Para 1.20	<p>HCUK ran 9, one day regattas across the country as part of our traveller trophy series. We aim to spread them geographically to provide an opportunity for to participate. There were 68 entrants across the fleets, an increase from 52 last year - 8 Liberty's, 26 303 one-person, 24 303 2-person, and 10 2.3's. The class association is very inclusive and has a good representation of age, gender, culture, and disability participating.</p> <p>HCUK events are open to all, with or without a disability. The 4 fleets mean that people with all sorts of challenges can compete on level terms. Our sailors have varying degrees of physical disability, with some requiring motors to control the sails and steering to enable them to sail independently. We cater for deaf and blind sailors, as well as for people with a range of cognitive and neurodivergent conditions.</p> <p>The standard of sailing is also varied with the top end achieving podium positions at International events, and the bottom end being virtual novices. Our 2-person class also enables those who are unable to sail independently to take part with a buddy. The group are very welcoming and encouraging. This year we introduced a silver fleet competition for 2nd tier sailors.</p> <p>Most sailors require help in some way with transporting boats, rigging them, getting in/out (some with hoists). Some clubs provide a team of volunteers to provide this, others provide the support that they need themselves. HCUK do provide a rig of 6 boats to all events. This is specifically targeted at those who don't have access to a boat or the resources to facilitate their participation. We have fantastic volunteers</p>

		<p>who manage the rig for us. The wider volunteer community who are involved find their roles rewarding and enjoyable, but a lot of hard work. All rig boats were booked for every event.</p> <p>The National Championships were held at Whitefriars Sailing Club and attracted 32 entries. This is open to people from other nations and in 2024 we had 2 Dutch sailors and one person from Ireland. There were 32 entrants. Between the Traveller series and the National Championships, sailors from 15 different clubs were involved.</p> <p>The class association helps to provide a pathway and inspires sailors to develop and get more involved. In 2024 there was a well-attended training camp which was run in conjunction with the RYA who largely funded the event and provided a highly regarded performance coach.</p> <p>HCUK support some international events, providing on-water support and coaching. In 2024 the European Championships were in the Netherlands. A team of sailors and volunteers with 2 coaches and 2 RIBs facilitated 18 entrants. In the Liberty class the UK had a European Champion. A team of 6 are booked to go to the World Championships in March 2025, taking place in Australia, also supported by HCUK.</p>



Hansa Class UK Annual Report

January 1st – December 31st 2023

Another successful year for Hansa Class UK. Following the success of introducing paid membership in 2022, the practice was continued in 2023. In 2023 there were 87 full members and 37 associate members. The organisation remains in a financially sound position as evidenced in the annual accounts.

Over the season there were 9 Traveller Trophy events, unfortunately one was cancelled due to bad weather. There were 52 different crews taking part with sailors from different clubs taking part. The rig which transports 6 303s to all events continues to be a huge asset, enabling people to attend who don't have access to a boat or who can't transport them.

The National Championships was held over 3 days at Rutland Water and attracted 37 sailors from across the country. The HCUK AGM was held for members during the event.

In conjunction with the RYA, HCUK provided a 3-day training event at Rutland water in the week running up to the National Championships. These were well attended and provided good preparation for ParaWorld sailors who took part in a World Sailing event at the Hague, as well as the team who would travel to Portimao for the Hansa World Championships in October. A second training event was run by HCUK in conjunction with the Andrew Simpson Foundation at Chesil and was attended by 13 sailors.

HCUK helped 21 sailors of varying abilities to compete in the World Championships by organising the transportation of 16 boats, coordinating fundraising activities, providing coaching and support on the water, as well as supporting a number of volunteers to help sailors on shore. It was a mammoth task which was made possible by a huge team effort; over £20k was raised. The team had some great success on the water as well, with Rory McKinna finishing 3rd in a fleet of 87 303 one-person sailboats and Paul Phillips coming 2nd in the 17 boat Liberty fleet.

At the AGM in 2021 it was agreed that a membership fee would be introduced for the class association in March 2022. A link was set up on the HCUK website where people could complete their registration and pay. Two levels of membership were available, full membership with voting rights, and associate membership for those who just wanted to be kept informed. It was made a condition that sailors who wanted to compete in HCUK events must be a full member. The exception to this was for sailors who would only sail at their home club's event, they were only required to be an associate member. The cost for full membership was £10, associate membership was free. In 2022 there were 102 full members and 36 associate members.

During the winter HCUK continued to run Virtual Regatta events which were supported by a zoom meeting for those who wanted to get involved with the banter. Not only is this quite useful for tactics and knowledge of rules, it is a good fun forum to keep regular contact with a few from the community.

A full programme of 10 Traveller events was put together. Unfortunately, because of damage to the pontoon facilities at Oxford SC that event had to be cancelled. The remaining 9 events all took place as planned and were well attended. Building on the inclusion of Birmingham SC in 2 fun regattas in 2021, they successfully hosted their first TT event, albeit in difficult circumstances due to low water levels following a drought. Over the season, 54 boats took part in one or more of the regattas: 7 2.3s; 21 303 1-person; 15 303 2-person; and 11 Libertys.

The HCUK National Championships took place at Carsington Sailing Club 17th-19th June. Numbers were still slightly impacted by the pandemic, seeing 29 boats entered across all the fleets. There were a few travelling sailors from Ireland, Scotland, the Netherlands, Oman, Singapore, and from Australia. The host club put on a very well organized 3 days, with all 8 races completed.

