TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1st APRIL 2025

1. OBJECTIVES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The objectives of the Jacaranda UK Foundation as defined in our Trust Deed are, for the public benefit, to relieve the needs of children and adults in Malawi in particular, but not exclusively, by providing charitable assistance to and advancing the education and training of those who are the victims of HIV/AIDS, war or natural disaster or catastrophe, by making grants of money and by supporting the work of other charities and organisations furthering similar charitable purposes in this country.

Over this financial year we had two main sources of fundraising:

- i. Regular and single donations from individuals
- ii. Grants from other trusts, charities and foundations

The trustees express their profound thanks to all those organisations that have made such generous grants to us, as well as to the individual donors who make regular monthly donations and respond to specific appeals so liberally.

2. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

From our creation in 2015 we have mostly supported The Jacaranda Foundation, which runs the Jacaranda School for Orphans, the Jacaranda Mullen Preschool and the Jacaranda Vocational College located outside Limbe, Malawi.

Founded by Malawian Marie Da Silva in 2002, the foundation cares for over four hundred children, 97% of whom have been orphaned by AIDS. Marie worked as a nanny in the US to fund the school initially but now runs the school full time with her husband, Executive Director Luc Deschamps.

Three of our trustees have worked at the school either as volunteers or as full-time teachers.

Income and fundraising

Gross income for the year ended 1st April 2025 was £86,219.08, made up of donations, grants and Gift Aid totalling £85,551.02 plus £668.06 of bank interest. This makes this year our most successful to date in terms of gross income generated, surpassing the previous financial year. Similar to 2023/2024, it is particularly notable that we did not receive any significant individual donation, demonstrating a diversified income stream.

We continued our recent strategy of contracting with an **external fundraiser** to source and submit applications to grant-giving organisations, and we are pleased with the

outcome of this strategy to date. In this financial year our external fundraiser submitted 102 applications, resulting in 22 successful grants for a total of £49,058, averaging £2,230 per grant. This once again demonstrates that the projects we fund are valued by small grant-giving organisations with limited funds to allocate.

The average grant success is generally accepted to be about 15% industry wide, so our rate of 22% is impressive, and speaks to the continued quality of the proposals. The number of grants was similar to previous years.

We paid the external fundraiser £16,545 in consultancy fees for the period. The Trustees have deemed this to be sufficiently good return on investment to continue with this strategy for the time being.

The trustees frequently review the external contractor's work with a view to maximising its value and impact.

We had one other significant source of income, which was The Big Give Christmas 2024 campaign, in which we raised a net amount of £18,986.25 in individual donations and Gift Aid, and £10,000 in "matched funding" (including £5,000 from our Champion Funder, **The Waterloo Foundation**, to whom we are extremely grateful) for a total net amount of £28,986.25. Given this success, we will certainly apply to take part in The Big Give Christmas 2025 campaign and will hope to raise a similar or larger amount of money again.

Grants made

Our grants are based on the previous year's net income, except for 2021/22, when we received the donation designated for fundraising referred to above.

This year we were delighted to provide grants of £53,852.57 which were split between the following projects:

- University Scholarships for graduates of the Jacaranda School for Orphans
- Women's Entrepreneurship Programme
- Emergency Nutrition and the Jacaranda Nutrition Centre
- Mr. Luc's Libraries – construction of new libraries and upkeep of existing.
- Classroom improvements at the Jacaranda School for Orphans
- Staffing and materials at the Jacaranda Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Clinic
- Playground construction at the Jacaranda Mullen Preschool
- Partial Solar Power installation at the Jacaranda School for Orphans

We are particularly happy with the progress of the **Women's Entrepreneurship Programme**. This is a programme we have championed and sought to fund from its inception. The programme was initially set up to provide free entrepreneurship training to women local to Jacaranda School for Orphans, most of whom were widows looking for a way to provide sustainably for their families.



After a successful pilot, which demonstrated not only that there is significant demand for this training, but also that it had a very positive impact on the lives of the attendees, we are now looking to fund the expansion of the programme. It is now certified by the Technical, Entrepreneurial and Vocational Education and Training Association of Malawi (TEVETA) and is housed at the Jacaranda Technical and Vocational College. This gives the women access to additional skills training at the college, including tailoring, carpentry, catering, cosmetology, agriculture, animal husbandry, and even creative fields like sound design and photography.

We will continue to try to raise funds for this programme, as in our judgement it is an excellent example of a locally led project that empowers a marginalised group to help themselves, build a sustainable future and lift themselves out of poverty.

