Liaise closely with parents to gain their support and inform them of their child's ongoing progress. Provide additional activities and visits to enhance our curriculum and offer a malaria prevention program.

Trustees have kept in mind the guidance offered by the Charity Commission to ensure that plans and actions match our agreed objectives. The main activities undertaken this year were: Several fundraising activities have taken place in the UK including a Race Night, Teas for Tourists in Avebury and recruiting new members to our 200 Club direct debit scheme. Various presentations have been given in the UK to spread the word about aims and achievements to schools and other interested groups. All trustees visited the schools in January. On a daily basis the trustees receive photographs and videos via social media of the days activities and progress of the children. The trustees continue to submit grant applications for further funding to support our work. An annual shipment of resources was sent in August to replenish equipment and extend provision

Additional funds are sent via Western Union when required. Funds gradually build up during the year following our visit and Trustees ensure that funds are available before the following year's visit through fundraising, 200 Club receipts, personal donations and grant applications so a healthy bank balance is maintained. As we have no overheads, a reserve is not vital. Our challenge is to ensure we have sufficient funds by December of each year for the current budgets required to support our schools at the beginning of the next year
