 2. To advance the education of the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the welfare of street animals
- To control and maintain a healthy street animal population.

Volunteers were unable to travel to Morocco during this period due to COVID. However, a volunteer based in Essaouira was able to continue the charities work at the end of April 2021.

This includes collecting street animals that are taken to a veterinary surgery for sterilisation, Rabies vaccination and treatment.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During this period HSAM has sterilised 100 street cats. The breakdown of this is as follows:

50 male cats sterilised and Rabies vaccinated

50 Female cats sterilised and Rabies vaccinated

The main focus of the charity is sterilisation. By controlling the population, the charity has lessened suffering and the spread of disease. This in turn has encouraged a healthier population.

We have continued to see a marked improvement of health throughout the street animals' population.
