Objectives and Activities

Summary of purpose

Vetwork UK's purpose is to engage in and promote activities and research that aim to bring balanced and sustainable benefit to human and non-human animals, eco-systems, and the whole of the natural environment, in UK and worldwide.

Vetwork UK currently carries out its charitable purpose primarily through educational activities, publication via its website, and occasional grant-making.

Summary of main activities

In the year from April 2024 to March 2025, Vetwork UK:

- Worked with Veterinary Prescriber, Pesticide Action Network and others to broaden understanding of the environmental risks of veterinary pharmaceuticals (eg NSAIDs in Vultures, pet parasiticides to local invertebrate), and broader threats to biodiversity and climate
- Worked to promote these messages with other local and national environmental organisations in Devon, Lancaster, London and Norfolk
- Worked to improve understanding of the energy costs underpinning these challenges
- Maintained its website to support these activities
- Continued to follow and support the activities of the RSPB vulture conservation project in SE Asia.

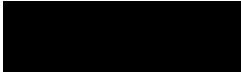

The principal purpose of the charitable company, as set out in its memorandum and articles of association, is to provide veterinary and animal welfare assistance to poorer communities and to provide management and technical support to animal health and welfare practitioners, from community to professional level, via training, education and publications

Summary of main activities

From April 2023 to March 2024, Vetwork UK has focused primarily on 'technical support to animal health and welfare practitioners, from community to professional level, via training, education and publications' in relation to One Welfare, and veterinary aspects of global biodiversity loss and climate change.

It has done this through the following activities: attending Restore Nature Now march; maintaining a website; educating members of the wider community (including owners of other animals) about veterinary aspects global biodiversity loss and climate change such as the environmental harms of parasiticides and other pharmaceuticals including Vulture related news through events and workshops; and subscription to Veterinary Prescriber.

SA continues to maintain links into various London organisations and activities, including Carbon Literacy and XR

Vetwork UK as an organisation continues to engage internationally around One Welfare eg with veterinary colleagues, UN IYRP (International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralism 2026, and UN IPBES (Inter-governmental Panel on Biodiversity and Environmental Services).

Summary of main activities

For Vetwork UK the year from April 2020 to March 2021 was dominated by two significant events:

Firstly the global Covid pandemic which impacted on activities in several ways including that no trustee meetings were held in person, all interaction was moved to online meetings and Jitsi was the platform of choice;

Secondly the recent separation from the LEGS project which meant that the work and direction that Vetwork takes has become much more open and flexible but likewise requires real debate and discussion regarding the path to follow particularly with increasing awareness of the global biodiversity loss and climate crisis, the place of livestock in our global future, the impacts of climate and societal change on other animal categories such as wildlife and companion animal care.

Due to these factors the year has seen a great deal of reorganisation of the charities objects and core funding which is ongoing.

Support to RSPB (Royal Society for the Protection of Birds)/ BNHS (Bombay Natural History Society) / Birdlife International Vulture Rehabilitation work. Following from previous years, the Charity continued to monitor progress and support through small grants the vulture rehabilitation work in India undertaken by the Bombay Natural History Society and the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds under the wider umbrella of Birdlife International.



