The following objects are for the benefit of those who are socially or economically disadvantaged in West London:-

- 1) to develop the capacity and skills in such a way that they are better able to identify their needs and to participate more fully in society;
- 2) to advance education;
- 3) to help young people, especially but not exclusively through leisure time activities, so as to develop their capabilities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society;
- 4) to relieve poverty;
- 5) to promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from

becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society. "for the purpose of this clause 'socially excluded' means being excluded from society, or parts of society, as a result of one of more of the following factors: unemployment; financial hardship; youth or old age; ill health (physical or mental); discrimination on the grounds of race, disability, ethnic origin, religion, belief, creed, poor educational or skills attainment; relationship and family breakdown; poor housing (that is housing that does not meet basic habitable standards; crime (either as a victim of crime or as an offender rehabilitating into society), single parents and their children who are socially excluded as a result of their social and economic position;

6) to seek to enhance, the good health, both mental and physical, of adults and children by increasing public awareness of the benefit of committed couple relationships, marriage, and family life and working to prevent poverty, hardship and distress caused by the breakdown of such relationships.

**The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefit both to those who uses our community centre and the wider community of Uxbridge and neighbouring cities.**

West London Research & Public Awareness Society is a charity committed to the educational support and providing free complementary education programs for people in Uxbridge area. We champion and serve the primary goal advancing the education of the public in the subjects of English Language, Life in the UK and several ethnic languages. We strongly believe that this will promote social friendships and strong interpersonal skills in the future. Only through good personal relationships that requires good language skills, people can develop mental and moral capabilities to achieve their goals in life.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

The supplementary educational support out of school hours which is provided by our community members and teachers on a voluntary basis act as crucial information and advocacy points for adults as well as children in our region. The language courses we provide are designed to improve the level of English of those who struggle to communicate and educate. Our programs aim for raising aspirations and engagement that are essential components to remove the language barrier hence reducing failures in the classroom or at work.

West London Research & Public Awareness Society provides a program that is in direct response to the growing number of young people that are failing to develop the necessary communication skills because either they do not have advanced English language skills or understanding of the culture and social norms in the UK. West London Research & Public Awareness Society will focus primarily on young people with the aim of advancing community development through language and cultural education. The focus is slightly different at each level but the goal remains the same; prepare and empower the young person to make positive changes in his/her life.

### **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES:**

The community centre provides place for our prayers and worship and for the activities associated with our faith. During the year under review, we offered and conducted a range of religious and cultural services and activities including:

**Festivals:** our centre prepares food during holy month for those attending our activities and wish to break their fast together. Religious festivals i.e. Eid was also celebrated at our centre with a family day and communal meal.

### **EDUCATION / TRAINING ACTIVITIES**

Our community centre hall and rooms provide a valuable educational and recreational resource to all in our local community. A wide range of activities are organised and take place from our community centre.

**Turkish language courses:** Turkish Consulate General in London appointed a Turkish language teacher to teach Turkish language and culture to pupils and adults at our Community Centre.

**Supplementary school and homework support:** at weekends and during school holidays a supervised homework club is supported and supervised by volunteers and over 35 children regularly attend the club.

### **LEISURE AND SPORT ACTIVITIES**

People at every age group need leisure and sport activities to develop friendship and social skills that will improve their confidence in communicating to others. These extracurricular activities are essential part of the program to practice the language and communication skills young people develop at the classrooms. Sports, along with enhancing health and fitness, would enable people especially young people to use all their senses and by choosing sports in their lives, young people can not only become physically stronger but also emotionally tougher.

Our aim to:

- Raise the attainment of people, particularly those facing disadvantages
- Develop their essential skills
- Prepare young people for the world of work and further study


We do this by following:

becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society. "for the purpose of this clause 'socially excluded' means being excluded from society, or parts of society, as a result of one or more of the following factors: unemployment; financial hardship; youth or old age; ill health (physical or mental); discrimination on the grounds of race, disability, ethnic origin, religion, belief, creed, poor educational or skills attainment; relationship and family breakdown; poor housing (that is housing that does not meet basic habitable standards; crime (either as a victim of crime or as an offender rehabilitating into society), single parents and their children who are socially excluded as a result of their social and economic position;

6) to seek to enhance, the good health, both mental and physical, of adults and children by increasing public awareness of the benefit of committed couple relationships, marriage, and family life and working to prevent poverty, hardship and distress caused by the breakdown of such relationships.

**The charity carries out a wide range of activities in pursuance of its charitable aims. The trustees consider that these activities, summarised below, provide benefit both to those who uses our community centre and the wider community of Uxbridge and neighbouring cities.**

#### **CULTURAL AND RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES:**

The community centre provides place for our prayers and worship and for the activities associated with our faith. During the year under review, we offered and conducted a range of religious and cultural services and activities including:

**Prayers:** Our centre is open for daily and weekly prayers. During the week, we have over 25 people who regularly attend daily prayers and over 120 who regularly attend weekly prayers.

**Festivals:** our centre prepares food during holy month for those attending our activities and wish to break their fast together. Religious festivals i.e. Eid was also celebrated at our centre with a family day and communal meal.

**Cooking and selling ethnic foods to raise funds:** each week on Fridays the charity invites a voluntary chef to cook Turkish foods to raise funds for the Charity. This activity used to be done monthly, but it has become so popular then it was changed to weekly.

#### **COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES**

Our community centre hall and rooms provide a valuable educational and recreational resource to all in our local community. A wide range of activities are organised and take place from our community centre.

**Turkish language courses:** Turkish Consulate General in London appointed a Turkish language teacher to teach Turkish language and culture to pupils and adults at our Community Centre.

**Supplementary school and homework support:** at weekends and during school holidays a supervised homework club is supported and supervised by volunteers and over 30 children regularly attend the club.

**Seminars and cultural and religious talks:** volunteers provide free cultural and religious seminars at our centre every Wednesday evenings.

#### **Sport activities**

The Charity organises sport events mainly in football and table tennis.

**Fetes & Festivals:** we have a little festival occasionally a few times yearly. Many people who are from different background attend to our festivals. All is planned and prepared a week before the festivals. Especially Turkish dishes are offered and presented to the visitors to taste including Turkish pastry, cakes, kebabs and local foods from different regions in Turkey. Many people are invited to this charity activity to buy and eat for fundraising. This is a really good cultural and social activity for the community spirit. During the festival, many people find a chance to speak and get to know each other while tasting good food. It is also good opportunity to learn about the culture and food while it is a collectively playing and entertaining event for all children together.


