Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

In partnership with Harvest Apostolic ministries, Bihar, we were able to train 18 ladies in sewing. In the month of June six of them successfully completed their training under the Train the Trainers (T3) programme, graduate and were gifted with a sewing machine and under the Empowering Ladies (EL) programme 12 ladies also successfully completed their training, graduate and were gifted with a sewing machine.

In partnership with Youth With A Mission, Brussels in the month of August we were able to provide training.

In partnership with a local church in Hyderabad, SILAI (Tailoring Training for women) we were able to see sixteen ladies complete their year long sewing training and graduate. Each of the ladies were gifted with a sewing machine to earn some income.

In partnership with New Creation Church, New Delhi we were able to facilitate a youth camp for 40 in Patiala, Punjab.

In partnership with Harvest Apostolic ministries, Bihar, we were able to start 3 projects in three villages namely Taari Barna, fourteen ladies, Kadamtola, eight ladies and Falka ten ladies are attending the sewing classes.
