Trustees' Report 2025

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of Darut Taqwa for the year ended 31st August 2025. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and the financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements and the provisions of the Statements of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. CONSTITUTION

The charity was setup by a constitution on 12th August 2013 and is a registered charity (Number 1164134).

b. APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

The trustees are elected by a committee at a special meeting

A special meeting may be called to take place immediately after or before an ordinary meeting.

In selecting persons to be appointed as trustees, the Trustees shall take into account the benefits of appointing a person who is able by virtue of his or her personal or professional qualifications to make a contribution to the objects or the managements of the Charity.

c. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

The Board of Trustees provide continuous direction and support to the Charity and its staff.

d. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finance, and are satisfied that systems and procedures are in place to mitigate our exposures to major risk.

e. USE OF VOLUNTEERS

We use a number of volunteers throughout the year to help in both faith and community activities. The volunteers are mainly the mosque members, who are encouraged to share their skills and experiences where required. Together with the volunteers, the mosque trustees also give their time freely.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

1. The advancement of education through the provision of supplementary education classes, Islamic education including the teaching of the Urdu and Arabic language and by such other means as the trustees may determine.
2. To advance the Islamic religion in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'an and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings be upon him) and the Sahabah-e-Keraam (may Allah be please with them) according to the interpretation and accepted view of our august scholars of the Ahlus Sunnah wal jamaa-ah and as expounded by the salafus saaliheen (pious predecessors).
3. The promotion of religious and racial harmony for the public benefit by:
 - a. Promoting knowledge and mutual understanding between different racial and religious groups
 - b. Advancing education and raising awareness about different racial and religious groups to promote good relations between persons of different racial and religious groups
 - c. Working towards elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race or religion.
4. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their disability, gender or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

b. HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefits to those who worship at the mosque and the wider community of Accrington,

Prayers: The Mosque is open all day for daily and Friday prayers. During the week we have many people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 200 who regularly attend Friday prayers.

Education: An education faculty has been hired to enhance and deliver education to children and adults. The charity does not charge for this service.

Festivals: The Mosque prepares food during Ramadan for those attending our Mosque who wish to break their fast together.

Funeral Facilities: The Mosque provides a complete funeral service in line with the teachings of Islam. We relieve the deceased's bereaved relatives of the burden of organising burials.

Islamic council: The Mosque provides a Islamic Counselling Service to the whole community. Sub services within the council are conducting marriage ceremonies, divorce and guidance services, Wills and Inheritance services.

Hifz Classes: Memorisation of the Qur'an is considered an important element of religious education and training. We continue to provide this facility for the young people in the mosque.

Higher Islamic Education: we provide a comprehensive education service with a fully structured syllabus for advance Islamic studies to adults and children at our hired venue for free.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Darut Taqwa have throughout the year helped the advancement in Islamic knowledge for youths and adults in the local area and helped anybody wishing to learn about Islam. Various members of the community have come to Darut Taqwa to enquire about Islam, its ethos, seek advice and guidance from our team. We have also provided resources to the community through books, events, and general one to one advice. Throughout the year we have continued raising funds for the new Mosque Project which have mainly been from the local community. During the year the trustees and mosque committee have had a number of meetings to ensure that adequate financial controls are being followed by all members involved on a daily basis, with adequate procedures and rules.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. RESERVES POLICY

The free reserves are held to secure the long-term financial security of the charity. The trustees consider that this level of reserves is required to enable the charity to fulfil its obligations and commitments.

b. PRINCIPAL INCOME

The principal income is via local donations and contributions from the wider community.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

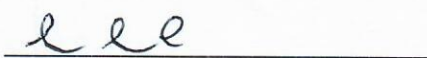
In March 2016 the New Mosque Project purchase and renovations began and was expected to finish in September 2021, However, due to covid restrictions some of the work has not been completed. Completion date has been set for around December 2026.

We have opened some of the centre for use.

The total renovation cost is expected to be approximately in excess of £1200000. This could go up as material costs and labour have drastically gone up since covid and building merchants are charging a lot more. In addition to this further expansion and purchase of the land adjacent to the building is under discussion.

The balance will be met from continuing donations by the mosque community.

Trustees' Report 2024

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of Darut Taqwa for the year ended 31st August 2024. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and the financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements and the provisions of the Statements of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. CONSTITUTION

The charity was setup by a constitution on 12th August 2013 and is a registered charity (Number 1164134).

b. APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

The trustees are elected by a committee at a special meeting

A special meeting may be called to take place immediately after or before an ordinary meeting.

In selecting persons to be appointed as trustees, the Trustees shall take into account the benefits of appointing a person who is able by virtue of his or her personal or professional qualifications to make a contribution to the objects or the managements of the Charity.

