Northern Prophetic School of Supernatural Ministry was founded to contribute to the vision of the region of Teesside being transformed by the life, love and power of Jesus Christ. It does this by training adult students to live in a greater awareness of the Kingdom of God and to see its borders extended through a normal, Biblical, supernatural lifestyle.

Meeting for thirty-three Thursday evenings a year, the School emphasises hands-on training and experience along with academic understanding. This creates a 'learn and apply' culture in which students are encouraged to take risks, become used to having their faith stretched and grow in their understanding of God's ways. To this end, as the students grow in confidence they are given opportunities to move out of the 'safety' of the classroom and to take part in weekend outreaches on the streets of Stockton-on-Tees and elsewhere. In these sessions students primarily seek out unchurched people and bring the Biblical gifts of the Holy Spirit to bear on their understanding of God's love and their own destiny.

### **Management**

The Board of Governors meet quarterly or more often as required, to review the progress of the School and agree on future actions to ensure its continued success and ethical conduct. A 2nd-year student, selected by the student body, is invited to attend Board meetings as a non-voting student representative. Week-on-week leadership and management continues in the hands of Julia Powell, who has been employed as the Director of the School since May 2018. Operation of the School is facilitated by a number of volunteers who lead small groups, teach, lead worship and take on other practical tasks. The School principally uses teaching materials developed by Bethel Church of Redding, California, USA and also invites input from visiting speakers.

There is an ongoing declaration of interest, namely that one of the Trustees is the husband of the School's paid Director.

### **External Relationships**

The School relates to a wide range of Christian churches in the NorthEast of England, whose leaders endorse students' applications for the course.

Running part-time training courses which encourage and help people in churches, on the street, and in their daily lives.

### **Trustee Changes during the report period**

Keith Mallard and Zara Metcalfe-Zaman were welcomed to the Trustees on 4 October 2024 and 28 June 2025 respectively.

### **Achievements**

In this its ninth year, the School had ten 1<sup>st</sup>-year Students (six of whom graduated) and five 2<sup>nd</sup>-year Students, all graduating.

Public outreaches were held in Stockton (three times), Newby, Durham, Middlesborough, Yarm and Saltburn; the students gained confidence in speaking about faith in Jesus, praying with people, and seeking God for some specific messages of encouragement for people.

On four occasions the School responded to invitations from local churches to 'take over' one of their meetings in order to minister to their members and to model an expectancy that God wants to heal and to speak directly into people's lives.

The School continued its monthly routine of learning to minister in the gifts of the Holy Spirit, public worship, and meeting in small groups for encouragement and accountability. The monthly component continued in which Students were taught and given practical exercises to learn how to use the Bible well and avoid its misuse.

2nd Year students and some leaders were also involved in the 'Seed Money' project which they were given a small amount of money and used their faith and skills to turn it into more.

We had UK-based guest speakers throughout the school year, each bringing teaching complementary to the Bethel Curriculum.

Open worship nights were held on the last Thursday of each month in which Students were able to use their spiritual gifts to facilitate many significant encounters between God and our guests.

### **Financing**

As a Charity the School is able to accept donations which may be Gift-Aided. Student fees are payable in full at the beginning of the academic year or by the end of the first term. A discount structure is offered for early booking and for household members taking the course together.

As shown on the last page of this report, the year showed a loss despite continued success in keeping costs down. As in the previous year, the Second Year Students were each given £20 'seed money', encouraged to invest it, and bring back what they made.

In May 2025 the bank balance fell to the point where the Treasurer had to write to our employee, School Director Julia Powell. She was warned that the Charity might not be able to pay her in full and that it was hoped that shortfalls would be recompensed as soon as possible. This was graciously received, though it turned out that we were able to pay her in full for the remainder of this report period.

John Kumpalume ACCA continued to be engaged as the School's accountant, but stood down toward the end of the report period as our newest Trustee will bring her accounting experience to the School.

