

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of the Wyke Christian Council of Churches, a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (the CIO).

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Wyke Christian Council of Churches (the CIO) for the year ended 31st December 2021.

Trustees Report for the year ended 31st December 2022

The Wyke Christian Council of Churches (WCCC) includes St. Mary's Parish Church, the Wyke Methodist Church, the Westfield United Reformed Church, the Wyke Christian Community Church, the Lower Wyke Moravian Church and St. Theresa & St. Winifred's Catholic Church.

The council is made up of two representatives from each church, and the trustees are nominated and appointed by this committee.

The WCCC organised united services on the 16th January, at the Lower Wyke Moravian Church, and on the 18th July at the Wyke Methodist Church.

In 2022, the WCCC donated to 'Caring for Life', a Leeds based Christian charity, the Ukrainian Disaster Appeal, and to the Disaster Emergency Committee Appeal for Pakistan.


The Wyke Foodbank was opened in 2015, by the WCCC, in cooperation with the Trussell Trust, and supports those in crisis in Bradford South. The Foodbank operates from The Hub, 86 Blackstone Avenue, Wyke, Bradford, BD12 8SJ.

Following the pandemic, food was delivered to clients. This process has been continued, through what is called an e-referral system. This means that clients contact their Referral Agent (Doctors, Care Workers, Charities, and Housing Associations etc.) who are able to process their details through the Trussell Trust registration system. The details are then sent to the nearest Foodbank to their accommodation. The Wyke Foodbank currently supports those in crisis in the BD6, BD12 & BD19 postal areas of Bradford and Cleckheaton.

25,724kg of food and toiletries was distributed in 2022, an increase of 37% over 2021. The Foodbank is well supported by significant donations of food from local churches, schools, businesses and individuals, as well as a number of generous financial donations. The Foodbank is now linked with People's Fundraisers (a branch of Golden Giving), a not for profit service, so that donations to the Foodbank can be made through their web site.

The Wyke Foodbank Steering Group are accountable to the Trustees of the Wyke Christian Council of Churches, and a Trustee is present at each bi-monthly meeting of the Foodbank team.