The Board of Trustees provide continuous direction and support to the Charity and its staff.

d. RISK MANAGEMENT

1. The advancement of education through the provision of supplementary education classes, Islamic education including the teaching of the Urdu and Arabic language and by such other means as the trustees may determine.
2. To advance the Islamic religion in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'an and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings be upon him) and the Sahabah-e-Keraam (may Allah be please with them) according to the interpretation and accepted view of our august scholars of the Ahlus Sunnah wal jamaa-ah and as expounded by the salafus saaliheen (pious predecessors).
3. The promotion of religious and racial harmony for the public benefit by:
 - a. Promoting knowledge and mutual understanding between different racial and religious groups
 - b. Advancing education and raising awareness about different racial and religious groups to promote good relations between persons of different racial and religious groups
 - c. Working towards elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race or religion.
4. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their disability, gender or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

b. HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefits to those who worship at the mosque and the wider community of Accrington,

Prayers: The Mosque is open all day for daily and Friday prayers. During the week we have many people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 200 who regularly attend Friday prayers.

Education: An education faculty has been hired to enhance and deliver education to children and adults. The charity does not charge for this service.

Festivals: The Mosque prepares food during Ramadan for those attending our Mosque who wish to break their fast together.

Funeral Facilities: The Mosque provides a complete funeral service in line with the teachings of Islam. We relieve the deceased's bereaved relatives of the burden of organising burials.

Islamic council: The Mosque provides a Islamic Counselling Service to the whole community. Sub services within the council are conducting marriage ceremonies, divorce and guidance services, Wills and Inheritance services.

Hifz Classes: Memorisation of the Qur'an is considered an important element of religious education and training. We continue to provide this facility for the young people in the mosque.

Higher Islamic Education: we provide a comprehensive education service with a fully structured syllabus for advance Islamic studies to adults and children at our hired venue for free.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Darut Taqwa have throughout the year helped the advancement in Islamic knowledge for youths and adults in the local area and helped anybody wishing to learn about Islam. Various members of the community have come to Darut Taqwa to enquire about Islam, its ethos, seek advice and guidance from our team. We have also provided resources to the community through books, events, and general one to one advice. Throughout the year we have continued raising funds for the new Mosque Project which have mainly been from the local community. During the year the trustees and mosque committee have had a number of meetings to ensure that adequate financial controls are being followed by all members involved on a daily basis, with adequate procedures and rules.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. RESERVES POLICY

The free reserves are held to secure the long-term financial security of the charity. The trustees consider that this level of reserves is required to enable the charity to fulfil its obligations and commitments.

b. PRINCIPAL INCOME

The principal income is via local donations and contributions from the wider community.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In March 2016 the New Mosque Project purchase and renovations began and was expected to finish in September 2021, However, due to covid restrictions some of the work has not been completed. Completion date has been set for around December 2026.

We have partially opened some of the centre.

The total renovation cost is expected to be approximately in excess of £1200000. This could go up as material costs have drastically gone up since covid and building merchants are charging a lot more. In addition to this further expansion and purchase of the land adjacent to the building in under discussion.

The balance will be met from continuing donations by the mosque community.

Trustees' Report 2023

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of Darut Taqwa for the year ended 31st August 2023. The Board of Trustees provide continuous direction and support to the Charity and its staff.

d. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finance, and are satisfied that systems and procedures are in place to mitigate our exposures to major risk.

e. USE OF VOLUNTEERS

We use a number of volunteers throughout the year to help in both faith and community activities. The volunteers are mainly the mosque members, who are encouraged to share their skills and experiences where required. Together with the volunteers, the mosque trustees also give their time freely.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

1. The advancement of education through the provision of supplementary education classes, Islamic education including the teaching of the Urdu and Arabic language and by such other means as the trustees may determine.
2. To advance the Islamic religion in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'an and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings be upon him) and the Sahabah-e-Keraam (may Allah be pleased with them) according to the interpretation and accepted view of our august scholars of the Ahlus Sunnah wal jamaa-ah and as expounded by the salafus saaliheen (pious predecessors).
3. The promotion of religious and racial harmony for the public benefit by:
 - a. Promoting knowledge and mutual understanding between different racial and religious groups
 - b. Advancing education and raising awareness about different racial and religious groups to promote good relations between persons of different racial and religious groups
 - c. Working towards elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race or religion.
4. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their disability, gender or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

b. HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefits to those who worship at the mosque and the wider community of Accrington,

Prayers: The Mosque is open all day for daily and Friday prayers. During the week we have many people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 200 who regularly attend Friday prayers.

Education: An education faculty has been hired to enhance and deliver education to children and adults. The charity does not charge for this service.

Festivals: The Mosque prepares food during Ramadan for those attending our Mosque who wish to break their fast together.

