The school is not currently receiving financial help from their government. Their salary is dependent on fees paid from individual donations and fund raising. A substantial consignment of clothing, books, and toys was delivered for distribution to both children and adults in the community, with the aim of alleviating poverty. One laptop was also sent to benefit the school</p> <p>Jamaica: Funds were not available to support Jamaica in this year.</p>
