Introduction

“It’s always sunny in Wrexham,” as the Declan Swans so memorably sang – a line that has become part of our city’s character. Over the past year, that sunshine has not only been in the skies but also in the spirit of our community. The infectious positivity brought by Wrexham AFC’s Hollywood owners, Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney, coupled with the club’s promotion to the EFL Championship – the second tier of English football – has given our city a renewed sense of pride and purpose. The ripple effects are clear: tourists now arrive in greater numbers, camera phones in hand, seeking the sights, sounds, and stories of our streets. The atmosphere in the city centre has an unmistakable buzz, although the presence of empty shopfronts is still a reminder that there is work to be done to create a fuller, richer high street experience.

The night-time economy has shown modest improvement, though it continues to face challenges. The closure of the main nightclub and the ongoing pressures of the cost of living mean that the once-regular queues for late-night venues are now mostly seen at month’s end. Nevertheless, Saturday evenings remain relatively calm, with limited reports of antisocial behaviour. The partnership between the Police, the Night Safe door staff, the council’s contracted medical team, and ourselves – the Wrexham Street Pastors – remains strong and effective. Working side by side, we have been able to respond swiftly to incidents, offer practical help, and provide a reassuring presence for residents and visitors alike.

Trustee Meetings and Social Events

Over the course of the year, three Board of Trustees meetings were held, chaired as always by Gareth Jones – one of our founder members from 2006 – whose steady leadership and encouragement continue to guide our work. We began the year with a social gathering that brought together trustees, prayer partners, and street pastors. This was an opportunity not only to express our heartfelt thanks for everyone’s continued commitment but also to look ahead with hope that we might welcome new volunteers into our ranks. In the final quarter, our annual social barbecue proved a popular event, drawing friends and supporters together in fellowship. We closed the year with a simple yet uplifting gathering at Hope Street Church – the very place from which we set out each Saturday evening – a fitting way to end the year on a positive and prayerful note. Throughout the year, a weekly Street Pastor

and Prayer Partner update, along with the rota, ensured that our team stayed informed, connected, and ready for service.

On behalf of the Trustees and the Steering Group, we wish to express our sincere gratitude to each and every Wrexham Street Pastor volunteer for the dedication and support you have shown throughout the year. Your willingness to serve – often in challenging conditions – is deeply valued. We also extend heartfelt thanks to our Prayer Partners, whose steadfast intercession for the Street Pastors and related initiatives underpins everything we do. While our team currently operates with reduced numbers – 18 active Street Pastors – we have still been able to send out patrols on most Saturday evenings. This consistent presence is a testament to the commitment of our volunteers, some of whom travel from Denbigh, Mold, and Weston Rhyn to serve. Each is an active member of their own church community, and together they embody the unity of different congregations working side by side to serve and care for the people of Wrexham.

As the Wrexham Street Pastor Coordinator, I would like to add my own heartfelt thanks to all our Street Pastors, Prayer Partners, and everyone who plays a part in supporting our work. Your dedication, encouragement, and partnership make it possible for us to be a consistent presence in Wrexham's city centre on Saturday nights. We are especially grateful for the support of our valued partners – the Ascension Trust, Wrexham County Borough Council, North Wales Police, organisations within the night-time economy, and those who have provided financial support over the years. Each of these partnerships is vital, ensuring that we have the resources, training, and collaborative relationships needed to serve effectively.

Operational Feedback – Wrexham Street Patrols Initiative (January 2024 – December 2024)

Over the past year, Wrexham Street Pastors carried out 37 patrols – three fewer than the previous year – supported by 16 active volunteers who took to the streets on Saturday evenings. In total, approximately 525 volunteer hours were given in service to our community, a remarkable demonstration of the team's dedication. The data gathered from each patrol continues to affirm the positive role we play within Wrexham's night-time economy. Across the year, we removed 465 glass bottles and 592 cans from the streets, handed out one space blanket, and provided 121 pairs of flip flops to grateful members of the public. In addition, we recorded 428 meaningful interactions or positive encounters – moments where we were able to offer practical help, listening ears, or simply a reassuring presence. Each of these actions, large and small, has contributed to making Wrexham a safer, calmer, and more welcoming place, while making a tangible difference in the lives of those we met.

Wrexham Street Pastors have continued to work closely and positively with our night-time economy partners, all of whom share the goal of making Wrexham's evenings safer. The Welfare Centre at Hafan-Y-Dref, staffed on Saturday evenings by a private medical company appointed by the City Council, has been an invaluable resource. During the year, our patrol teams responded to five requests for assistance from the medical staff at the centre, whose professionalism and dedication have been outstanding. Since the appointment of the private medical company, we have noted a substantial reduction in the number of medically related incidents requiring our direct attention – a change that has allowed us to focus more on providing pastoral care and practical support in other areas.