Funeral Facilities: The Mosque provides a complete funeral service in line with the teachings of Islam. We relieve the deceased's bereaved relatives of the burden of organising burials.

Islamic council: The Mosque provides a Islamic Counselling Service to the whole community. Sub services within the council are conducting marriage ceremonies, divorce and guidance services, Wills and Inheritance services.

Hifz Classes: Memorisation of the Qur'an is considered an important element of religious education and training. We continue to provide this facility for the young people in the mosque.

Higher Islamic Education: we provide a comprehensive education service with a fully structured syllabus for advance Islamic studies to adults and children at our hired venue for free.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Darut Taqwa have throughout the year helped the advancement in Islamic knowledge for youths and adults in the local area and helped anybody wishing to learn about Islam. Various members of the community have come to Darut Taqwa to enquire about Islam, its ethos, seek advice and guidance from our team. We have also provided resources to the community through books, events, and general one to one advice. Throughout the year we have continued raising funds for the new Mosque Project which have mainly been from the local community. During the year the trustees and mosque committee have had a number of meetings to ensure that adequate financial controls are being followed by all members involved on a daily basis, with adequate procedures and rules.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. RESERVES POLICY

The free reserves are held to secure the long-term financial security of the charity. The trustees consider that this level of reserves is required to enable the charity to fulfil its obligations and commitments.

b. PRINCIPAL INCOME

The principal income is via local donations and contributions from the wider community.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In March 2016 the New Mosque Project purchase and renovations began and was expected to finish in September 2021, However, due to covid restrictions some of the work has not been completed. Completion date has been set for around March 2026.

We have partially opened some of the centre.

The total renovation cost is expected to be approximately in excess of £900,000. This could go up as material costs have drastically gone up since covid and building merchants are charging a lot more. In addition to this further expansion and purchase of the land adjacent to the building in under discussion.

The balance will be met from continuing donations by the mosque community.

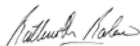

Trustees' Report 2022

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of Darut Taqwa for the year ended 31st August 2022. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and the financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements and the provisions of the Statements of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. CONSTITUTION

The charity was setup by a constitution on 12th August 2013 and is a registered charity (Number 1164134).

b. APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

The trustees are elected by a committee at a special meeting

A special meeting may be called to take place immediately after or before an ordinary meeting.

In selecting persons to be appointed as trustees, the Trustees shall take into account the benefits of appointing a person who is able by virtue of his or her personal or professional qualifications to make a contribution to the objects or the managements of the Charity.

c. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

The Board of Trustees provide continuous direction and support to the Charity and its staff.

d. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finance, and are satisfied that systems and procedures are in place to mitigate our exposures to major risk.

e. USE OF VOLUNTEERS

We use a number of volunteers throughout the year to help in both faith and community activities. The volunteers are mainly the mosque members, who are encouraged to share their skills and experiences where required. Together with the volunteers, the mosque trustees also give their time freely.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

1. The advancement of education through the provision of supplementary education classes, Islamic education including the teaching of the Urdu and Arabic language and by such other means as the trustees may determine.
2. To advance the Islamic religion in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'an and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings be upon him) and the Sahabah-e-Keraam (may Allah be please with them) according to the interpretation and accepted view of our august scholars of the Ahlus Sunnah wal jamaa-ah and as expounded by the salafus saaliheen (pious predecessors).
3. The promotion of religious and racial harmony for the public benefit by:
 - a. Promoting knowledge and mutual understanding between different racial and religious groups
 - b. Advancing education and raising awareness about different racial and religious groups to promote good relations between persons of different racial and religious groups
 - c. Working towards elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race or religion.
4. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their disability, gender or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

b. HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefits to those who worship at the mosque and the wider community of Accrington,

Prayers: The Mosque is open all day for daily and Friday prayers. During the week we have many people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 200 who regularly attend Friday prayers.

Education: An education faculty has been hired to enhance and deliver education to children and adults. The charity does not charge for this service.

Festivals: The Mosque prepares food during Ramadan for those attending our Mosque who wish to break their fast together.

Funeral Facilities: The Mosque provides a complete funeral service in line with the teachings of Islam. We relieve the deceased's bereaved relatives of the burden of organising burials.

Islamic council: The Mosque provides a Islamic Counselling Service to the whole community. Sub services within the council are conducting marriage ceremonies, divorce and guidance services, Wills and Inheritance services.

Hifz Classes: Memorisation of the Qur'an is considered an important element of religious education and training. We continue to provide this facility for the young people in the mosque.