The Trustees are pleased that we were once again able to increase the annual total of grants made, continuing the pattern established since 2020 of increasing donations year-on-year. There is no guarantee that we will be able to continue to do so again in 2026.

3. FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year we received total income (including Gift Aid) of £86,219.08, of which £32,552.57 was restricted to specific causes, and we made grants totalling £53,852.57.

We incurred expenses of £17,859.43 during the year and at the end of the year we had bank balances totalling £54,732.20.

We continued to place a significant portion of our reserves in interest earning accounts with our bankers, Lloyds Bank Plc. All our deposits are covered by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme.

No trustee has ever received any payment for their duties or for any other purpose.

We had a number of successful applications to trusts and foundations, some of which are listed below. We are most grateful to these organisations, especially those that have now funded us in multiple years, and to those not mentioned, who wish to remain anonymous.

Additionally, we also most sincerely thank all those charitable individuals who have committed to generous monthly donations, and those who support us when they can with individual donations.

4. RESERVES AND FUNDS ALLOCATION POLICY

The Trustees' policy is to hold resources sufficient to meet at least twelve months of unavoidable expenditure with a margin for the unexpected. For 2025/2026, in accordance with this policy, the reserve level has been calculated at £3,000.

Funds above this level can be allocated by the Trustees to specific projects or overheads and are defined as unrestricted or restricted in accordance with the wishes of the donor.

- **Unrestricted funds** are those available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of our general objectives and which have not been designated for other purposes.
- **Designated funds** comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. At present they are all dedicated to fundraising.
- **Restricted funds** are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors, or which have been raised for particular purposes.

The levels of each of these classes of funds are set out in the financial statements.

5. PLANS FOR 2025/26

We plan to continue to work with an external contractor for the coming financial year. They will be funded out of the remainder of the specific grant we were given in 2021 that has been designated for this purpose, along with such other unrestricted funding the Trustees decide to allocate to fundraising. We will also continue to pursue other sources of funding, such as appeals like "The Big Give" and charity race participants.



We will carefully choose suitable projects for which to raise funds whilst maintaining focus on raising money to assist with paying teachers' salaries at the Jacaranda School for Orphans, the Jacaranda Mullen Preschool, and the Jacaranda Technical and Vocational College.

The Trustees will report on the progress of this strategy at the end of next financial year.

This makes this year our most successful to date in terms of gross income generated, and is particularly notable as we did not receive any significant individual donation.

We continued our strategy of contracting with an external fundraiser to source and submit applications to grant-giving organisations, and we are pleased with the outcome of this strategy to date. We are seeing regular successful grant applications, with an average

grant size of ~£2,500, which demonstrates that the work we do is valued by small grant-giving organisations with limited funds to allocate.

In this financial year our external fundraiser submitted 101 applications, resulting in 24 successful grants for a total of £59,928. The average grant success is generally accepted to be about 10% industry wide, so our rate of 24% is impressive, and speaks to the quality of the proposals that are being submitted. We paid the external fundraiser £15,975 in consultancy fees for the period, a cost that is covered by a donation we received in 2021 and is specifically designated for fundraising.

The trustees frequently review the external contractor's work with a view to maximising its value and impact.

We had one other significant source of income, which was The Big Give Christmas 2023 campaign, in which we raised a net amount of £6,085.47 in individual donations, and £5,000 in "matched funding", for a total a net amount of £11,085.47.

Grants made

Our grants are based on the previous year's income, except for 2021/22, when we received the donation designated for fundraising referred to above.

This year we were delighted to provide grants of £51,248.13 which were split between the following projects:

- Teachers' salaries at the Jacaranda School for Orphans and the Jacaranda Mullen Preschool
- Classroom improvements at the Jacaranda School for Orphans
- Staffing and materials at the Jacaranda Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Clinic
- Luc's Libraries
- University fees
- Partial Solar Power installation at the Jacaranda School for Orphans

This is the largest annual total of grants we have made, and we are delighted that it continues the pattern we have established since 2020 of increasing our donations year-on-year. There is no guarantee that we will be in a position to continue to do so in 2025.

During the year we received total income (including Gift Aid) of £71,238.22, of which £52,461.75 was restricted to specific causes, and we made grants totalling £51,248.13.

We incurred expenses of £16,797.77 during the year and at the end of the year we had bank balances totalling £40,225.12.

We continued to place a significant portion of our reserves in interest earning accounts with our bankers, Lloyds Bank Plc. All our deposits are covered by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme.