General Community Support

Beyond their Saturday night duties, many of our Street Pastor volunteers have also served the wider Wrexham community through various other initiatives, demonstrating their deep commitment to making a positive difference in the city throughout the week.

As Coordinator, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude for the support, commitment, and encouragement shown throughout the year. It has been a privilege to serve alongside such a dedicated and compassionate team. We also take this moment to say farewell to those who have chosen to retire from active service; we thank them for their invaluable contributions over the years and wish them every blessing for the future. To each and every one of you – whether you serve on the streets, pray faithfully from home, support us through partnership, or contribute in other ways – please accept my sincere thanks. Your ongoing encouragement and dedication are, as always, deeply appreciated. Many blessings.

WREXHAM STREET PASTORS 2023 ANNUAL REPORT



This annual report covers the period from January 2023 until December 2023. It would be fair to say that the Wrexham nighttime economy has not bounced back to what it used to be before the Covid pandemic. Many of the pubs have either closed or the management has changed. There are also many vacant shops within the city centre that impacts negatively on the city itself. The one big positive ray of hope for the city has been the excellent results that the Wrexham Football Club have experienced since the takeover by Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney in November 2020. The promotion of the Club over the last two years has drawn worldwide attention. This has translated into an increase in foreign tourism not only to the city but to North Wales as well. Wrexham Street Pastors has continued to build on the upward momentum of 2022 where we were able to be out patrols on most Saturdays throughout the year. We are again grateful for a year in which we saw our Street Pastor volunteers respond to the calling of working together with the Wrexham City Council and the Police to make the Wrexham nighttime economy safer for everyone.

Three Trustee and Steering Group meetings and one general meeting were held during the year. There were no changes to the Board of Trustees during 2023. We wish however to pay our respects to our previous chairperson – Art Ellinson - who has passed away. At the start of 2023 we had 20 active Street Pastors and efforts were ongoing to try and recruit more Street Pastors.

A Social gathering was also held at the end of January 2023 at the Hope Street Church. The purpose of this gathering was to assess how the Street Pastors and Prayer Partners felt about the coming year and ask them to please try and assist in the recruiting of new Street Pastors. The Annual Barbeque get together was held in October 2023 and was well attended. It was decided that the annual year end function that is normally held in December would be moved to January 2024. Weekly Wrexham Street Pastor updates were sent to all the Trustees, Steering Group Members, Street Pastors, Prayer Partners.

On behalf of the Trustees and the Steering Group we wish to express our sincere gratitude to each and every Wrexham Street Pastor volunteer for the continued commitment and support this dedicated team has provided. We also want to express our real appreciation for the Prayer Partners who continually intercede in prayer for the Street Pastors and other Street Pastor initiatives. A number of Street Pastors

faced some difficult challenging health choices during the year which led to them either retiring as Street Pastors or curtailing their involvement. Several of the team went above and beyond their call as volunteers to ensure that we were able to continue serving the community, not only as Street Pastors, but also doing other support work through their local churches. The Wrexham Street Pastor volunteers are drawn from at least 11 different churches and 2 Christian organisations.

As the Wrexham Street Pastor Coordinator, I would also like to express my sincere appreciation to all the Wrexham Street Pastors, Prayer Partners as well as everyone else who is involved supporting Wrexham Street Pastors. This includes our valued partners namely Ascension Trust, Wrexham City County Borough Council, North Wales Police, together with other organisations within the nighttime economy as well as those who have provided funding to support the Wrexham Street Pastors in the past.

Street Patrols January 2023 until December 2023. .

Wrexham Street Pastors conducted 40 patrols during the year. Six less than the previous year. We had 17 active Street Pastors who went out on patrol. Collectively a total of approximately 592 volunteer hours were undertaken during the course of the year. This truly reflects the dedication of the team. The information that is recorded monthly from the patrols that took place continued to confirm the positive role that Wrexham Street Pastors fulfils within the nighttime economy. During these patrols 480 bottles and 605 cans were removed from the streets. 2 space blankets were given out, and 90 pairs of flip flops were donated to grateful members of the public. During these patrols a total of 446 meaningful interactions or positive encounters with members of the public took place. All of these interactions and actions contributed towards helping make Wrexham a safer and more peaceful place as well as providing the added benefit of making a positive difference in many people's lives.

