To promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Llangynwyd and the neighbourhood together defined by what are commonly known as Top and Bottom Llangynwyd, Pontrhydydyff, Garth Fach, Lletti Brongu, together with outlying farms and houses as shown on the electoral roll, hereinafter called "the area of benefit") without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the said inhabitants and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants;

To maintain and manage the Llangynwyd Village Hall in furtherance of these objects.
To promote such other charitable purposes as may from time to time be determined.

The Charity supports a number of projects for the benefit of the people of Llangynwyd, and the surrounding area, and some of the public benefits of these projects are detailed below.

The principle activity of the Charity in the year under review was to further or benefit the residents of Llangynwyd and the surrounding areas, without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions by associating together the said residents and other agencies, sectors and service providers in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

The Charity maintains a village hall for the benefit of the local residents and the surrounding area.

The village hall has a small coffee shop facility which remains used only by groups accessing the hall such as the parent & toddler group and WI.

2024-25 was another year of solid growth for the Association.

The hall hosts regular sessions six days a week with capacity on Saturdays and Sunday mornings to enable private bookings such as birthday parties and baby showers to take place.

In line with the previous financial year, we have once again managed to have a net income of just over £2,000 resulting in a further increase of our reserves to just over £33,000.

The Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in managing the activities of the charity.

The Village Hall continues to thrive as a vibrant hub of community life, with activities taking place six days a week. From long-standing favourites like the twice-weekly Parent & Toddler group and the ever-popular monthly Film Club - both supported by the Llangynwyd Community Association (LCA) - to independent hirers offering Pilates sessions and Sunday martial arts classes, the hall is a hive of activity.

Despite the busy schedule, the hall remains a welcoming space for special occasions. Birthday parties, baby showers, and other family celebrations are regularly hosted, adding to the hall's reputation as a place where memories are made. Throughout the year, we've also opened our doors to community engagement events, supporting both the Community Council and developers involved in major energy infrastructure projects.

At the heart of it all is the LCA's vision: to create a true community hub in the centre of the village. The diverse range of events ensures that everyone - regardless of age or background - can find something meaningful at the hall.

The Llangynwyd Lucky Draw continues to be a cherished initiative, not only raising valuable funds for the hall's upkeep but also strengthening the community's connection to the space. Every ticket sold is a small act of support, with the added excitement of a potential cash prize.

As we reflect on another successful year, we look ahead to 2025/26 with optimism and ambition. With the dedication of our small but passionate team of volunteers and the unwavering support of our local community, we're confident that the Village Hall will continue to grow as a sustainable, inclusive, and much-loved gathering place for Llangynwyd and beyond.

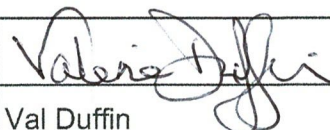
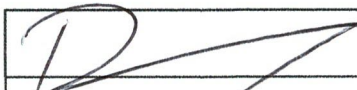
