The objects of the CIO are to advance education for the public benefit in Polish language, culture, tradition and heritage in particular within the Polish Community in Amersham and the surrounding areas.

The main service provided by our organisation is Polish Saturday School. Classes take place on Saturdays between the hours of 9.30 and 13.00. These classes are held during term time in classrooms rented from Amersham School. The classes are open to children of our members.

The organisation also organises or co-organises local events with the local Polish church, the Polish scouts and/or Polish ex-combatants to celebrate Polish cultural dates of importance. Examples include Harvest Festival, Independence Day, Christmas, 3rd may Celebration day but also include more general events such as trips to the theatre, museums and gatherings of other Polish schools. These events are open to everyone.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The number of the children attending classes increased, parents are recommending our school to others.

School attendance is being monitored regularly and is good. The attendance during special celebrations events/ assemblies is good.

This year we could provide our classes face-to-face. Some community celebrations were held.

This year one student completed AQA GCSE course in Polish as modern foreign language and presented himself for the exam. We were able to open an A-level class for four students and one student took A-level exam. Those students were entered as examination candidates through our host school - the Amersham School.

No teacher vacancies issues this year. Teachers confirmed their willingness to continue teaching next year. The teachers are enthusiastic and happily take part in training sessions and workshops.

The co-operation with the local host school continues to be beneficial for both parties although the rent has been on the increase over the past few years – this is an area of concern.

The school budgets appropriately. The amount fundraised by parents increased this year. Parents were more engaged in the school life.




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