Wrexham Street Pastors regularly interact positively with the nighttime economy partners who participate in making the Wrexham nighttime economy safer. The Welfare Centre at Hafan-Y-Dref has been staffed on Saturday evenings by a private medical company appointed by the City Council. Wrexham Street Pastors have passed on 3 referrals during patrols to the medical team at the centre who have done outstanding work. It should be mentioned that since the appointment of the private medical company Wrexham Street Pastors have had a substantial reduction in the number of medically related cases that needed attending to solely by us.

General Community Support

Many of the volunteers who are part of the Wrexham Street Pastor initiative also served the Wrexham community through other channels during this year under review.

As the Coordinator I would like to express my grateful appreciation for all the support, commitment and encouragement that was expressed during the year. We also sadly say goodbye to those who have chosen to retire and we wish them everything of the best in the years ahead. Thank you once again, one and all, for your continued support and encouragement which is, as always, greatly appreciated.

WREXHAM STREET PASTORS **2022 ANNUAL REPORT**



This annual report covers the period from January 2022 until December 2022. Last year was a difficult year as we recovered from the Covid pandemic. We continued to build on the slow momentum that was created in the second half of 2021. Each year, we as Wrexham Street Pastors, expect to continue where we left off from the previous year doing what we have done since the inception of this charity. As we reflect on 2022 we are grateful for a year in which we again saw our Street Pastor volunteers respond to the calling of working together with the Wrexham City Council and the Police to make the Wrexham night time economy safer for everyone.

Three Trustee and Steering Group meetings and one general meeting was held during the year. The Chairman announced his retirement at the meeting in February 2022. Gareth Jones who was one of the founder members of Wrexham Street Pastors was duly elected as the new Chairperson. Brynmor Williams accepted the nomination of Secretary. Mary Arton and Sandra Owen were nominated to serve on the Board of Trustees. Both accepted their nominations and started serving as Trustees from the 22nd of September 2022. Sue Vening, the administrator relocated to Panama. However she continues to provide assistance where possible. Two new Trustees were appointed. Sadly, two of our Street Pastors passed away during the course of 2022. Our heartfelt condolences, as well as our sincere appreciation for their selfless support was expressed to the next of kin.

A Social gathering was also held in February 2022 at Hope Street Church. The purpose of this gathering was to assess how the Street Pastors and Prayer Partners felt about the coming year and ask them to please try and assist in the recruiting of new street pastors. The annual year end function was also held in December 2022. It was well attended by both Street Pastors and Prayer Partners. Weekly Wrexham Street Pastor updates were sent to all the Trustees, Steering Group Members, Street Pastors and Prayer Partners.

On behalf of the Trustees and the Steering Group we wish to express our sincere gratitude to each and every Wrexham Street and School Pastor volunteer for the tremendous, continued commitment and support this dedicated team of 22 people has provided. Street Patrols January 2022 until December 2022. .

Wrexham Street Pastors conducted 45 patrols during the year. We had 22 active Street Pastors who went out on patrol 162 times during the course of the year. This truly reflects the dedication of the team. The information that is recorded monthly from the patrols that took place continued to confirm the positive role that Wrexham Street Pastors fulfils within the night-time economy. During this period approximately 648 volunteer hours were recorded. During these patrols 518 bottles and 548 cans were removed from the streets. 3 space blankets was given out, and 125 pairs of flip flops were donated to grateful members of the public. During these patrols a total of 462 meaningful interactions or positive encounters with members of the public took place. All of these interactions and actions contributed towards helping make Wrexham a safer and more peaceful place as well as providing the added benefit of making a positive difference in many people's lives.

Wrexham Street Pastors have on occasion interacted positively with the night time economy partners who participate in making the Wrexham night-time economy safer. The Welfare Centre at Hafan-Y-Dref has been staffed on Saturday evenings by a private medical company appointed by the City Council. Wrexham Street Pastors have passed on 5 referrals during patrols to the Medical team at the centre who have done outstanding work.

Sadly the School Pastors service to the school did not re-commence again during 2022 because of the restrictions that were being adhered to.

General Community Support



WREXHAM STREET PASTORS **2021 ANNUAL REPORT**



This annual report covers the period from January 2021 until December 2021. Each year we, as Wrexham Street Pastors, expect to continue where we left off from the previous year doing what we have done since the inception of this charity. However 2020 was an exceptional year because of the lockdown that was announced in March 2020 and only partially lifted in June 2021 when it was again possible for patrols to be resumed.

