Trustees' report for the year ended 31 May 2025

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the The Sir Roger Manwood Trust CIO for the year ended 31 May 2025. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2019).

The Trustees have considered the Charity Commissioners guidance of Public Benefit in preparation of these accounts.

Objectives and activities

a. Objectives

The objects of the Charitable Incorporated Organisation registered with the Charity Commission on 10th June 2015 are the provision of almshouse accommodation or financial support for those in need or suffering hardship within the area administered by Canterbury City Council and the Town Council of Sandwich.

The Almshouses and the other freehold property (Ye Olde Beverlie, St Stephen's, Canterbury) was devolved to the Charity by the Will of Sir Roger Manwood many hundreds of years ago. The title was vested in the Official Trustee for Charity Lands by an Order of the Charity Commissioners of 27 March 1866.

The terms of the Charity were widened by the Charity Commissioners on 5 June 1997 to enable the Trustees to grant funds on a "Relief in Need" basis to the residents of the parish of St Dunstan's and Westgate, St Stephens, Canterbury and the Borough of Sandwich. The present constitution dated 23rd December 2014 identified the catchment area to those living within the administrative area of Canterbury City Council and the Town of Sandwich.

From 1 October 2010 all residents are liable to pay weekly maintenance contributions in line with the scheme introduced by the Trustees on 1 October 2005.

b. Activities for achieving objectives

The main objective of the Charity is met by the provision of almshouse accommodation in 12 almshouses at St Stephen's, Canterbury. The charity also operates a "Relief in Need" fund.

c. Public Benefit

The Trust continues to provide for those in need in the district of Canterbury and the Town of Sandwich and a number of payments were made during the year. Residential vacancies, when they occur, are advertised locally under the same terms.

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

The Trustees have achieved their major financial objectives for the year in clearing all loans some 2.5% years ahead of schedule and continuing the full refurbishment programme of the historic Tudor almshouses.

Two new residents moved into renovated units at the start of the financial year and a further unit was fully renovated and occupied by a new resident. Five old units have now been renovated leaving one old unit when the opportunity arises. Work has been completed on dealing with damp penetration on two other units. Total repair and maintenance amounts to £50,189 for the year met entirely out of the Trust annual income. The Trustees have for several years followed a policy of using available income to cover the cost of refurbishing five Tudor units and other updating costs rather than by selling and diminishing the Extraordinary Repair Fund investments leaving the investments to grow over a period. This has resulted to careful cash flow management and growth in value of the ERF holding from £34,388 in 2014 to the current figure of £121,437. Projected cash flow commits additions to the Extraordinary Repair Fund investments during the coming year and following years. All twelve almshouse units are occupied with WMC in line with that set by the Valuation Office Agency.

Achievements and performance (continued)

During the year the Trust completed the early repayment of all loans totalling £365k taken out in 2015/2016 towards the cost of the 4 new almshouse bungalows totalling £1,065k. The saving on annual cash-flow on full repayment amounts to £40k. Loans were originally programmed to be cleared by October 2027.

The Charity continues to provide grants through local agencies in support of those in need in our community. Some 28 grants were provided during the year at a total cost of £6,168.

The Trustees were asked by their tenants of Ye Olde Beverlie Inne, Shepherd Neame Limited for their approval for the appointment of sub tenants until September 2037. The property was originally built by the charity benefactor in 1570 as a part of the almshouse complex for the Prior to the hospital but has been an historic pub for several centuries. Legal advice given by the Trust Solicitors Furley Page was that Shepherd Neame would continue to be liable under all of the terms of the head lease and Trustee approval was given.

Financial review

a. Annual performance

The Charity owns Ye Olde Beverlie Public House and rents to Shepherd Neame Limited, rents are included within investment income. The most recent rent review was undertaken by Sidney Phillips, Chartered Surveyors with an agreed £44,500 (2024: £44,500), agreed to commence from 1 October 2022.

An opinion by Sidney Phillips, Chartered Surveyors on the market value of the Charity's freehold interest in Ye Olde Beverlie dated 9 August 2022 subject to current lease to Shepherd Neame Limited was stated to be £700,000.

The Trustees have been able to negotiate an advanced ten-year extension to the lease of Ye Olde Beverlie Inne with the tenant Shepherd Neame Limited following the expiry of the current lease of the property on 30 September 2027.

