REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2025

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2025. The trustees have prepared the accounts on a receipts and payments basis.

Principal Activities and Objectives

The Bourne Foundation supports students of The Bourne Academy with enrichment activities to enhance their education and provide access to opportunities that might not otherwise be possible. The Foundation supports the Academy with projects that are not funded through government sources.

Main activities undertaken to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit

The year end 31 August 2025 has been another successful year for the Foundation, and it has been able to continue to support The Academy with a range of projects.

Income, totaling £36,155 (2024 - £27,155), has been raised through grants and donations, with the following grants obtained:

- £10,000 from Alice Cooper Dean Foundation, £3,500 from BCP Council, £2,600 from the Hedley Foundation and £1,170 from 7 Stars towards the work the Academy carries out with Young Carers.
- £7,500 from the Valentine Trust, £5,000 from the Baily Thomas Charitable Fund and £3,656 from the Friends of Canford School to support the setting up and running of a new sensory room.
- £1,125 from Groundwork UK (via Tesco) as an initial 75% of a grant towards the Breakfast Club run by the Academy for disadvantaged students.


The remainder of income was raised through small donations and various events held at The Bourne Academy during the year.

Grants totaling £17,451 (2024 - £35,000) have been made to The Bourne Academy during the year as follows:

- £11,156 towards the set up and running costs of the Sensory room within the Academy's new Link building.
- £4,670 to support trips and activities for the Academy's Young Carers
- £1,125 to support the costs of the Academy's breakfast club
- £500 to purchase a new iPad for the Academy's Performing Arts department.

At 31 August 2025 the Foundation had reserves of £23,228 (2024 - £4,524). £17,600 of the reserves are restricted funds, all of which will be paid over to The Bourne Academy to be spent in accordance with the funding provisions. The remaining £5,628 of reserves are unrestricted funds (2024 – all funds were unrestricted). The Foundation has a reserve policy to keep a level of £5,000 of unrestricted funds available to support The Bourne Academy with any urgent funding requests.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BOURNE FOUNDATION

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under Section 145 of the 2011 Act
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under Section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act); and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis.

Basis of preparation

The Bourne Foundation is a charity registered in England and Wales (Charity number: 1165790). It has no share capital. The registered office is The Bourne Academy, Hadow Road, Bournemouth, BH10 5HS. Its principal activities are to advance the education of students attending The Bourne Academy (Bournemouth), through funding activities and projects and providing facilities or equipment which support The Academy in educating its students.

Income

All income is recognised in Receipts and Payments once the charity has received funds.

Expenditure

All payments are recognised in the Receipts and Payments Accounts when it is paid.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used only on the projects stated.

2. STAFF COSTS, TRUSTEES' REMUNERATION AND BENEFITS

There were no employees during the year or prior year.

There have been no remuneration or expenditure paid to the trustees during the year or prior year.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2023

The Bourne Foundation supports students of The Bourne Academy with enrichment activities to enhance their education and provide access to opportunities that might not otherwise be possible.

The year to 31 August 2023 has been a quieter year for the Foundation, but the level of grants made to support The Bourne Academy have been increased.

Income, totalling £7,971 (2022 - £24,462) has been raised through grants and donations, with the following grants obtained:

- £1,750 from Bauer Radio to support projects for Young Carers at The Bourne Academy
- £1,515 from Dorset Council to improve facilities on The Bourne Academy's outdoor education site.
- £2,500 one-off donation plus gift aid to support Greenpower activities at The Bourne Foundation
- £984 from Canford School for general purposes

The remainder of income was raised through small donations and various events held at The Bourne Academy during the year.

Grants totalling £42,470 (2022 - £30,250) have been made to The Bourne Academy during the year as follows:

- £27,000 to purchase 360 musical instruments to commence the Academy's Andrew Lloyd Webber Music in Secondary School Trust programme that started in September 2023.
- £10,000 to support the employment of a Safeguarding Frontliner to continue to assist with the increased safeguarding workload seen at The Academy.
- £2,500 to support the Academy's Greenpower programme
- £1,750 to support projects with Young Carer's at the Bourne Academy
- £1,220 to provide fencing around the lake at the Academy's outdoor education site.

At 31 August 2023 the Foundation had reserves of £12,369 (2022 - £46,868). All of the reserves held at the year end were unrestricted general reserves.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

The Bourne Foundation supports students of The Bourne Academy with enrichment activities to enhance their education and provide access to opportunities that might not otherwise be possible.

The year to 31 August 2021 has been an exciting year for the Foundation with a significant increase in income as a result of a one off substantial donation and associated gift aid.

Income, totalling £63,947 (2020 - £20,693) this year has been mainly made through grants and donations, with the following grants obtained:

- £10,000 grant from the Alice Cooper Dean Foundation to support the cost of a Safeguarding Frontliner at the Bourne Academy
- £7,500 grant from the Southern Coop to support ELSA projects at The Bourne Academy
- £36,000 one off donation plus £9,000 gift aid to purchase musical instruments for Year 7 and 8 students at The Bourne Academy as part of the Music in Secondary Schools Trust (MiSST) programme.
- £1,447 raised through small donations and various events held at The Bourne Academy during the year.

Grants totalling £19,840 (2020 - £14,938) have been made to The Bourne Academy during the year as follows:

- £7,500 to support ELSA work with small groups of students
- £10,000 to support the cost of employing a Safeguarding Frontliner to assist with an increased safeguarding workload as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- £1,600 to provide additional lockers for students to store cycle helmets during the day.
- £740 to support the cost of breakfasts to disadvantaged students.

The £36,000 donation for music instruments is planned to be granted to the Academy over the next two financial years to support the purchase of 360 musical instruments as the MiSST programme is brought in from September 2023.

At 31 August 2021 the Foundation had reserves of £52,656 (2020 - £8,549). Of these £45,000 was restricted for the MiSST programme at the Academy with the remaining £7,656 (2020 - £6,949) being unrestricted funds. The Trustees plan to support small projects each year at the Bourne Academy, but are also trying to increase the level of unrestricted reserves held in order to support larger projects.
