- 1) To advance in life and relieve needs of young people through:
- (a) the provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare, designed to improve their conditions of life; and
- (b) providing support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals
- 2) the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation in particular by the provision of facilities for boxing and football

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

- 1) The provision of football and boxing session's to boys and girls ranging from 5 to 16 years of age. There are 8 sessions per week across both sports. The club provides all essential equipment. We have an open access policy for both sports.
- 2) Assistance provided to our youngsters to progress within their chosen sport. Across our football programs this includes opportunities to progress on to club trials and organising league competitions. Across our boxing programs this includes arranging for youngsters to become registered as competitive boxers with the NGB (should they so wish) and accompanying them to tournaments
- 3) An assessment and award system to help the progressive development of the young athletes. These awards are not only given for physical skills, but also for mental attitude and behaviour.
- 4) The provision of recreational and competitive boxing to adults. The sessions are open access, and attendees are assisted with their training according to their ability and aspiration within the sport.
- 5) The provision of coaching to adults wishing to compete. Arranging for their registration with the NGB. Accompanying the boxers to tournaments.
- 6) In house boxing for youth groups.
- 7) Community engagement sessions. This includes the organisation of youth football tournaments across the year linked with workshops discussing important topics such as tackling knife crime. Partnering with the Met Police and other youth organisations such as Spiral Skills and Advocacy Academy to develop collaboration and community networking.
- 8) Support for volunteer development onto accredited boxing and football Nationally recognised course

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Afewee Boxing Gym

Apr 23-Apr 24

- Ongoing dedicated 'girls only' boxing sessions for 13-17 year olds on Saturday mornings, led by female coach and long standing amateur club boxer Vivien Parsons
- In July, we started women only sessions once per week, run by female coaches to provide safe space for Muslim women.
- Appointed Junior sessions for 11-16yr olds to qualified Cuban coaches (Rasel and Charles) in order to enhance the long term development and success of the participants – encouraging the high ability kids onto competition.
- Afewee senior amateur boxer Vivien Parsons won the number one national amateur championship at 57kg, securing the number one position nationally
- Afewee female boxer Vivien Parsons won the GB three nations gold medal representing England in April
- Afewee senior amateur boxer Danny Lyness won the inaugural capital cup at 71kg in June
- We ran a summer camp for 7-16yr olds for 3 weeks, which included boxing, fitness, nutrition workshops and guest speakers. We attracted 15-20 young people daily (Mon-Fri) during this time. It finished with a medal awards ceremony to celebrate the achievements of all young people who attended.
- Army attended the gym and ran an engagement session with our young people, explaining their roles and the processes of what being a member in the armed forces entails.
- Afewee female senior boxer Vivien Parsons wins gold internationally representing England vs Spain
- Afewee professional boxer Isaac Chamberlain won the British and commonwealth titles at York hall, Bethnal green, in the main event shown live on sky sports in October
- Afewee boxing club up-skilled 3 coaches to their level 1 England boxing coaching qualification, allowing them to volunteer back to the club during amateur sessions and support other coaches and boxers
- Jersey Edgley becomes Afewee Boxing Clubs' youngest female to represent the club at 11 years old in a skills contest in December 2023
- Afewee organised a food drop leading up to Christmas 2023 where members donated a load of non-perishable food items which were then all donated to a local food bank
- Afewee Boxing club start dedicated sessions once a week for home educators, targeting young people aged 8-16yrs old not in mainstream education
- Head coach Bobby Miltiadous selected as a national development coach for England Boxing, coaching at national level - and in line for selection to international competitions supporting other national coaches and boxers.
- Afewee form a collaboration with local boxing gym Dwaynatics, training and supporting each other and allowing joint training sessions and coaching support.
- Afewee organise a young women's walkabout – a project formed to carry out a series of walks in Greater London through parks. This was arranged to encourage exercise through socialising.

- 10 amateur senior boxers competed, representing the club in competitions across the UK
- Booking system showed 108 monthly paying members on subscriptions, up by 60% year on year.
- Average customer lifetime up by 65% to 9 months on average

Afewee Football Academy

April 2023 – April 2024

- Afewee organised two girls only walk and talk events to Richmond park, Southwark park and an indoor climbing session. March and April 2023
- Afewee organised a half term activity in collaboration with UTCAL, ACS International schools Partnership and Crystal Palace FC. Young people Yr 6-9 had opportunity to access mentoring. Football training, coaching, young leader options, peer mentor and refereeing courses for those in year 10 and above. October 2023
- Afewee organised a youth mental health workshop with a premier league footballer from Fulham FC who did a live Q&A with the young people. November 2023
- Afewee player Kruz signed at U9's for Chelsea FC
- Afewee – organised an Arsenal FC stadium tour for some of its football members. February 2024
- Afewee trustee Keishana was appointed as the Brixton Windrush Met Safer neighbourhood police Chair – advocating for youth engagement as a key priority. February 2024
- Afewee founders, trustees coaches and athletes were recognised for their services to sports in side the Brixton Recreation Centre for the past two and a half decades. April 2024
- Afewee U6s football team was invited to The Crystal Palace FC festival tournament And won it against 16 other teams invited for this event
- Afewee have developed five youth players who are now training with respective professional football clubs; Gabby (Arsenal & Chelsea) Troy (Arsenal Chelsea Fulham) Omar (Chelsea Fulham crystal palace) Jaheim (crystal palace chelsea & Fulham) Kweku (chelsea Arsenal fulham palace)
- Afewee player Samuel Washington U16's ex signed a Scholarship for Charlton Athletic FC. Afewee founder and trustee Anthony Goldring was invited by the family to attend Samuel's U16's Professional Development League Cup at the Charlton Athletic stadium where the team won the competition.
- Afewee player Hilton has signed for Chelsea FC. April 2024
- Afewee developed U9's player David is currently on trial at Chelsea FC. April 2024