### **Future**

Rev. Julian Blakeley gave notice that he would cease to serve as Trustee later in 2025. Denise and Andrew Waugh also signalled their intention to hand over their respective Treasurer and Chair functions during the coming financial year (25-26). This news came simultaneously with an idea from the other leaders, namely that the School could be merged with "The Called", a church in Stockton-on-Tees attended by most of the School's remaining leadership team. The Charity would then be renamed accordingly to take into account its wider range of activities. This direction of travel was approved at the last Trustees' meeting of this report period. As a first step, a new Trustee who will take over the Treasurer role was approved at that same meeting, and other potential new Trustees were identified.

This year a new monthly component was added in which Students were taught and given practical exercises to learn how to use the Bible well and avoid its misuse.

2nd Year students and some leaders were also involved in the 'Seed Money' project which they were given a small amount of money and used their faith and skills to turn it into more. Once again this was really successful in raising money for NPSSM.

We had UK-based guest speakers throughout the school year, each bringing teaching complementary to the Bethel Curriculum.

In addition to the joy of seeing all Students graduate in front of many un-churched friends and relatives, a meal was served by one of our ex-Students with excellence in the cooking and the presentation. ### **Trustee Changes during the report period**

We were pleased to welcome Stan Johnson as a Trustee in July 2022. Stan is Lead Pastor of Rivers Of Life Church, Stockton-on-Tees. Having served as a Trustee since the School's inception, the Rev. Mark Miller stepped down as a Trustee in October 2022 due to taking on wider Diocesan commitments. Mark remains a good friend of the School and allowed the School's use of his church's facilities for two outreach events during the year.

### **Achievements**

The School had ten 1<sup>st</sup>-year Students and seven 2<sup>nd</sup>-year students. It was an exceptional year. Two students were part of the leadership team already and of the other 5 students, 4 have remained and joined the School's leadership team.

The 2nd year students were asked to organise the outreaches for the year. This produced some new ideas: Christmas Fair at Stockton Parish Church and an outdoor Summer Fair in Stockton Parish Gardens – this allowed for a prayer tent and a dream interpretation table. The Valentine's Day flower give-away in Darlington was also a big success and was a good start for students unused to street outreach.

2nd Year students and some leaders were also involved in Seed Money. Once again this was really successful in raising money for NPSSM.

Dream Interpretation classes were held in Lingdale and Scarborough, with many people finding spiritual help and guidance.

We had UK-based guest speakers throughout the school year, each bringing teaching complementary to the Bethel Curriculum.

A highlight of the year was again the Graduation evening in June. In addition to the joy of seeing all Students graduate in front of many un-churched friends and relatives, a meal was served by one of our ex-Students with excellence in the cooking and the presentation. This year a charge was made for guests to attend. Half of this income was donated to a Christian child-feeding charity in Burundi with whom our ex-Student caterer has strong links.

Open worship nights were held on the last Thursday of each month in which Students were able to use their spiritual gifts to facilitate many significant encounters between God and our guests.

'NPSSM on Tour' was a nickname for two events in which the School 'took over' public meetings held by churches in Middlesbrough and Lingdale. Again, faith was deepened in those who received ministry as well in the Students themselves.

### **Financing**

As a Charity the School is able to accept donations which may be Gift-Aided. Student fees are payable in full at the beginning of the academic year or by the end of the first term. A discount structure is offered for early booking and for household members taking the course together.

The financial year saw income down a little on the previous year, but (in a time of inflation) costs were also kept down. This year was a financial turning-point, in that the School broke even without the help of one couple who have made significant gifts in previous years. Instead the Second Year Students were each given £20 'seed money', encouraged to invest it, and bring back what they made.

John Kumpalume ACCA continued as the School's accountant.

### **Change of Charity Name**

The School was founded with the name Teesside School of Supernatural Ministry. The Charity Commission approved the present name in October 2020. The School's name was updated by Santander Bank and HMRC by the start of this report period.

