Humber conservation volunteers (HCV) has continued to support projects for the benefit of the public.

HCV continues to work closely with Total Linsey Oil refinery ( when pandemic restrictions allow) on annual maintenance of Burkinshaws Covert woodland. Although this land is not open to the public it provides a much-needed conduit for the area's flora and fauna.

The winter/spring saw HCV finish the memorial wood in Goxhill where one resident wanted to create a haven in their local environment to remember her husband. The work included the planting of 200 trees and over seventy metres of native hedge row.

One project which was started in the autumn and will continue when restrictions allow in the spring of 2021 is the building of an outside class room in the form of a round house at Tealby school.



