The use of the bells for their charitable purpose depends on having visiting ringers and a local band of ringers. We have agreement with the Council relating to ongoing access to, and use of, the bells at all reasonable times together with facilitating the training of new ringers and fostering its success (involving promotion in church publications, notices, the church website and in relevant meetings). We also have agreement in relation to the showing of recorded audio/video content in the church and some practical aspects of this. The main part of this is structured educational material on the history of bells and change ringing and the practical aspects of how bells are rung. Multiple languages can be involved. The required arrangements for tower trips for visitors have also been discussed and agreed in principle, although insurance and health and safety considerations apply. The Council remains enthusiastic about the bells and we are satisfied with the undertakings given by them.</p> |