Eight Trustee and Steering Group meetings and one general meeting in March 2021 were held during the year. The primary focus of the majority of the meetings was to develop a risk assessment plan for Covid to ensure the safety of our Street Pastors when they went back out on patrol. Life for Wrexham Street Pastors however did not continue as normal until the 31st of July 2021 when the first patrol for the year again took place. All patrols were cancelled in accordance with the guidelines and regulations that were in force until July 2021. Weekly Wrexham Street Pastor updates were sent to all the Trustees, Steering Group Members, Street Pastors, Prayer Partners and School Pastors.

On behalf of the Trustees and the Steering Group we wish to express our heartfelt gratitude to each and every Wrexham Street and School Pastor volunteer for the tremendous continued commitment and support this dedicated team of 29 people has provided. We also want to express our sincere appreciation for the Prayer Partners who continually intercede in prayer for the Street Pastors and other Street Pastor initiatives. A number of Street Pastors faced some difficult challenging health choices during the year which led to them either retiring as Street Pastors or curtailing their involvement until it was safe to continue. A number of the team went above and beyond their call as volunteers to ensure that we were able to continue serving the community, not only as Street Pastors, but also doing other support work through their local churches. The Wrexham Street Pastor volunteers are drawn from at least 12 different churches and 2 Christian organisations.

As the Wrexham Street Pastor Coordinator, I would also like to express my sincere appreciation to all the Wrexham Street Pastors, School Pastors and Prayer Partners

as well as everyone else who is involved supporting Wrexham Street Pastors. This includes our valued partners namely Ascension Trust, Wrexham County Borough Council, North Wales Police, together with other organisations within the night time economy as well as those who have provided funding to support the Wrexham Street Pastors.

Street Patrols July 2021 until December 2021.

Only a few patrols were undertaken during the first half of the year when the restrictions were partly lifted which enabled us to once again fulfil a service for which we were established, albeit under very different circumstances that included the wearing of face masks, social distancing and very limited physical contact.

A total of only 16 patrols were undertaken from the 31st of August 2021 until December 2021 because of the lockdown in the first half of the year. This is well below what Wrexham Street Pastors would have managed in a normal year.

The information that is recorded monthly from the patrols that took place continued to confirm the positive role that Wrexham Street Pastors fulfils within the night-time economy. During this period a total of 262 volunteer hours were recorded. During these patrols 165 bottles and 205 cans were removed from the streets. 1 space blanket was given out, and 55 pairs of flip flops were donated to grateful members of the public. During these patrols a total of 292 meaningful interactions or positive encounters with members of the public took place. All of these interactions and actions contributed towards helping make Wrexham a safer and more peaceful place as well as providing the added benefit of making a positive difference in many people's lives. Wrexham Street Pastors have also positively interacted through the Night Safe Coordination meetings with the other agencies who participate in making the Wrexham night-time economy safer. Limited interaction continued during the year via Zoom after the lockdown commenced. The Welfare Centre at Hafan-Y-Dref was used by both the Street Pastors and Medical volunteers. Wrexham Street Pastors have passed on 8 referrals during patrols to the Medical team at the centre. Sadly the School Pastors service to the school did not re-commence again during 2021 because of the restrictions that were being adhered to.

Feeding the sheltered community

In late April 2020 the Wrexham Council appealed to the Wrexham Street Pastors to please assist with the distribution of meals and food parcels to these sheltered

people. Wrexham Street Pastors in conjunction with the Council, AVOW (coordinators) and the Salvation Army (meal preparation) delivered approximately 50 to 65 meals and/or food parcels daily between Monday and Friday from the beginning of May until the end of April 2021 to various location in and around Wrexham as well as to one location in Chester. A number of Wrexham Street Pastors took on the delivery responsibilities throughout the year.

Many of the volunteers in the Wrexham Street Pastor initiative also served the Wrexham community through other channels during this year under review. Wrexham Street Pastors received a certificate of commendation for service to the community as a token of appreciation for the driver support that was provided.

As the Coordinator I would like to express my sincere appreciation for all the support, commitment and encouragement that was expressed during the year. We also sadly say goodbye to those who have chosen to retire and we wish them everything of the best in the years ahead. Thank you once again, one and all, for your continued support and encouragement which is, as always, greatly appreciated.



WREXHAM STREET PASTORS 2020 ANNUAL REPORT



This annual report covers the period from January 2020 until December 2020. Each year we, as Wrexham Street Pastors, expect to continue where we left off from the previous year doing what we have done since the inception of this charity. However 2020 was an exceptional year in more ways than one. Who would have predicted at the start of the year that on the 24th of March 2020 a complete lockdown would be announced by the Prime Minister? Who would have imagined that a global pandemic would affect our lives in many, many ways where changes and adjustments became the order of the day? 2020 was such a year and we continue to experience the affects thereof.

