Structure, governance and management

Governing document

St Albans for Refugees (StAR) is a charitable company limited by guarantee, governed by its Articles of Association and registered with the Charity Commission (No. 1167679).

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Trustees are recruited from the local community and appointed in accordance with the charity's governing document. The board meets regularly to oversee operations and compliance. There was no change in the trustee body during 2024.

Organisational structure

Day-to-day activity is undertaken by volunteers under the oversight of trustees. Key functions include aid coordination, ESOL delivery and partnership work.

Risk management

Trustees routinely review risks around funding, safeguarding, logistics and volunteer capacity.

Objects and activities

Charitable objects

To relieve need among refugees, asylum seekers and displaced persons locally and internationally.

Activities during 2024

- January workshop with partner organisations to plan the year's response.
- Collection and distribution of donated clothing and essentials for asylum seekers in Hertfordshire.
- Provision of ESOL and conversational English support.
- Ongoing partnership with local refugee-support groups.
- Volunteer engagement and awareness-raising through community events.

Achievements and performance

- Strengthened ESOL programme.
- Sustained material-aid deliveries.
- Increased community engagement via social media and local events.

Beneficiaries

Primary beneficiaries are refugees and asylum seekers in the St Albans/Hertfordshire area, as well as indirectly the wider community through strengthened social cohesion. We also supported aid efforts in Ukraine.

Financial review

The charity remained financially stable during 2024, funded largely by donations. Expenditure focused on aid logistics, ESOL support and volunteer resources.

Reserves policy

The trustees aim to hold 3–6 months of operating costs.

Going concern

The charity remains a going concern with planned activities continuing into 2025.

Plans for the future

Plans include expanding ESOL provision, enhancing support for refugees in temporary accommodation, developing partnerships, improving monitoring of impact data, and sustaining donation levels.

For the year ended 31 December 2021**

The Trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charitable company for the year ended 31 December 2020. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Chair's report

This has been a quiet year for St Albans for Refugees (StAR) due to Covid-19 restrictions, but when permitted we continued the receiving and distribution of donations and putting in place strong foundations for the future which will allow us to do more in the years ahead to support refugees around the world.

It is important to remember that none of what we achieved in the year would have been possible without the ongoing support of a strong trustee group and the amazing team of volunteers who helped in the year, some of whom gave an hour and some of whom gave lots of hours, but all of whom are crucial to the continuing work of StAR.

StAR is in a good position to continue its work in the future and we look forward to working with our volunteers in the future.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Our charity objects, as laid out in our Memorandum and Articles, are:

To collect and distribute emergency aid for refugees from war, oppression, natural disasters, climate change, and those being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, or membership of a particular social group or political opinion.

The relief of financial hardship amongst those granted refugee status and their dependants living (temporarily or permanently) in St Albans and the surrounding area.

To preserve and protect the physical and mental health of those granted refugee status and their dependents.

To advance the education and training of those granted refugee status and their dependents in need thereof so as to advance them in life and assist them to adapt within a new community.


To advance the education of the public in general about the issues relating to refugees and those seeking asylum.

The provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of those persons who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances.

The relief of sickness and financial hardship amongst those seeking asylum in the United Kingdom or who are refugees, and who reside in St Albans and the surrounding area.

The relief of unemployment of those granted refugee status and those seeking asylum in the United Kingdom, and in particular St Albans and the surrounding area, by the provision of vocational and skills training, advice and support.

Objectives and aims

The trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

St Albans for Refugees (StAR) had a quiet year in 2021, primarily due to Covid-19 and logistical problems caused by Brexit. However, we were able to provide aid in the following areas:

- France – We were able to travel to Calais and Dunkirk, distributing clothing, tents and sanitary products. We helped with food preparation and distribution of meals and we provided some telephones to refugees.
- Greece – We co-operated with an aid distribution company to send aid in the form of clothing, sanitary products and toys to refugee camps in Greece.
- Syria - We co-operated with an aid distribution company to send aid in the form of clothing, sanitary products and toys to refugee camps in Greece.
- Afghanistan/Pakistan – We provided financial assistance to Afghan refugees who arrived in Pakistan in August 2021. We also provided clothing and other essential items to Afghan refugees arriving in the UK.
- Asylum Seekers – We have a Memorandum of Understanding to provide clothing and other essential items to asylum seekers in a local hotel.

Community outreach

We were able to run our Reverse Father Christmas event at the St Albans Museum in December. The event allows everyone child to see Father Christmas free of charge but they are usually asked to bring a present for distribution to refugees. For 2021 we asked for very specific items. St Albans Museum have invited us back for 2022.

