Trustees' Report and Financial Statements to 31st March 2021

Presentation

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31st March 2021 which have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015), applicable accounting standards and the Charities Act 2011. This is partially due to the good management of Appleby Castle Ltd, which already makes parts of Appleby Castle open to the general public, usually free of charge, and provides a space in the castle and grounds for events to celebrate the year around in the town of Appleby-in-Westmorland.

Covid-19

Covid-19 has affected Appleby Castle in the same way as many venues. Much of the facilities are out of doors so residents of Appleby and its environs have continued to enjoy the grounds, however the charity has not been able to make a contribution.

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Responsibilities of the Trustees

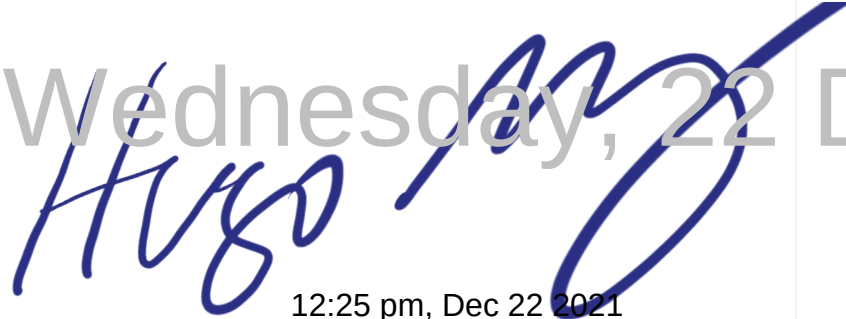

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
