Objectives and Activities

The Kings Lynn Film Festival objectives are to: promote appreciation of, and education in, the arts and crafts and their associated technologies in relation to cinema and other forms of moving images by staging an annual film festival and educational events and activities in association with this.

Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.

King's Lynn Film Festival began back in 2015, but after a follow up edition in 2017, took a break for several years.

It returned in 2023 with a four-day edition 27-30 November, taking place primarily at the Corn Exchange Cinema in the town.

This was a successful return and the 2024 edition followed along broadly similar lines.

Our activities have been given a good profile locally through the media and through our own communications activities, including both social media and a physical presence within the town centre shopping area. The bulk of the expenditure associated with staging the Film Festival was spent on physical publicity material including posters, two pull-up banners, a vinyl banner, and 1,000 A5 fold-out leaflets, which we distributed around town, at key locations, directly to the public, to cinema audiences etc. These were visually attractive and were probably our main way to encourage ticket sales.

We negotiated a deal with the Corn Exchange cinema whereby they donated the screens free of charge, booked in the requested films, but then retained the income from ticket sales. This worked well for our festival return, minimising any losses for us, and enabling us to make imaginative film bookings with less risk.

We developed further our working relationship with the College of West Anglia, working with the media students so that their short films were able to be included in the festival line-up.

We also included a film about the experiences of young people with autism, and worked with the local Autism Group in West Norfolk to promote the film.

Through our funds and negotiations, we staged a four-day film festival comprising 15 feature films, and two screenings of locally-made student shorts. Overall, we have established the KLFF as part of the wider arts and cultural offering in King's Lynn and West Norfolk.

Yes, the Trustees have read the guidance issued by the Charity Commission.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.

The successful staging of the Film Festival in November 2024 could be seen as a positive success, presenting 15 films from around the world, a film aimed at those with autism and their families, and two sessions of locally made student short films. The student sessions only cost £1 to encourage the wider public to attend and make it affordable for everyone. Audiences reacted positively to the festival, and felt that the event made a positive contribution to the arts offering in the town and locality. Total audiences over the 4 days exceeded 500 people.

The main objective for 2024/25 was to build on the success of the previous year, and to deliver a film festival that could grow and attract increased numbers, and enhance its profile within the town and surrounding areas. We have achieved this.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period - We began the year with £1183, attracted a further £918 in funds, and then spent around £818 on staging the film festival. We ended the year with £1282 reserve in the bank.

Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held - Whilst we don't have a formal policy on reserves, we like to retain a base of at least £1000 at the end of year as a guarantee that we will be able to undertake a festival in the new year. This we have achieved.

We also hired out space in a town centre shop on two occasions to engage the public directly and promote the festival.</p> <p>We negotiated a deal with the Corn Exchange cinema whereby they donated the screens free of charge, booked in the requested films, but then retained the income from ticket sales. This worked well for our festival return, minimising any losses for us, and enabling us to make imaginative film bookings with less risk.</p> <p>We attracted funding from the Norfolk Community Foundation for the screening of a Ukrainian animated film, free of charge to the public, with the aim of attracting an audience drawn from both the Ukrainian refugee community and long-standing local families.</p> <p>Through our funds and negotiations, we staged a four-day film festival comprising 15 feature films, a talk on film, and two screenings of locally-made student shorts.</p> <p>Overall, we have established the KLFF as part of the wider arts and cultural offering in King's Lynn and West Norfolk.</p>

The film festival weekend normally takes place every two years. We previously reported that we had decided to stage our next Festival in the autumn of 2020 to revise our offering. However, as a result of the pandemic, this was postponed and we have not undertaken any specific activities, received any income, or incurred any expenditure - further details are set out below.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The key activists behind the King's Lynn Film Festival took a decision to postpone the festival from its anticipated date of autumn 2019 to autumn 2020. But because of the covid pandemic within the 20-21 financial year we have not undertaken any activities. A review was taken in early 2022 and it was decided that there was still not a readiness for a festival in the year, so we will review and plan for a 2023 Festival return.

We have received funds totalling £1834 during the financial year, all in the form of donations from the general public. This will put us in a stronger position to start serious planning for activities in 2023.

We will also review our position and seek to find new people to support the KL Film Festival for future years.