No trustee has ever received any payment for their duties or for any other purpose.

We had a number of successful applications to trusts and foundations, some of which are listed below. We are most grateful to these organisations for their support, especially those that have now funded us in multiple years, and also to those not mentioned, who wish to remain anonymous.

4. RESERVES AND FUNDS ALLOCATION POLICY

The Trustees' policy is to hold resources sufficient to meet at least twelve months of unavoidable expenditure with a margin for the unexpected. For 2024/2025, in accordance with this policy, the reserve level has been calculated at £3,000.

Funds above this level can be allocated by the Trustees to specific projects or overheads and are defined as unrestricted or restricted in accordance with the wishes of the donor.

- **Unrestricted funds** are those available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of our general objectives and which have not been designated for other purposes.
- **Designated funds** comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. At present they are all dedicated to fundraising.
- **Restricted funds** are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised for particular purposes.

The levels of each of these classes of funds are set out in the financial statements.


5. PLANS FOR 2024/25

We plan to continue to work with an external contractor for the coming financial year. They will be funded out of the remainder of the specific grant we were given in 2021 that has been designated for this purpose, along with such other unrestricted funding the Trustees decide to allocate to fundraising. We will also continue to pursue other sources of funding, such as appeals like "The Big Give" and charity race participants.

We will carefully choose suitable projects for which to raise funds whilst maintaining focus on raising money to assist with paying teachers' salaries at the Jacaranda School for Orphans, the Jacaranda Mullen Preschool, and the Jacaranda Technical and Vocational College.

The Trustees will report on the progress of this strategy at the end of next financial year.

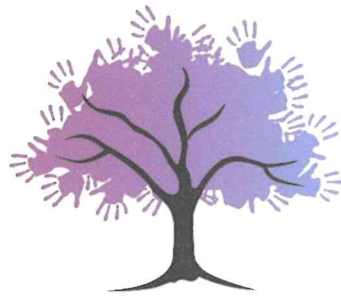

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1st APRIL 2023

1. OBJECTIVES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The objectives of the Jacaranda UK Foundation as defined in our Trust Deed are, for the public benefit, to relieve the needs of children and adults in Malawi in particular, but not exclusively, by providing charitable assistance to and advancing the education and training of those who are the victims of HIV/AIDS, war or natural disaster or catastrophe, by making grants of money and by supporting the work of other charities and organisations furthering similar charitable purposes in this country.

Over this financial year we had two main sources of fundraising:

- i. Regular and single donations from individuals
- ii. Grants from other trusts, charities and foundations

The trustees express their profound thanks to all those organisations that have made such generous grants to us, as well as to the individual donors who make regular monthly donations and respond to specific appeals so liberally.

2. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

From our creation in 2015 we have mostly supported The Jacaranda Foundation, which runs the Jacaranda School for Orphans and the Jacaranda Vocational College located outside Limbe, Malawi.

Founded by Marie Da Silva in 2002, the foundation cares for over four hundred children, 97% of whom have been orphaned by AIDS. Marie worked as a nanny in the US to fund the school initially, but now runs the school full time with her husband, Executive Director Luc Deschamps.

Three of our trustees have worked at the school either as volunteers or as full-time teachers.

Income and fundraising

Gross income for the year ended 1st April 2023 was £52,965.44, made up of donations, grants and Gift Aid totalling £52,909.90 plus £55.54 of bank interest.

We continued our strategy of contracting with an external fundraiser to source and submit applications to grant-giving organisations. Our first contractor sadly no longer had enough time to keep working with us, so early in the financial year we began the search for a replacement. This search, along with the interviews and onboarding period, unfortunately meant that we lost almost four months of application time in 2022.

We identified two excellent candidates and decided to commission them both for a trial period to see if we could significantly increase our application output. However, after two months, one of the consultants withdrew for personal reasons, so we increased the contracted time with the remaining consultant to 1.5 days per week.

We are already starting to see the fruits of her efforts, with a steady stream of grants coming in. She submitted sixty-four applications over her first five months, resulting in grants of £10,140 in this financial year, and another £5,000 shortly after the year end. We paid her £5,287 in consultancy fees for the period.

The trustees frequently review the external contractor's work with a view to maximising its value and impact.

Our other main source of income this year was an extremely successful emergency appeal to respond to the devastation left by Cyclone Freddy in Malawi. In under a week, we managed to raise £11,458, by far our most successful single fundraising effort to date.

