Looking beyond the current year, 2025-6 has so far shown the accounts in the black, and the locomotive has been on loan to the East Lancashire Railway since September 2025. It will remain there, on display to the public, and under cover, for several months.

Another meeting with SVR management was not productive. A small amount of maintenance work has been carried out.



Trustees have continued to work with the town council and other local entities on relevant historical street furniture about the town.



One of the requirements is the appointment of, and approval by an Independent Competent Person (ICP) to oversee the project. In December 2022 we had a much delayed, but valuable and encouraging meeting with our ICP. This frees us to push on with parts of the build where there was a quandary over the engineering design.

Early in 2021 we were able to celebrate the 250th birthday of Richard Trevithick. Heritage Railway magazine had a large feature about him, including a section on our locomotive. We also had a photoshoot which resulted in good coverage in the local press. As a result of this, with the kind support of the editor, Heritage Railway hosted an appeal for funds to finish the locomotive. This appeal raised £1600 of the £10,000 asked for.

We were able to have only one event during the year, at the SVR Autumn Gala in September 2021. It was good to be able to get our display stand out in fine autumn weather and talk to the public for the first time in two years.


Working restrictions at The SVR have meant that little progress has been made on the locomotive during the year. Some flaking paint has been refreshed, and work has started to replace a pair of wooden parts that have been damaged by exposure to the elements.


