1. General information

- This year the school has 315 pupils (including 11+ classes) studying in 21 classes. The school have 37 teachers/teaching assistant and one caretaker.
- The Safeguarding Policy is in place. DBS checks are carried out for volunteers in line with statutory requirement.
- RCS is a member of UK Association for Promoting Chinese Education.
- All volunteers and trustees give their time voluntarily and received no-remuneration or other benefits.
- RCS' objects are to advance education for the public benefit in Chinese language and Chinese culture in the Borough of Reading and its neighbouring areas and beyond.
- Our main source of funds has been from the school fees for study at RCS. We hold a small fund to help families who would otherwise struggle to pay the fees.
- The main cost is the rent for classrooms, parents' rest areas, teachers' travel allowances, teachers' training fees, textbooks, students' awards etc.

2. Teaching & learning

- The school continues to implement all the policies & rules related to teaching & learning.
- Our staff attended two training sessions organised by the UKAPCE, the school also organised 2 internal training sessions.
- In addition to the language teaching, we also have the children and adult dance clubs, calligraphy club, Public Speech club and Classical Chinese club. All were well-attended.
- 36 students took part the Chinese Essay Writing Competition and 26 students received awards including the First Prize, Second Prize and Excellency Award. The school would like to thank Ms Zheng and all other teachers who help to organise the writing sessions to improve students' writing skills.
- 23 students took the CIE IGCSE Chinese exam in June 2025, all obtained Grades A* to A. Two students took Edexcel A Level exam! Many congratulations to all the candidates. Thank LIU Yongqin, JIANG Hongmin, YU Tianchi and GAO Shan for their hard work!
- To celebrate the school's 46th anniversary, 'RCS got Talent Show' was held on October. More than 30 students took part. Their performances were excellent.

- On 9th February, RCS successfully hosted Year of Snake new year celebration at Reading Town Hall again. It was the second time RCS hosted Dragon Dance and the Lion dance in the Town Hall Square. It was also the first time that RCS hosted a street parade along Reading Broad Street. The street parade attracted large crowds and brought the spirit of Year of the Snake to the people of Reading, showcasing the school's commitment to cultural bridge-building. In the Town Hall, every class took part in showcasing their talents. The hall was packed with people. The Mayor of Reading and the MP for Earley and Woodley, Ms Yuan Yang, participated and delivered warm speeches. We would like to express our gratitude to all teachers and TAs' for their dedication in preparing, directing, and organising the show. A special thank you to the PTA volunteers for their hard work in decorating the venue and serving as marshals during the street parade. We also would also like to thank the Queen Anne's School's students who performed in the Town Hall. Many thanks also went to staff and parents who ran eight Chinese art workshops in the Town Hall.
- QIU Jin and FU Shan received the Excellent Teacher Award in October 2024, we would like to congratulate them again and thank them for their dedication to the School and Chinese Teaching.
- Over last year, our students participated in various competitions including Calligraphy, Chinese Cultural, and recital. In the Recital competition, 73 students participated, 22 students managed to enter the UK final, and 8 were chosen to enter the International Final.
- In May, RCS successful hosted YCT and HSK exams. More than 42 students were non-RCS. Many thanks to Ms Qiu Jin for organising it.
- On 10th May, RCS took part in the Reading Children's Festival again. Students performed 2 dances and ensemble, which were very well received. Two pandas dressed by two students were the most popular figures in the Forbury Garden! M2A class' students and the adult dances took part at the 'One World Family Festival' in Ashmolean Museum Oxford. Their performance was well received.
- Dr Liu thanked all staff and parents again for their continued dedication and support. She said that the school will continue with our Specialisation, Standardisation and Formalisation. We will more actively take part in community events in Reading and surrounding areas to promote understanding and communications with all ethnicities and cultural backgrounds.

- All volunteers and trustees give their time voluntarily and received no-remuneration or other benefits.
- RCS' objects are to advance education for the public benefit in Chinese language and Chinese culture in the Borough of Reading and its neighbouring areas and beyond.
- Our main source of funds has been from the school fees for study at RCS. We hold a small fund to help families who would otherwise struggle to pay the fees.
- The main cost is the rent for classrooms, parents' rest areas, teachers' travel allowances, teachers' training fees, textbooks, students' awards etc.