### **Achievements and Challenges**

Government restrictions on meetings and travel were lifted during the previous report period. Accordingly the School enjoyed a welcome return to all-face-to-face operation for the whole academic year.

We had UK-based guest speakers throughout the school year, each bringing teaching complementary to the Bethel Curriculum.

The School had 7 First Year Students, all of whom graduated. Of the 4 Second Year students, 3 graduated. This was a year characterised by the personal growth of all the students. We saw shy people come 'out of their shells' and un-confident people begin to reflect a confidence in their God-given identities. In turn this had an effect in the atmosphere of teamwork and the 'culture of honour' which we always seek to grow in the School.

Late in this report period, one of our graduating 2<sup>nd</sup>-year Students began to lead a prayer and intercession team. Second Year Students are expected to encourage the First Years and lift the atmosphere. While the Second Years did those things, their small number made for an 'uphill' feel to the year for the whole School. This was the Covid pandemic continuing to cast its shadow as the previous year's poor recruitment washed through. The report period ended with encouraging numbers signing up for 2022-23.

A highlight of the year was the Graduation evening June. In addition to the joy of seeing all Students graduate in front of many un-churched friends and relatives, a meal was served by one of the Students with excellence in the cooking and the presentation.

The leadership team and Students participated in public outreaches in Stockton and Scarborough.

Open worship nights were held on the last Thursday of each month in which Students were able to use their spiritual gifts to facilitate many significant encounters between God and our guests. This was the first year in which we had to find more chairs 'on the night' as public attendance grew.

'NPSSM on Tour' was a nickname for two events in which the School 'took over' public meetings held by churches in Stockton, Middlesbrough, and Lingdale. Again, faith was deepened in those who received ministry as well in the Students themselves.

### **Financing**

As a Charity the School is able to accept donations which may be Gift-Aided. Student fees are payable in full at the beginning of the academic year or by the end of the first term. A discount structure is offered for early booking and for household members taking the course together.

John Kumpalume ACCA continued as the School's accountant.

## **Trustees Report**

Period Ended 30 June 2021

### **Governing Document**

The School is governed by its Charitable Constitution.

### **Vision**

Northern Prophetic School of Supernatural Ministry (known by its former name until 6 Oct 2020) was founded to contribute to the vision of the region of Teesside being transformed by the life, love and power of Jesus Christ. It does this by training adult students to live in a greater awareness of the Kingdom of God and to see its borders extended through a normal, Biblical, supernatural lifestyle.

Meeting for thirty-three Thursday evenings a year, the School emphasises hands-on training and experience along with academic understanding. This creates a 'learn and apply' culture in which students are encouraged to take risks, become used to having their faith stretched and grow in their understanding of God's ways. To this end, as the students grow in confidence they are given opportunities to move out of the 'safety' of the classroom and to take part in weekend outreaches on the streets of Stockton-on-Tees and elsewhere. In these sessions students primarily seek out unchurched people and bring the Biblical gifts of the Holy Spirit to bear on their understanding of God's love and their own destiny.

### **Management**

The Board of Governors, chaired by Andrew Waugh, meet quarterly or more often as required, to review the progress of the School and agree on future actions to ensure its continued success and ethical conduct. A 2nd-year student, selected by the student body, is invited to attend Board meetings as a non-voting student representative. Week-on-week leadership and management continues in the hands of Julia Powell, who has been employed as the Director of the School since May 2018. Operation of the School is facilitated by a number of volunteers who lead small groups, lead worship and take on other practical tasks. The School principally uses teaching materials developed by Bethel Church of Redding, California, USA and also invites input from visiting speakers.

There is an ongoing declaration of interest, namely that one of the Trustees is the husband of the School's paid Director.

### **External Relationships**

The School relates to a wide range of Christian churches in the NorthEast of England, whose leaders endorse students' applications for the course.

## **Objectives and Activities**

### **Charitable Objectives**

The education and training of people to see Teesside being transformed by the life, love and power of Jesus Christ.

