Pizza Grazie supports our homeless community with hot food Friday & Saturday outside the normal opening hours of our soup kitchen.

The free food shop is open every Tuesday evening with a complete digital system so we can give people memberships, Blackpool transport offer free travel on Tuesdays in order to support people requiring food supplies. The membership also allows us to monitor peoples need along with which items are in need the most.

This also helps when asking for donations

The Big Red Night Bus continued to be an emergency lifeline for people requiring urgent crisis accommodation. Our continued ISA with the police provided safety and prevention with security checks. The Bus is currently out of service due to vandalism and the cost of the repairs being so expensive. The board will be having a meeting to discuss the options available

Renovations have made considerable progress on the church on the upper floor, this will be completed by April 2026 in order to be used as a community hub/hall.

With over 2500 people registered to use the service and also linking in with our local bus provider Blackpool Transport offering free travel to anyone needing the free food shop.

Pizza Grazie continues to feed the homeless two nights per week. All proceeds go into the charity and cover running costs, reducing the need to ask for funding and letting us focus on what we do best.

New links and contacts continue to be made to move forward being available and a positive increase of support for our homeless community. Via rehabilitation, private landlords, supported housing.

Further links with the police diversion team in police custody to support anyone homeless on release.

Grant writing is now our main priority in order to receive continued funds and maintain the energy bills and food supplies required to provide the service

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)".

#### **Objectives and activities**

The charity's objects are to relieve poverty particularly but not exclusively amongst homeless people in Blackpool and the surrounding area. The policies adopted in furtherance of these objects are to provide human resources, buildings, facilities and open space for people in need, to provide services together with advocacy, advice and information and there has been no change in these during the year.

The charity operates principally by the provision of meals for the homeless and the provision of a safe space in which to operate.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Amazing Graze has been supporting Blackpool as a whole and continued to support the homeless community including the vulnerable, elderly and families in poverty.

In the ongoing cost of living crisis, we have been supporting more people in distressing situations and increasing our services through the week to enable us to serve food and resources on other evenings via Pizza Grazie.

Pizza Grazie supports our homeless community with hot food Thursday - Sunday outside the normal opening hours of our soup kitchen.

The free food shop is open every Tuesday evening with a complete digital system so we can give people memberships. Blackpool Transport offer free travel on Tuesdays in order to support people requiring food supplies. The membership also allows us to monitor people's needs along with items which are in need the most.

This also helps when asking for donations.

The Big Red Bus is operational Friday - Monday morning accessible via our administration team on Tuesday and Friday supporting people in desperate situations of being homeless and the accessing further accommodation, rehabilitation or supported housing. Finding further accommodation is an issue as there is low housing stock in Blackpool.

Amazing Graze has excelled and picked up the pace of service and supported our community proudly for another year.

Due to the continued commitment and support we offer our community during the current cost of living crisis we have successfully continued the free food shop.

Pizza Grazie continues to feed the homeless four nights a week. All proceeds go into the charity and cover running costs reducing the need to ask for funding and letting us focus on what we do best.

As we are all about food poverty, we have proven a pizza shop within our building would benefit our community better than having a second hand shop to enable the charity to financially benefit for general ongoing bills.

New links and contacts continue to be made to move forward being available and a positive increase of support for our homeless community working via rehabilitation, private landlords and supported housing.

Links with the police diversion team in police custody have been established to support anyone homeless on release.

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### **Achievements and performance**

The trustees are pleased to be able to report further significant growth in the charity during the year as mentioned earlier in the report.

### **Financial review**

At the end of the period the charity had no remaining unrestricted reserves relating to the core activities of the organisation. Whilst the trustees aim to maintain sufficient reserves to enable the charity to continue to operate for between 3 and 6 months this has become increasingly challenging with the needs of the community becoming more apparent and at the year end was reliant on short term loans to continue operation..

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

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### 1 Accounting policies

#### Charity Information

Amazing Graze is a an unincorporated charity .

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)". The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a true and fair view. This departure has involved following the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities applying FRS 102 rather than the version of the Statement of Recommended Practice which is referred to in the Regulations but which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

The trustees have decided that expenditure on the Big Red Bus project will be written off as incurred and that the vehicle will not be held as a fixed asset.

#### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

#### 1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

#### 1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is receives the funds as the accounts are prepared on a receipts and payments basis..

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. . Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the tax recovery.

Legacies are recognised on receipt.

It is considered impractical to recognise the value of donated goods and services.

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### 1 Accounting policies

#### Charity Information

Amazing Graze is a an unincorporated charity .

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)". The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a true and fair view. This departure has involved following the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities applying FRS 102 rather than the version of the Statement of Recommended Practice which is referred to in the Regulations but which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

The trustees have decided that expenditure on the Big Red Bus project will be written off as incurred and that the vehicle will not be held as a fixed asset.

#### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

#### 1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

#### 1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is receives the funds as the accounts are prepared on a receipts and payments basis..

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. . Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the tax recovery.

Legacies are recognised on receipt.

It is considered impractical to recognise the value of donated goods and services.
