Report of the Trustees **for the year ended 31 December 2020**

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period ending 31 December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005.

The trustees have complied with the duty in section 17 of the 2011 Charities Act to have regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The main objectives of the Liaison Amani Children's Charity as stated in our governing document are:

1. The relief of marginalised and vulnerable youth in Tanzania particularly street children, through financial and other support for the provision of care and protection and support in their rehabilitation into family or community life.
2. The advancement of education for marginalised and vulnerable youth in Tanzania through financial support for their education or vocational training and the raising of the awareness of the public in the UK of the situation of street children in Tanzania.
3. The prevention and relief of poverty amongst families and communities in Tanzania through the protection and rehabilitation of vulnerable youth in that country.

Public benefit

The trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the period we continued with our specific long term project: raising funds to establish and run a brand new satellite centre in Singida, in connection with The Amani Children's Charity of Tanzania.

In July 2016, with our help, The Amani Children's Charity was able to open a brand new centre and has continued to welcome children in with open arms ever since.

Fundraising activities

During the current financial year there have been numerous fundraising activities.

Our main fundraiser was the bi-annual Liaison Corporate Days which raised funds totalling £4,499 during the period.

Another significant fundraiser was the Lockdown Lotto which raised funds totalling £1,328 during the period.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The principal funding source in the year was income from voluntary donations at 82% with income from fundraising events representing the remaining 18% of total income.

Reserves policy

The trustees have reviewed the charity's needs for reserves in accordance with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission.

Due to the nature of our activities & the fact that we have very little expenditure, it is not considered necessary to keep a specific reserve to cover expenses.

Our reserves currently stand at £7,417. We expect further grants to be made in due course.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year show a deficit of £10,117 due to the continued payment of grant monies during the period. Grant payments in excess of incoming resources has been possible due to the accumulated reserves build up from prior periods.

The expenditure for the period was £400 in relation to support costs and further grant monies totalling £49,500 being sent to The Amani Children's Home charity.

No expenses or remuneration was paid to any of the trustees.

FUTURE PLANS

The main fund raising activity in the 2021 financial year will be our bi-annual Liaison Corporate Days, which is taking place in August and November.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The governing document is the Liaison Amani Children's Charity Constitution adopted on 21 August 2015 which became recognised by the Charity Commission when the Charitable Incorporated Organisation was registered on 22 October 2015.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees must be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

At present the trustees do not currently anticipate the need to appoint any new trustees. The existing trustees possess all the skills and experience required to run the charity at this stage in its development. Should further skills be required in the future then the need for additional trustees will be reviewed.

Organisational structure

The trustees meet every month to consider the business of the charity. In addition to this, there is monthly telephone and email communication between the trustees regarding day to day operational matters.

Induction and training of new trustees

All Trustees work within the Liaison Group of companies, and as such they are aware of the charity and the demands prior to applying. Once accepted the new trustees are then invited to attend their first board meeting where they are formally appointed to the board.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities on a receipts basis.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on a payments basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.
