<p>The objectives of the charity are to enhance the development and education of all the children in the Nursery setting by organising fundraising activities and obtaining grants, to provide equipment and facilities to build a stimulating environment, where children can use all their senses.</p>
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Due to covid restrictions we were unable to hold the annual meeting and provide our regular fundraising activities such as quiz nights and summer and Christmas fairs.

We were, however, awarded a grant from Severn Trent Water to build a sensory garden for the children of the setting to be able to learn about growing vegetables, composting and the insects that the wild flowers attracted.

This was a project to share with other members of our local community, namely The local Dementia society and we look forward to welcoming them soon when restrictions allow.
