At the beginning of 2024, we were very pleased to be able to make a grant to The Aegean Sea Sanctuary. The funds will be going towards the Crane that will be used to lift the cetacean slings. Orca Rescues Foundation had also contributed funds towards the slings in previous years.

The Aegean Marine Life Sanctuary is a pioneering initiative which is expected to serve multiple important functions on the eastern Aegean island of Leipsoi. From treatment for sick and injured sea creatures to advanced scientific and environmental research.

The Marine Sanctuary has a 2 mile long bay and is 20 metres deep, a far cry from the tiny captive facilities many Whales and Dolphins find themselves in. We all look forward to the day that Captive facilities are no longer. Figures from Marine Parks are diminishing rapidly as more and more people are not purchasing tickets, a slogan that has been widely used by many Anti Captivity groups. “ #Don't Buy a Ticket “ Some facilities may even close within the next 12 months.

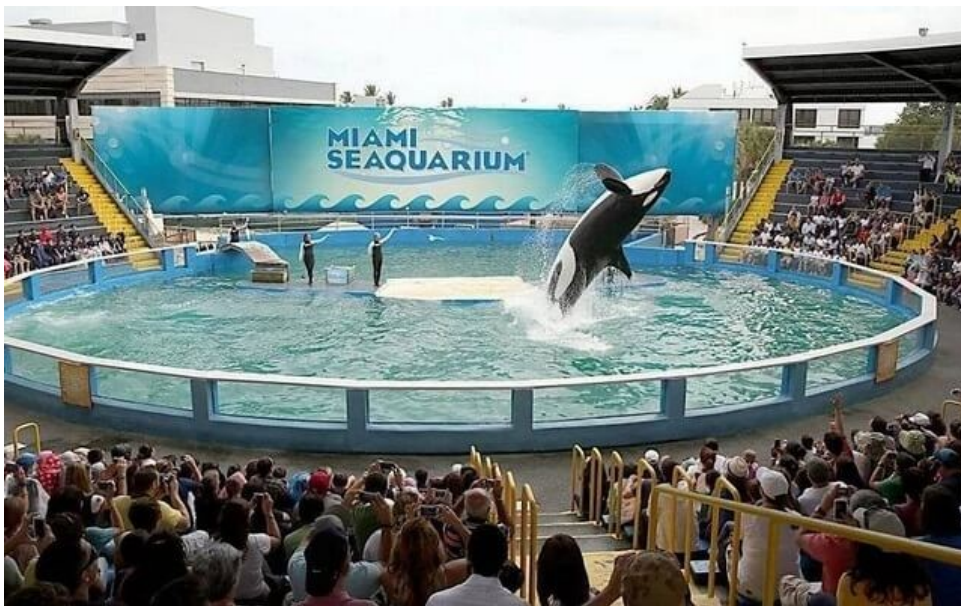
Trustee Report

Orca Rescues is specifically affiliated with The Aegean Sea Sanctuary in Lipsi in Greece. Clive visited the Sanctuary and a memorial will be made there in his memory.

The Sanctuary still needs so many items which we hope to be able to fund.

Our Facebook page run by Brittney Hernandez continues to raise and maintain awareness of Captivity and thankfully we have been able to report many changes over the year with laws changing in relation to breeding in captivity and the potential Retirement of Lolita into a Sea Sanctuary. It is alleged by many scientists that this virus emanated from the abuse of animals in a 'wet market' in Wuhan, China. Animals kept in shockingly unhygienic conditions and in close proximity is simply unacceptable, but will the world and countries that abuse animals learn ?

With the above in mind ORF joined Animals for Asia (AfA) who carry out great work to ensure animal welfare in Asia is documented and hopefully improved. As a supporting organisation within AfA we put our voice to many concerns regarding animal cruelty including those inflicted on cetaceans.

On a more positive note and with the help of our supporters we were able to fund the manufacture of specialised dolphin transport stretchers for the Aegean Marine Life Sanctuary (AMLS).



During the Greek lockdown due to Covid 19 the team on the Island of Lipsi remained on site and soldiered on with the work that is needed to put the final

touches to completing this fantastic sanctuary. On behalf of everyone ORF has fully supported this project and will continue to do so as funding permits.
