The objects of the charity are, for the benefit of the public:

- 1 To relieve the suffering of hens in need of care and attention and, in particular, to provide and maintain rescue homes or other facilities for the reception, care and treatment of such hens.
- 2 To promote humane behaviour towards hens by providing appropriate care, protection, treatment and security for hens which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage
- 3 To educate the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering among hens

Under the charities legislation in England, Wales and Scotland the advancement of animal welfare is recognised as a distinct statutory charitable purpose. Ensuring the welfare of animals, preventing cruelty and relieving the suffering of animals has benefits for society as a whole.

It has been demonstrated that companion animals provide measurable benefits to people's physical and mental health. Our work benefits the public by providing hens to those who want to give them a good home and, as a consequence, companionship for individuals, families, institutions, the sick and the elderly.

Our educational benefit comes from providing an advice to those adopters inexperienced in hen keeping and information on how positive change can improve hen welfare. We aim to give balanced and constructive advice on animal welfare.

With Avian flu becoming more prominent over the last couple of years, the charity has to review its role when liaising with new farms, in informing the public and considering the potential impact on activities in the coming year.

The Trustees have read the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and have considered this when planning and executing activities during the relevant year and in planning for future years.