2. Teaching & learning

- The school continues to implement all the policies & rules related to teaching & learning.
- The school returned to face to face teaching as from September. Dr Liu thanked all parents for their cooperation and all PTA helpers for their help in managing the students during the beginning when we still had covid control.
- Our staff attended 6 training sessions organised by the UKAPC, the School also organised 2 internal training sessions.
- Some of our students took part the Overseas Chinese Essay Writing Competition and 15 students received an award including First Prize, Second Prize and Excellency Award. The School would like to thank Shanping Laoshi and Hongmin Laoshi for organising sessions to help the students.
- 10 students sat for the IGCSE exam in November 2021, 4 obtained Grade 9, and 6 obtained Grade 8. The School thanked Liu Yongqin and Huang Qiuxiang Laoshi for their hard work.

1. General information

- This year the School has 315 pupils (excluding 11+ classes) studying in 21 classes. The school have 31 teachers, teaching assistant and one caretaker.
- The Safeguarding Policy is in place. DBS checks are carried out for employment or volunteers in line with statutory requirement.
- RCS is a member of UK Association for Promoting Chinese Education.
- All volunteers and trustees give their time voluntarily and received no-remuneration or other benefits.
- RCS' objects are to advance education for the public benefit in Chinese language and Chinese culture in the Borough of Reading and its neighbouring areas and beyond.
- Our main source of funds has been from the school fees for study at RCS. We hold a small fund to help families who would otherwise struggle to pay the fees.
- The main cost is the rent for classrooms, parents' rest areas, teachers' travel allowances, teachers' training fees, textbooks, students' awards etc.

2. Teaching & learning

- The School continues to implement all the policies & rules related to teaching & learning.
- We do encourage staff to attend relevant trainings to improve themselves. This year, so far there were 70 training sessions attended by our staff so far, and are now qualified Chinese Teaching Teacher. We also have one PGCE qualified teacher in our School.
- The School has set up groups for staff to facilitate timely share of teaching resources and to improve communications between staff members.

4. School Account

- Financial report: The School account has been audited by a professional accountant and attached in this report.

5. School Activities

- After Covi-d19 started in the end of January, RCS raised over £7535.18, 15774.9 Yuan, received 170 donations from school's community. We purchased over 4000 surgery masks and shipped them to 3 hospitals in Wuhan & Yunnan.

- When the pandemic started in UK in March, RCS appealed the 2nd donation and raised and donated £1582 for NHS in the end of March. RCS also donated
500 masks for Parkside Family Practice
£1350.71 to Royal Berks Charity
200 masks to Oxford John Ratcliff Hospital
500 masks to Wexham Park Hospital
6000 masks to Chinese supermarket & Reading Chinese Churches.
- Because of the pandemic, face to face teaching became impossible. Our GCSE & A Level revision classes started teaching on Zoom from 2nd February 2020. RCS immediately organized internal training to all teachers how to teach online. Two weeks later the whole school move to Zooms. There were 23 students in our IGCSE class. The class never missed one single lesson, instead that they had an extra speaking lesson after Chinese New Year. On 16th May, all students had their speaking exam online, on 24th May they had their Listening/Reading/Writing exams online! They had finished their IGCSE course despite of disruption of the pandemic.
- RCS did not only move all teaching to Zooms. Our two extra-curricula's classes, dancing club & story club, were run during the pandemic, which really enriched students' life during the lockdown time.
- To cope with new demands of online teaching, RCS organized 3 internal teacher trainings. Some teachers also attended UKAPCE's teaching training. All staff constantly explored and shared online teaching tools. Every teacher soon has become 'broadcaster' on Zoom!
- RCS also organized students to take part in UK & World calligraphy, writing, recital & public speech competitions.
- Ms Hongmin Jiang & Ms Yanrong Zhang had been awarded 'UK Best Teachers of 2019'.

Future: We will continue to focus on how to ensure our students to be able to continue their learning despite of pandemic. We will also prepare combination of face to face & online teaching in the next couple of years.
