TRUSTEES' REPORT

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31/08/2021

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of the charity are to provide affordable and high-quality child care to the parents of Anston and the surrounding areas. This is achieved by; enhancing the development of children primarily under statutory school age, by; encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups, and by; offering appropriate play, education, care facilities and training courses, together with the rights of parents to take responsibility for and to become involved in the activities of such groups, ensuring that such groups offer opportunities for all children whatever their race, culture, religion, means or ability; to encourage the study of the needs of such children and their families and promote public interest in and recognition of such needs; to instigate and adhere to and to further the aims and objectives of the Pre-School Learning Alliance.

It is the trustee's opinion that this objective is in line with the Charity Commissions Public Benefit Requirement.

During the year Anston Stones Early Years has had a total of 26 children on the register.

Anston Stones Early Years' main achievements during the year were to enhance the children's development and learning by purchasing toys and resources that tap into the children's key interests. New children's television and film characters have appeared and we did not have any toys, games or activities to represent them. We have found that through these purchases we have been able to engage more children in learning activities, especially boys. Additionally, professional development training for the staff was bought to ensure practitioners are up to date with current research and practices in order to enhance the learning experiences and development of the children in the setting and to share with their parents through workshops.


FUNDS AND RESERVES

Anston Stones Early Years reserve policy is to hold sufficient funds to enable it to function for three months; and/or to pay any redundancy payments due should the setting have to close. The trustees estimate the cost of redundancy payments would be £18,000. In addition, due to the timing of the payment of the Nursery Education Grant, it is also necessary, as a matter of course, to have the finances to pay at least three months' salary without any income.

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The organisation is unincorporated in England and Wales and is registered with the Charities Commission. The charity number is 1167355.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ANSTON STONES EARLY YEARS

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31/08/2021 .

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND EXAMINER

The trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £10,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of ICAEW.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to an audit under charity law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS STATEMENT

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters.
