(a) For the public benefit, the promotion of equality and diversity on the grounds of sexual orientation or gender identity, through the awarding of grants to organizations (including charitable organisations) within England and Wales who are:

(iii) Promoting activities to foster an understanding in relation to issues surrounding sexual orientation or gender identity;

(iv) conducting or commissioning research on equality or diversity in relation to issues surrounding sexual orientation or gender identity, and publishing the results to the public; and

(v) Cultivating a sentiment in favor of equality and diversity in relation to persons who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or intersex.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

As a small grant giving and grant receiving trust, we continue to keep our operating costs to a minimum. We work to ensure the financial support that we award makes a real difference to as many people as possible and across a range of different challenges, especially as we continue to witness even greater intolerance, repression, and hardship here and across the world. We take great care considering where funding will have the maximum impact and are also mindful of the need for a long-term approach in supporting some projects, research, organisations and events to enhance and protect the rights of LGBT+ people, awareness and support for cancer, notably Sarcoma. We will continue to abide by these principles as we continue throughout the years ahead.

The Trustees are aware of the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and have borne this in mind when making grants during the year.

The Trustees consider each application in accordance with the stated objectives of the Trust and mindful of the limited financial resources the Trust narrow their focus in the early years to diversity and inclusion and its wider social realm.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

The projects and organizations that we have supported on this year are:

**LGBTQI homelessness; The Albert Kennedy Trust** is tireless in supporting LGBTQI homeless people (over 25% of youth homeless are LGBTQ+) and we were delighted to award them a grant for their Christmas appeal.

**Cancer diagnosis and treatment** can be overwhelming, so we are continuing our work with **Sarcoma UK** with our three-year commitment to their services, supporting and advising individuals and their families affected by these rare cancers.

We were proud to have established the **Paul Cottingham Scholarship** at the **University of Brighton**. This Masters scholarship was developed to help promote gender diversity in higher education and society, and to contribute to Social Research related to trans experiences, rights and to challenge institutional negativity in wider debates about gender. Building on our relationship with the university we have established a PhD to further develop understanding relating to sexual and gender(ed) diversities. **The PhD proposal** is underway and a post graduate in place.

**Mosaic LGBTQ+ young persons' trust** offers a vital lifeline to LGBTQ+ young persons, many of whom experience family rejection, faith conflicts, and a lack of culturally competent support. The Paul Cottingham Trust will fund their **Resilient Minds** project, an initiative that will provide tailored, trauma informed mental health support to 48 LGBTQ+ young persons aged 12-18, who face significant challenges including social isolation, identity related distress and mental health struggles.

**The Free Shop** is a community lead project reaching extremely vulnerable families. Their work is currently focused on Lebanon where they are working to prevent and relieve poverty amongst families living in the Bekaa valley. They support over 26,000 individuals every year with clothing, food packs, and free menstrual health products. They also undertake individual case work, provide a menstrual health project and a free shop - a physical space where people browse, access clothes, shoes, bedding, hygiene items toys and more with freedom of choice.

**Ditch the Label** is a small UK wide charity providing an essential lifeline for children and young people aged 12-25 aimed at reducing the impact and prominence of bullying. All their support services, accessed through their website, are led by a clinical education psychologist and are completely free for young people to access, available with little to no waiting times, and can accommodate ongoing support where needed. Many of those who use their services live in the 20% most deprived neighborhoods in the country.

**Inspire LGBTQ+ (It Gets Better)** provide LGBTQ+ young people with hope and offers them examples of what life can look like for LGBTQ+ people and what they can achieve. They work across the UK delivering their message of strength and resilience both at local Pride events and workshops, and also online in the digital space. Interventions aim to allow young LGBTQ+ people to speak about and seek support around

issues they have faced. They also serve to support them to increase their confidence, resilience, and mental wellbeing whilst at the same time building a local support network around them.

**SPECTRA** offer community-based health and wellbeing services that aim to reduce stigma and improve the health and confidence of those who reach out to them. Their community led services are free at the point of access and include; Health advocacy and casework for trans, gender diverse and sex worker communities, sexual health education for neurodiverse, SEND young people and their carers, community-based HIV testing, outreach and education, sexual health and LGBTQ+ education for carers, teachers and healthcare staff. Additionally, there is Peer led counselling, social groups, mentoring and art therapy for trans adults, and mentoring and social groups for LGBTQIA+ young adults. Trans-specific services reach around 900 people per year.

**LGBTQI refugees and asylum seekers** through **Micro Rainbow** who offer help and accommodation throughout the year in their hostels in the UK. The charity also supported **Neighbours in Poplar's** outreach work in Calais.

**LGBTQI homelessness; The Albert Kennedy Trust** are tireless in supporting LGBTQI homeless people (over 25% of youth homeless are LGBT+) and the charity were delighted to award them a grant for their Christmas appeal.

**Outpatients** is the UK's only LGBTQI+ cancer charity, proudly led by and for LGBTQI+ people affected by cancer and work hard to support and advocate for the community. They advise and support national health bodies to write inclusive policy, strategy, best practice guidelines and campaigns. They work closely with LGBTQI cancer charities to create a holistic approach to improving the LGBTQI's community's care and represent LGBTQI voices and experiences in national government and NHS meetings, working in the UK and beyond to make sure no-one is left behind.

**Cancer diagnosis and treatment** can be overwhelming, so charity is continuing their work with **Sarcoma UK** with a three-year commitment to their services, supporting and advising individuals and their families affected by these rare cancers.

The charity is proud to have established the **Paul Cottingham PhD Scholarship** at the **University of Brighton**. The scholarship will provide a talented researcher with financial support and access to world-class resources to develop a project focusing on trans and non-binary inclusion within the broad remit of supporting health, wellbeing, and dignity in health and social care. It will be awarded to a candidate who is committed to making a difference to the wider trans community and will provide a unique opportunity for in-depth research that can explore the issues and opportunities for trans people.

The trustees tribute to three of their great friends who sadly died; the irreplaceable and unforgettable (Baroness) Glenys Kinnock, Paul O'Grady and (Baroness) Margaret McDonagh. In their memory the charity have supported **Together in Dementia** and **University College Hospital** work on Glioblastoma.