### **About NPSSM**

Opened in 2016, NPSSM is a ministry school where adults of all ages come to learn how to live in a greater awareness of the Kingdom of God and to see its borders extended through a normal, Biblical, supernatural lifestyle.

### **Main activities during the year**

Running part-time training courses which encourage and help people in churches, on the street, and in their daily lives.

### **Trustee changes during the Report Period**

None.

### **Achievements and Challenges**

The School had 8 First Year students, all of whom graduated. Of the 8 Second Year students, one continued halfway through the course but then due to circumstances postponed until 2021-2022. The remaining 7 all graduated, of whom 3 were invited to stay on as interns.

As noted below, we started the year online having made the transition to being online in 2019-20.

We lost a key volunteer leader at the end of the previous session, though she remains a school supporter and occasionally helps with the NPSSM website. We therefore assigned team members to various roles within the school to help maintain consistency in the Revival Groups (small subgroups within the School).

School Director Julia Powell identified areas where, with assistance, we can develop and increase the publicity of the school, in the hope of seeing more students attending.

We had UK-based guest speakers throughout the school year, each bringing teaching complementary to the Bethel Curriculum. One of these speakers agreed to join our Blue Sky Thinking Board.

Public Outreaches in Durham and Middlesbrough were adapted to accommodate the Covid restrictions and the students responded well. Other creative ideas were used to help students continue to hone their spiritual gifts.

Typical quotes from group leaders are "I love the continued freshness of NPSSM which keeps pressing forward and seeks after the new things God is revealing to us." "It was a very positive year

overall with much spiritual growth which was evident in the way (the students) led themselves, turned their hand to leading online activities or in-person activities.”

A small questionnaire was carried out with all students, who all placed themselves in the top three scores (out of ten) for ‘personal growth’ and in the in the top four for satisfaction with the year at NPSSM. Further, an online tool was used to encourage the students to understand their abilities to work in teams and to complement each other’s strengths. It was encouraging to see that the full spectrum of abilities was represented in the Second Years, interns and leaders, which allowed us to generate fruitful outreach opportunities. It was emphasised that we can succeed as a team if we work together to use God’s gifts to complement each others’ strengths.

### **Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic**

Government restrictions on meetings and travel took effect three months before this report period. As is well known, the restrictions were sometimes eased, sometimes tightened. At no point during the report period were they eased to the point where adult education could revert to face-to-face teaching meetings. Therefore the School continued online throughout with reduced student fees. The earlier plans to use online small groups (in order to minimise the sense of loss of personal contact and learning support) were carried on and improved. Google Classrooms was successfully adopted as an online platform for the setting and marking of written assignments. Once the Revival Groups got the hang of the technical side of online meetings, the students each grew tremendously. Trustee Meetings were likewise conducted online. The sole exception was the student Induction process at the start of the school year, which was socially-distanced with appropriate PPE and a Risk Assessment. We continued to be grateful to Rivers Of Life Church in Stockton-on-Tees for their flexible ‘come back when you can’ attitude to our booking of their rooms.

The lack of meeting in person for social occasions proved to be a serious drawback. The School relies very much on the development of personal connections. Our most effective form of promotion is our students. Interacting and influencing peers about the NPSSM inspires new friends to apply and join; the School’s future suffered through the lack of this informal interaction. However, the year was full of positive points overall. The team and students navigated the adjustments with eagerness and professionalism, overcoming the obvious hurdles that could have prevented them from getting the most out of the teaching and training on offer.

### **Change of Charity Name**

The re-naming process began before the time-frame of this report, ending with the Charity Commission’s approval of the new name in October 2020. Steps were then taken immediately to rename the School’s accounts at the bank and HMRC; processes which ended after this report period. Covid restrictions meant that re-branding necessitated online work (website and social media) but no printing expense.

**Financing**

As a Charity the School is able to accept donations which may be Gift-Aided. Student fees are payable in full at the beginning of the academic year or by the end of the first term. A discount structure is offered for early booking and for household members taking the course together.