A recent reinstatement cost assessment of all almshouse buildings, external areas and Ye Olde Beverlie Inne has been undertaken by Nigel Curtis MRICS of Godden Allen Lawn and the insurance brokers have been instructed to put in place the increased cover.

Regular loan repayments have been increased to allow for upward base rate movements.

The charity shows a £17,460 surplus of net income for the year (before investment gains and revaluations) compared to £1,582 for 2024.

Although no additions have been made to the Extraordinary Repairs Fund during the year, the Trustees consider that there are sufficient reserves available to cover any emergency repairs as they arise.

b. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

c. Reserves policy

At the 1 November 2022 meeting the Trustees approved a reserves policy at a minimum figure of £150,000 in invested funds to cover the cost of any possible and future refurbishments and repairs to the properties owned by the charity where costs could not otherwise be covered from available sources or annual income. The Trustees have reviewed this policy and consider it to still be appropriate as they develop their plans for future use of funds.

d. Investments policy

At the meeting on 1 November 2022 the Trustees approved a review of the present investment arrangements that the charity has with CCLA and approved an investment objective that the Trust is to invest funds that are not needed by the Trustees in the short term in suitable investments that are diversified and yield the best financial return within the level of risk considered to be acceptable by the Trustees. The Trustees consider this policy to still be appropriate.

e. Policies

Trustees have approved that the Trust's Accountants now deal with the Making Tax Digital (HMRC VAT requirements).

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

The Trust is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and was registered at the Charity Commission on 10th June 2015, numbered 1162107.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the constitution of the Trust. New Trustees are elected by a resolution of existing Trustees.

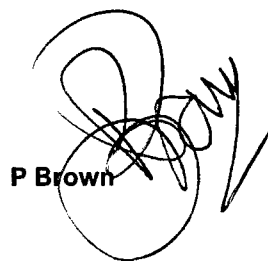
- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

Independent examiner's report for the year ended 31 May 2025

Independent examiner's report to the Trustees of The Sir Roger Manwood Trust CIO ('the Charity')

I report to the charity Trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 May 2025.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the Trustees of the Charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act').

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 May 2025

1. General information

The Sir Roger Manwood Trust CIO is registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation in England and Wales with the charity registration number 1162107. The principal office is St. Stephens Church Hall, Hales Drive, Canterbury, Kent, CT2 7AB. The principal objectives of the Charity are as set out in the Trustees' Report on page 2.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The Sir Roger Manwood Trust CIO meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

2.2 Going Concern

The Trustees have considered the charity's level of reserves and future incoming resources and concluded that these are sufficient to enable the charity to continue its operations for the foreseeable future. Therefore the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the Charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

2.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £500 are capitalised. Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

In previous years, no depreciation has been provided in respect of the charity's freehold properties which comprise the almshouses. This is still the case for the old almshouses, as in the opinion of the Trustees the residual value of those properties is such that any charge for depreciation would not be material. The Trustees will review these properties on an annual basis in order to ensure that no provision for impairment is required.

In respect of the new almshouses which were completed in 2016, depreciation has been charged on the different significant elements of the build costs depending on their individual useful lives of 10 - 100 years, on a straight line basis.

Grants received towards the cost of improving the properties are deducted from cost.

A review for impairment of a fixed asset is carried out if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value of any fixed asset may not be recoverable. Shortfalls between the carrying value of fixed assets and their recoverable amounts are recognised as impairments. Impairment losses are recognised in the Statement of financial activities.

2.6 Investments

Fixed asset investments are a form of financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction cost and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance sheet date, unless the value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment. Investment gains and losses, whether realised or unrealised, are combined and presented as 'Gains/(Losses) on investments' in the Statement of financial activities.

2.7 Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

2.8 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

2.9 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

2.10 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the Charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

2.11 Financial instruments

The Charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.12 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Charity for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund.

Capital funds where there is no power to convert the capital into income. Generally, these funds to be held indefinitely. Income derived from these funds is restricted.

Designated Funds

The Extraordinary Repairs Fund has been in existence for many years and has been designated for its specific purpose by the Trustees.

The Trustees have designated £5,000 towards a cyclical maintenance fund.

The Manwood Lodge Fund represents the money spent on renovating Manwood Lodge.
