

We confirm the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Structure, Governance and Management

The governing document for the circuit is the Deed of Union (1932) and Methodist Church Act (1976)

Detailed governance arrangements are outlined within the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church by order of the annual conference (CPD).

Day to day management of the circuit is undertaken by the Circuit Leadership team along with the Local Preachers meeting, the Circuit Finance and Property Committee and the Circuit Policy Committee.

Trustee Training

A range of guidance produced by Methodist Connexion to support the effective running of the circuit, specifically the leaflet 'The Role of a Trustee in The Methodist Church' is given to all new Circuit meeting members as induction to their role as trustees.

Related Parties

The Circuit is part of the Chester and Stoke on Trent District and is also accountable to the Methodist Conference.

The following Methodist Churches are linked to the circuit: Blakeley Lane, Boundary, Cheadle with Alton & Whiston, Dilhorne, Endon, Ipstones, Onecote, Rudyard, Rushton, St Andrews Cheddleton, Tean with Leigh, Thorncliffe, Waterhouses and Wetley Rocks.

Trinity Church in Leek, which is a Methodist & URC Local Ecumenical Partnership, is also part of this circuit.

Risk Management

The major risks have been identified and recorded by the Circuit Finance and Property Committee with professional advice taken as required.

There is a regular annual review process undertaken and recorded.

Income and Expenditure is being monitored in total and is compared with the approved annual budget on a half yearly basis to detect trends as part of the risk management process to avoid unforeseen calls on reserves.

Safeguarding

Every person has a value and dignity which comes directly from the creation of male and female in God's own image and likeness. Christians see this potential as fulfilled by God's re-creation of us in Christ. Among other things this implies a duty to value all people as bearing the image of God and therefore to protect them from harm.

Methodist Connexional practice outlines commitment to the following principles:

- the care and nurture of, and respectful pastoral ministry with, all children, young people and adults
- the safeguarding and protection of all children, young people and adults when they are vulnerable
- the establishing of safe, caring communities which provide a loving environment where there is informed vigilance as to the dangers of abuse.
- We will carefully select and train all those with any responsibility within the Church, in line with Safer Recruitment principles, including the use of criminal records disclosures and registration with the relevant vetting and barring schemes.
- We will respond without delay to every complaint made which suggests that an adult, child or young person may have been harmed, cooperating with the police and local authority in any investigation.
- We will seek to work with anyone who has suffered abuse, developing with them an appropriate ministry of informed pastoral care.
- We will seek to challenge any abuse of power, especially by anyone in a position of trust.
- We will seek to offer pastoral care and support, including supervision and referral to the proper authorities, to any member of our church community known to have offended against a child, young person or vulnerable adult.
- In all these principles we will follow legislation, guidance and recognised good practice

The Staffordshire Moorlands Circuit commits itself to ensuring the implementation of Connexional Safeguarding Policy; government legislation, guidance and safe practice in the circuit and in the churches.

The Staffordshire Circuit commits itself to the provision of support, advice and training for lay and ordained people that will ensure people are clear and confident about their roles and responsibilities in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults who may be vulnerable.

Reserves Policy

The Reserves Policy for the Circuit is to hold a minimum sum equivalent to 12 months' average expenditure. This should be sufficient to meet any unforeseen item of major expenditure on manses and / or to be able to continue, in the short term, funding planned activities in the event of any inability to raise the full Circuit Assessment from churches.

Notes to the Accounts

1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the 2014 version of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with FRS102 – the Charities SORP (FRS102) and taking note of the Update Bulletin 1 issued in 2016.

2 Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the Circuit which are Unrestricted. The Circuit Model Trust Fund has wide purposes defined in Standing Orders and is categorised as unrestricted. The Endowment funds held at the start of the year have been released during the year to the General Fund. Details of each material fund are disclosed in the final note to these accounts. Any funds may be represented by more than just cash.

3 Accounting policies

Basis

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

Incoming Resources

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources, and the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Resources Expended

This is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment being unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely than not under the legal or constructive obligation committing the Circuit to pay out resources.

Grants

Grants made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the time of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment.

VAT

Since the Circuit is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the Circuit

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £500.

The freehold property is shown in the accounts at the insurance value. No depreciation is provided on the buildings because the trustees consider the current residual fair value of the manse buildings (on the assumption that they had reached the end of its useful economic life by the year-end) to be not less than its current value. Any depreciation would not be material. The property has been reviewed for impairment.

Investment Properties

Investment properties - no property is currently deemed to not be held for the long term purposes of the charity.

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Debtors and Prepayments

The prepayment included in the accounts is in respect of assessments received in early September in respect of the year and the deposit held in respect of the letting of the Ipstones manse by the letting agents.

Creditors

Creditors relate to the Independent Examination fees the deposit in respect of the Ipstones manse and sundry expenses.