We were very fortunate to have crossed paths with an Olympic performance coach who discovered Hansa sailing. Pete Conway offered his time and knowledge to attend all of the events to share his wisdom, taking pre sailing briefings, followed up debriefings on zoom. This has been invaluable and the standard of sailing in all fleets improved.

The Hansa World Championships 2023 will be held in Portimao, Portugal. HCUK would like to support a team of sailors of all levels to attend. This will require significant fundraising, and initial conversations have started to galvanise interest and enthusiasm amongst the team.

At the AGM Ron Sawford announced that he would like to reduce his involvement with the class association, with somebody else taking on his duties. Ron formed the class association in 1999 and has been instrumental in its growth and smooth running ever since. Ron's position will be hard to fill as he has worked tirelessly above and beyond his position as Secretary. We are very grateful for all that he has done for all of our members over the years.

Over the winter months at the start and end of 2021, Hansa Class UK continued running Virtual Regatta events for those who were interested, meeting simultaneously on zoom. This gave people an opportunity to interact out of season, and keep their hand in with sailing tactics and strategies. We regularly attracted up to 18 sailors who enjoyed the competition and banter.

The start of 2021 saw the start of the vaccination programme and continued uncertainty over restrictions on movements and gatherings. With many volunteers and sailors being vulnerable, many clubs remained cautious. We put together a speculative programme of events, outlining necessary assessments and adjustments that could be made so that risks were minimised for participants and volunteers. Only two of the planned events had to be cancelled, meaning that 8 Traveller events took place, although some opted for slightly modified formats to make them more manageable. In total 71 sailors took part over the series.

July 31st to the 1st August saw the return to the Hansa National Championships at Rutland Sailing Club. Numbers were slightly down on pre pandemic seasons, with 30 boats attending. Competition was fierce across the fleets, but off the water there was a good opportunity to start enjoying distanced socialising again. To avoid close contact the AGM was carried out by zoom later in August. This format appears to be more inclusive and popular, not interfering with proceedings at the event, hence it was decided to adopt this approach for 2022. A key outcome from the AGM was the decision to introduce a membership fee of £10 which would be implemented from March 2022.

Over the season we ran 3 Fun Regattas aimed at new sailors and volunteers to get into Hansas in a less competitive environment. One event was run at Whitefriars, with two more being held at a new venue for us, the Midland Sailing Club in Birmingham. This was a collaboration between the club, RYA coaching, and Hansa providing the boats.

The Hansa van and 6 boat rig was used throughout the season to great effect. Sailors who have found it difficult to get boats to events, or who don't own their own boats were able to participate. We are very grateful to the volunteers who transported the boats, and to those who helped with the rigging and loading.

The pandemic continued to affect travel throughout 2021, and a decision was made to not support a GB team to attend the Hansa World Championships in Palermo, Sicily. It was deemed to be too much of a risk regarding the necessary investment for the transportation of boats. However, closer to the event, World Sailing agreed to transport the boats to help with their development programme. This enabled some GB sailors to attend, and achieve 2 podium places; Rory McKinna was 3rd in the 303 fleet, as was Paul Philips in a Liberty.

2020 turned out to be a very strange year as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic, and also because of the announcement that our Chairman, Bob Scull would have to step down because of ill health. We are very grateful for everything that he achieved in delivering and managing the van and 6 boat rig which will enable us to make events more accessible for those who have difficulty with travel.

The year started as usual with a full programme of Traveller Trophy events planned for England and Scotland, as well as our National Championships and representation in the RYAs Multiclass regatta. In addition Fun regattas were planned in conjunction with several clubs, supported by the RYA. The purpose of these events was to introduce new sailors to racing in a relaxed environment alongside volunteers to familiarise them with the boats. The Hansa Class World Championships were planned for October in Los Angeles, USA, and we were developing plans for how we would support UK sailor's participation.

Even before the UK went into its first lockdown it was announced that the World Championships had been cancelled. This was as a result of problems with harbour management at the proposed venue. The Hansa Class were well represented at the RYAs Sailability Conference in February in order to keep abreast of strategic plans and developments. In March we manned a stand at the Dinghy Show which was held at Alexandra Palace, which gave us an opportunity to engage with several clubs and individuals who were interested in developing their sailing using the Hansa range of boats. We prepared materials which outlined the planned programme of events. It was at this event that we agreed a sponsorship arrangement with GUL which would provide prizes in the form of vouchers for prize winners at our events. We were looking forward to developing this mutually beneficial relationship.

At the end of March the first lockdown was announced. The early events had to be cancelled straightaway. As it became clear that activity was going to be curtailed for some time, the committee discussed ways of engaging with our members, many of whom are vulnerable and had to remain shielded. We ran a series of Virtual Regatta events whilst engaging on Zoom. These proved to be popular and continued throughout the summer, autumn, and winter. In addition we ran art/photography competitions. We are very grateful to GUL for honouring the sponsorship arrangement which provided prizes for these online events, and to Yachts and Yachting for publishing the reports.

Our Committee continued to meet via Zoom to discuss how to proceed throughout, but as the season progressed it became clear that restrictions would prevent physical events from taking place. We held our AGM via Zoom, and David Durston was accepted as the new Chairman to replace Bob, whilst Paul Phillips took on the role of Treasurer and Trustee of Hansa Class UK.

Hoping for restrictions to be lifted in 2021, the end of 2020 saw discussions and planning for the next season; considering how changes could be made to enable regattas to take place in some form, ensuring the safety of all involved. We appreciate the continued involvement of volunteers from all the Clubs who host our events and who helped us to develop a full programme for 2021 with conditions put in place to address the issues raised following a full risk assessment.