Life for Wrexham Street Pastors did not continue as normal. All patrols were cancelled in accordance with the guidelines and regulations that came into force. Only a few patrols were undertaken when the restrictions were lifted which enabled us to once again fulfil the service for which we were established - albeit under very different circumstances.

On behalf of the Wrexham Board of Trustees and the Management Support Group we wish to express our heartfelt gratitude to each and every Wrexham Street and School Pastor volunteer for the tremendous continued commitment and support this dedicated team of 31 people has provided. We also want to express our sincere appreciation for the Prayer Partners who continually intercede in prayer for the Street Pastors and other Street Pastor initiatives. A number of Street Pastors faced some difficult challenging health choices during the year which led to them either retiring as Street Pastors or curtailing their involvement until it was safe to continue. A number of the team went above and beyond their call as volunteers to ensure that we were able to continue serving the community, not only as Street Pastors, but also doing other support work through their local churches. The Wrexham Street Pastor volunteers are drawn from at least 12 different churches and 2 Christian organisations.

As the Wrexham Street Pastor Coordinator, I would also like to express my sincere appreciation to all the Wrexham Street Pastors, School Pastors and Prayer Partners as well as everyone else who is involved supporting Wrexham Street Pastors. This includes our valued Partners namely Ascension Trust, the Council, the Police, together with other organisations within the night time economy as well as those who have provided funding to support the Wrexham Street Pastors.

Street Patrols January 2020 until March 2020.

Regular Street Pastor patrols continued on the 2nd and 4th Fridays as well as every Saturday of each month until the lockdown was announced in March whereupon street patrols were curtailed. Patrols commenced again in August 2020 but were soon stopped when the second lockdown was announced by the Welsh Government. The information that is recorded monthly from the patrols that took place continued to confirm the positive role that Wrexham Street Pastors fulfils within the night time economy. During January, February and March a total of 15 patrols took place. During this period a total of 250 volunteer hours were recorded. During these patrols 194 bottles & 228 cans were removed from the streets. 2 space blankets were given out and 65 pairs of flip flops were donated to grateful members of the public. During these patrols a total of 356 meaningful interactions or positive encounters with members of the public took place. All of these interactions and actions contributed towards helping make Wrexham a safer and more peaceful place as well as providing the added benefit of making a positive difference in many people's lives. Wrexham Street Pastors have also positively interacted through the Night Safe Coordination meetings with the other agencies who participate in making the Wrexham night time economy safer. Limited interaction continued during the year via Zoom after the lockdown commenced. The Welfare Centre at Hafan-Y-Dref was used by both the Street Pastors and Spark Medical volunteers. Wrexham Street Pastors have passed on 12 referrals during patrols to Spark Medical at the centre.

School Pastors weekly ministry during term times continued at Rhosnesni High School until the lockdown was announced. Sadly this service to the school did not commence again during 2020 because of the restrictions that were being adhered to.

Feeding the sheltered community

Following the announcement of the lockdown in March 2020 all roofless and vulnerable persons were removed from the streets in Wrexham and placed in sheltered accommodation across the Wrexham borough as well as in Chester.

In late April 2020 the Wrexham Council appealed to the Wrexham Street Pastors to please assist with the distribution of meals and food parcels to these sheltered people. Wrexham Street Pastors in conjunction with the Council, AVOW (coordinators) and the Salvation Army (meal preparation) delivered approximately 50 to 65 meals and/or food parcels daily between Monday and Friday from the beginning of May until the end of December 2020. This was to various location in and around Wrexham as well as to one location in Chester. This service continued into 2021. A number of Wrexham Street Pastors took on the delivery responsibilities throughout the year.

Weekly Wrexham Street Pastor updates were sent to all the Trustees, Management Support Group Members, Street Pastors, Prayer Partners and School Pastors. Regular Trustee and Management Support Group meetings were held throughout the year via Zoom to assess what was happening and to look at how else we could support the Wrexham Community. Many of the volunteers in the Wrexham Street Pastor initiative also served the Wrexham community through other channels during this year under review. Wrexham Street Pastors received a certificate of commendation for service to the community as a token of appreciation for the driver support that was provided.

As the Coordinator I would like to express my sincere appreciation for all the support, commitment and encouragement that was expressed during the year. We also sadly say goodbye to those who have chosen to retire and we wish them everything of the best in the years ahead. Thank you once again, one and all, for your continued support and encouragement which is, as always, greatly appreciated.