Grants made

Our grants are based on the previous year's income, except for 2021/22, when we received one large donation to be used to pay for our fundraiser.

This year we were delighted to provide grants of £48,425 which included £32,000 to assist with teachers' salaries, tuition fees and classroom supplies; £4,967 to purchase desks and chairs, and £11,458 following our emergency Cyclone Freddy appeal.

This is the largest total of grants we have made in any financial year since our formation.

3. FINANCIAL REVIEW

We started the financial year with bank balances of £45,421.54. During the year we received total income (including Gift Aid) of £52,965.44, of which £17,327.00 was restricted to several specific causes, and we made grants totalling £48,425.00.

We incurred expenses of £12,329.18 during the year and at the end of the year we had bank balances totalling £37,032.80.

It should be noted that the 2022-23 income included a one-off donation of £15,000 and an emergency appeal that generated donations of £11,458, both of which have already been included in grants given. As a result, the trustees do not expect to make a similar level of grants during the 2023/24 financial year, barring unexpected fundraising success.

The trustees express their profound thanks to all those organisations that have made such generous grants to us, as well as to the individual donors who make regular monthly donations and respond to specific appeals so liberally.

2. ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

From our creation in 2015 we have mostly supported The Jacaranda Foundation, which runs the Jacaranda School for Orphans and the Jacaranda Vocational College located outside Limbe, Malawi.

Founded by Marie Da Silva in 2002, the foundation cares for over four hundred children, 97% of whom have been orphaned by AIDS. Marie worked as a nanny in the US to fund the school initially, but now runs the school full time with her husband, Executive Director Luc Deschamps.

Three of our trustees have worked at the school either as volunteers or as full-time teachers.

Income and fundraising

In terms of income, the year ended 1st April 2022 was comfortably our best on record, with received donations and Gift Aid totalling £75,133. This included a single extremely generous donation which made up over 80% of our revenue for the year. That donation is unrestricted, but the donor requested that, if possible, it should be used as transformational funding to assist Jacaranda UK Foundation to achieve a level of self-sustainability and encourage more regular income.

This represents a wonderful opportunity for the charity to build relationships with other grant giving bodies, as well as acceding to the donor's wishes. As a consequence, the Trustees have decided to use the funds initially to fund a part-time external freelance fundraiser to manage and submit regular applications to Trusts and Foundations for the next three to four years.

After an extensive search and interview process, we contracted with an experienced external fundraising contractor who has now been working with us since July 2021. Together we are building a robust pipeline of regular applications to Trusts and Foundations and building relationships with them.

This work has already shown success, with grants of £10,750 secured during the financial year and a further £5,967 shortly after the year end.

The Trustees continuously review the external contractor's work with a view to maximising its value and impact. We expect this groundwork to show increased success in the future.

Grants made

In the past, the level of grants we make has been based on the previous year's net income. However, as the exceptional donation received in 2021 will be used to support professional fundraising efforts, it will not initially be made available to distribute as grants.

Nonetheless, this year we were delighted to provide grants of £30,500 which included the purchasing of 161 single desks for the Jacaranda School for Orphans middle and senior schools, as well as desks, chairs, cabinets and white boards for the Jacaranda Pre-school, meaning the latter is now operational and ready to accept students.

We also provided funding for COVID-19-related relief activities, and, as with previous years, supported teachers' salaries at the Jacaranda School for Orphans.

3. FINANCIAL REVIEW

We started the financial year with bank balances of £7,405.92. During the year we received total income (including Gift Aid) of £75,133.03, of which £8,500.00 was restricted to several specific causes, and we made grants totalling £30,500.00.

We had a number of successful applications to Trusts and Foundations, some of which are listed below. We are most grateful to these organisations for their support, especially those that have now funded us in multiple years, and also to those not mentioned, who wished to remain anonymous.

Of course, we also most sincerely thank all those charitable individuals who have committed to generous monthly donations, and those who support us when they can.

We incurred expenses of £7,217.41 during the year and at the end of the year we had bank balances totalling £45,421.54.

No trustee has ever received any payment for their duties or for any other purpose.

4. PLANS FOR 2022/23

We plan to continue to work with an external contractor for the coming year. We will also explore other sources of funding, such as corporate partnerships, to increase our impact.

We will carefully choose suitable projects for which to raise funds whilst maintaining focus on raising money for teachers' salaries.

The trustees will report on the progress of this strategy at the end of the 2022/23 financial year.

Basis of Independent Examiner's report


