Promoting our sport locally to members of the public, including children and the disabled, supporting the physical education of young people through training and participation in recreational and competitive canoeing.

Club activities were severely restricted due to Covid 19
The club did manage to get away for the 4th time and headed to France for 10 days of whitewater paddling in the beautiful southern Alps. Staying at Camping des ecrins; Located in the town Argentière Bessée in the Ecrins National Park and near the Regional Park of Queyras, 12 club members enjoyed paddling rivers from grade 2 up to grade 4.