Higher Islamic Education: we provide a comprehensive education service with a fully structured syllabus for advance Islamic studies to adults and children at our hired venue for free.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Darut Taqwa have throughout the year helped the advancement in Islamic knowledge for youths and adults in the local area and helped anybody wishing to learn about Islam. Various members of the community have come to Darut Taqwa to enquire about Islam, its ethos, seek advice and guidance from our team. We have also provided resources to the community through books, events, and general one to one advice. Throughout the year we have continued raising funds for the new Mosque Project which have mainly been from the local community. During the year the trustees and mosque committee have had a number of meetings to ensure that adequate financial controls are being followed by all members involved on a daily basis, with adequate procedures and rules.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. RESERVES POLICY

The free reserves are held to secure the long-term financial security of the charity. The trustees consider that this level of reserves is required to enable the charity to fulfil its obligations and commitments.

b. PRINCIPAL INCOME

The principal income is via local donations and contributions from the wider community.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In March 2016 the New Mosque Project purchase and renovations began and was expected to finish in September 2021, However, due to covid restrictions some of the work has not been completed. Completion date has been set for around March 2026.

We have partially opened some of the centre.

The total renovation cost is expected to be approximately in excess of £900,000. This could go up as material costs have drastically gone up since covid and building merchants are charging a lot more.

The balance will be met from continuing donations by the mosque community.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. CONSTITUTION

b. APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

c. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operation and finance, and are satisfied that systems and procedures are in place to mitigate our exposures to major risk.

e. USE OF VOLUNTEERS

We use a number of volunteers throughout the year to help in both faith and community activities. The volunteers are mainly the mosque members, who are encouraged to share their skills and experiences where required. Together with the volunteers, the mosque trustees also give their time freely.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

a. POLICIES AND OBJECTIVES

1. The advancement of education through the provision of supplementary education classes, Islamic education including the teaching of the Urdu and Arabic language and by such other means as the trustees may determine.
2. To advance the Islamic religion in accordance with the teachings of the Qur'an and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace & blessings be upon him) and the Sahabah-e-Keraam (may Allah be please with them) according to the interpretation and accepted view of our august scholars of the Ahlus Sunnah wal Jamaa-ah and as expounded by the salafus saaliheen (pious predecessors).
3. The promotion of religious and racial harmony for the public benefit by:
 - a. Promoting knowledge and mutual understanding between different racial and religious groups
 - b. Advancing education and raising awareness about different racial and religious groups to promote good relations between persons of different racial and religious groups
 - c. Working towards elimination of discrimination on the grounds of race or religion.
4. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other lelsure time occupation of Individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their disability, gender or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditons of life.

b. HOW OUR ACTIVITIES DELIVER PUBLIC BENEFIT, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefits to those who worship at the mosque and the wider community of Accrington,

Prayers: The Mosque is open all day for daily and Friday prayers. During the week we have many people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 100 who regularly attend Friday prayers.

Education: An education faculty has been hired to enhance and deliver education to children and adults. The charity does not charge for this service.

Festivals: The Mosque prepares food during Ramadan for those attending our Mosque who wish to break their fast together.

Funeral Facilities: The Mosque provides a complete funeral service in lline with the teachings of Islam. We relieve the deceased's bereaved relatives of the burden of organising burials.

Islamic council: The Mosque provides a Islamic Counselling Service to the whole community. Sub services within the council are conducting marriage ceremonies, divorce and guidance services, Wills and Inheritance services.

Hifz Classes: Memorisation of the Qur'an is considered an important element of religious education and training. We continue to provide this facility for the young people in the mosque.

Higher Islamic Education: we provide a comprehensive education service with a fully structured syllabus for advance Islamic studies to adults and children at our hired venue for free.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

Darut Taqwa have throughout the year helped the advancement in Islamic knowledge for youths and adults in the local area and helped anybody wishing to learn about Islam. Various members of the community have come to Darut Taqwa to enquire about Islam, its ethos, seek advice and guidance from our team. We have also provided resources to the community through books, events, and general one to one advice. Throughout the year we have continued raising funds for the new Mosque Project which have mainly been from the local community. During the year the trustees and mosque committee have had a number of meetings to ensure that adequate financial controls are being followed by all members involved on a daily basis, with adequate procedures and rules.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. RESERVES POLICY

The free reserves are held to secure the long-term financial security of the charity. The trustees consider that this level of reserves is required to enable the charity to fulfil its obligations and commitments.

b. PRINCIPAL INCOME

The principal income is via local donations and contributions from the wider community.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

a. FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

In March 2016 the New Mosque Project purchase and renovations began and was expected to finish in September 2021, However, due to covid restrictions some of the work has not been completed. Completion date has been set for around March 2022.

We have partially opened some of the centre.

The total renovation cost is expected to be approximately in excess of £900,000. This could go up as material costs have drastically gone up since covid and building merchants are charging a lot more.

The balance will be met from continuing donations by the mosque community.
