Volunteers travelled to Morocco 23rd September – 6th October 2023

Work included collecting street cats that are taken to a veterinary surgery for sterilisation, Rabies vaccination and treatment.

During this period HSAM helped 702 street animals. The breakdown of this is as follows:

121 male cats sterilised and Rabies vaccinated
70 female cats sterilised and Rabies vaccinated
500 cats treated
11 dogs treated

The main focus of the charity is sterilisation. By controlling the population, the charity has lessened suffering and the spread of disease. This in turn has encouraged a healthier population.

We have continued to see a marked improvement of health throughout the street animals' population overall, although there was an increase in kittens on the street. There has been a substantially smaller number sterilised over the past few years, so this was to be expected.




