Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2025

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charitable incorporated organisation for the year ended 31st March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with Section 1a of the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims for the public benefit

The objects of the CIO are for such charitable purposes or for the benefit of such charitable institutions or charitable foundations and in such proportions as shall from time to time be determined by the trustees.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities for the public benefit and plans for the future

In the year to 31 March 2025 the charity recorded donation income of £26,250 and charitable expenditure of £11,750. Of the total expenditure in the year, £4,250 was distributed as grants and donations to other charitable organisations.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial review

The result for the year to 31 March 2025 is a surplus of £14,500. The charity's net assets at 31 March 2025 stood at £30,022.

Reserves policy

With minimal administration costs, the charity has little need to carry reserves of any significance. However, whilst the trustees will donate the vast majority of funds to other operational charities, the timing of grants made will inevitably result in variations in the amounts held year on year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Gallagher Re Foundation Charitable Incorporated Organisation is a registered charity controlled by its governing document. The governing document is the Constitution of Gallagher Re Foundation adopted on 30 May 2016 which became recognised by the Charity Commission when the Charitable Incorporated Organisation was registered on 2 June 2016.

The governing document defines the ongoing arrangements for trustees to run Gallagher Re Foundation. Up to 12 trustees are allowed to be appointed, and there must be a minimum of 2 charity trustees. Should the number of trustees fall below this minimum, the remaining trustee may act only to call a meeting of the charity trustees, or to appoint a new charity trustee.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

In selecting persons to be appointed, the trustees consider the skills, experience and commitment of potential trustees and the contributions they can make to complement the existing board of trustees.

Apart from the first trustees of the charity, each new trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2023

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charitable incorporated organisation for the year ended 31st March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with Section 1a of the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims for the public benefit

The objects of the CIO are for such charitable purposes or for the benefit of such charitable institutions or charitable foundations and in such proportions as shall from time to time be determined by the trustees.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities for the public benefit and plans for the future

In the year to 31 March 2023 the charity recorded no donation income and charitable expenditure of £7,811. Of the total expenditure in the year, £7,186 was distributed as grants and donations to other charitable organisations. A listing of these can be found in the notes to the financial statements.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial review

With no donation income and charitable expenditure of £7,811, the result for the year to 31 March 2023 is a deficit of £7,811. The charity's net assets at 31 March 2023 stood at £15,622.

Reserves policy

With minimal administration costs, the charity has little need to carry reserves of any significance. However, whilst the trustees will donate the vast majority of funds to other operational charities, the timing of grants made will inevitably result in variations in the amounts held year on year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Gallagher Re Foundation Charitable Incorporated Organisation is a registered charity controlled by its governing document. The governing document is the Constitution of Gallagher Re Foundation adopted on 30 May 2016 which became recognised by the Charity Commission when the Charitable Incorporated Organisation was registered on 2 June 2016.

The governing document defines the ongoing arrangements for trustees to run Gallagher Re Foundation. Up to 12 trustees are allowed to be appointed, and there must be a minimum of 2 charity trustees. Should the number of trustees fall below this minimum, the remaining trustee may act only to call a meeting of the charity trustees, or to appoint a new charity trustee.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

In selecting persons to be appointed, the trustees consider the skills, experience and commitment of potential trustees and the contributions they can make to complement the existing board of trustees.

Apart from the first trustees of the charity, each new trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2021

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charitable Incorporated organisation for the year ended 31st March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with Section 1a of the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims for the public benefit

The objectives and aims of the charity are to provide grants to support the work, aims and objectives of other charitable institutions and organisations.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Foundation's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities for the public benefit and plans for the future

In the year to 31 March 2021 the charity recorded donation income of £42,035 and charitable expenditure of £44,682. Of the total expenditure in the year, £43,707 was distributed as grants and donations to other charitable organisations. A listing of these can be found in the notes to the financial statements.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial review

The charity has recorded donation income of £42,035 in the year to 31 March 2021 and has reported a net asset position of £27,720 as at this date.

Reserves policy

With minimal administration costs, the charity has little need to carry reserves of any significance. However, whilst the trustees will donate the vast majority of funds to other operational charities, the timing of grants made will inevitably result in variations in the amounts held year on year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Capsicum Re Foundation Charitable Incorporated Organisation is a registered charity controlled by its governing document. The governing document is the Constitution of Capsicum Re Foundation adopted on 30 May 2016 which became recognised by the Charity Commission when the Charitable Incorporated Organisation was registered on 2 June 2016.

The governing document defines the ongoing arrangements for trustees to run Capsicum Re Foundation. Up to 12 trustees are allowed to be appointed, and there must be a minimum of 2 charity trustees. Should the number of trustees fall below this minimum, the remaining trustee may act only to call a meeting of the charity trustees, or to appoint a new charity trustee.

During the year, the charity changed its name from Capsicum Re Foundation to Gallagher Re Foundation following the rebranding of Capsicum Re.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

In selecting persons to be appointed, the trustees consider the skills, experience and commitment of potential trustees and the contributions they can make to complement the existing board of trustees.

Apart from the first trustees of the charity, each new trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

As the charity's trustees, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").





1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, registered with the Charity Commission in England and Wales. The address of its registered office is The Walbrook Building, 25 Walbrook, London, EC4N 8AW.

The principal activity of the charity is disclosed in the Report of the Trustees.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Section 1a of Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy or note.

The charity has elected to apply the exemption under FRS 102 from preparing a cash flow statement.

The comparative financial statements cover the year ended 31 March 2020.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Cash at bank

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised when there is an obligation at the balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer or economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at the amount the charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

There are no restricted, designated or endowment funds.