Work with other groups

We worked with management teams in a local asylum hotel to provide clothing and other essential items to asylum seekers located locally.

We worked with a local organisation in Pakistan to provide assistance to Afghan refugees arriving into Pakistan

We worked with Distribute Aid to ensure that we were able to distribute items to Greece, Syria and France.

Worked with our Volunteers – When permitted between lockdowns we continued to work with volunteers in the St Albans community who have helped to ensure that at least once a week our garages were open for donations and sorting.

Political pressure - We have worked with other organisations to keep up the political pressure on the UK and European governments to work to resolve refugee concerns.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

StAR's finances consist of a general unrestricted fund. This fund comes from donations and fundraising. These donations are funded through our bank account, Justgiving, Paypal and the occasional cash donation. StAR has also noted an arbitrary figure of £25,000 in respect of donated goods. Due to Covid-19 we were unable to distribute all donated goods this year and we were left with stock to be distributed in the future.

Reserves

At the end of December 2021 there was a reserve of £18,458, which includes stock of £15,000.

Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

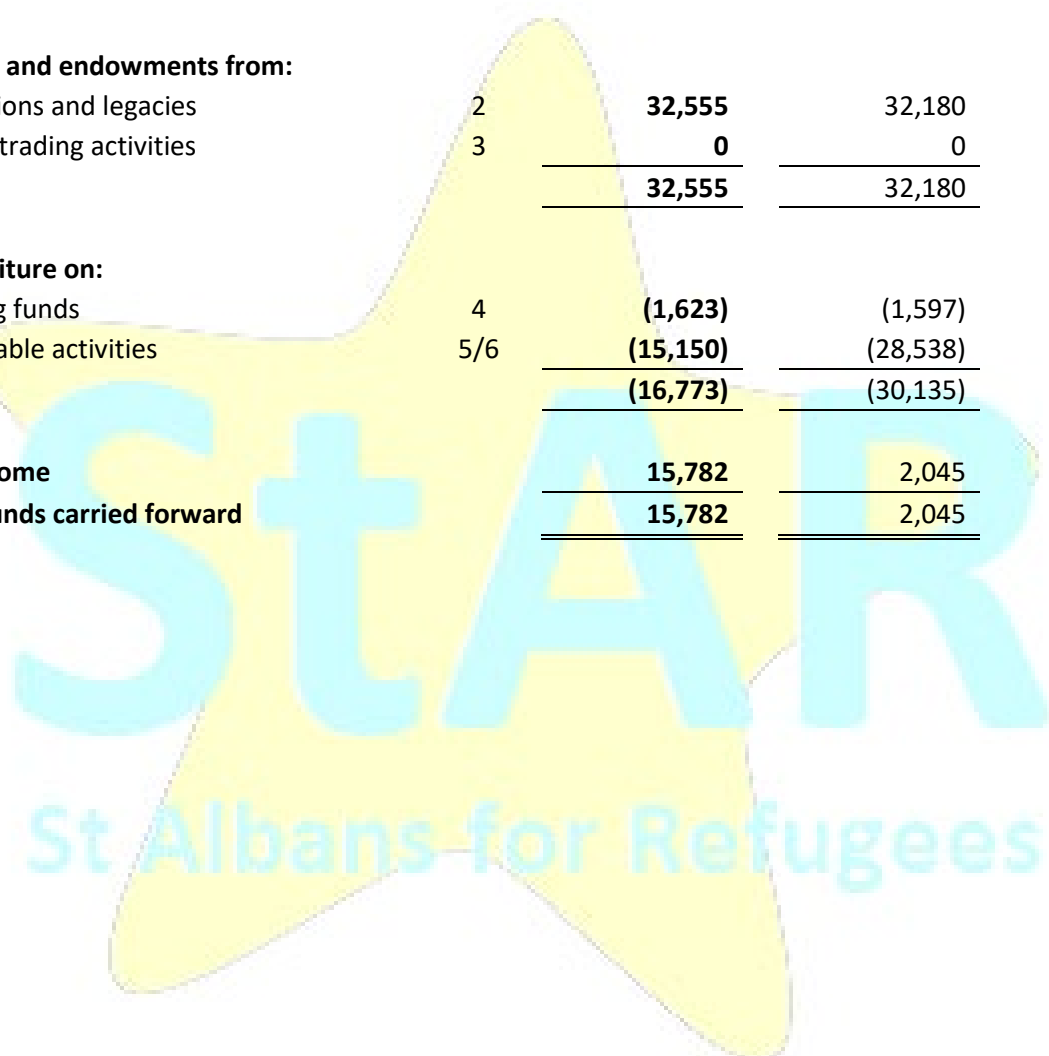



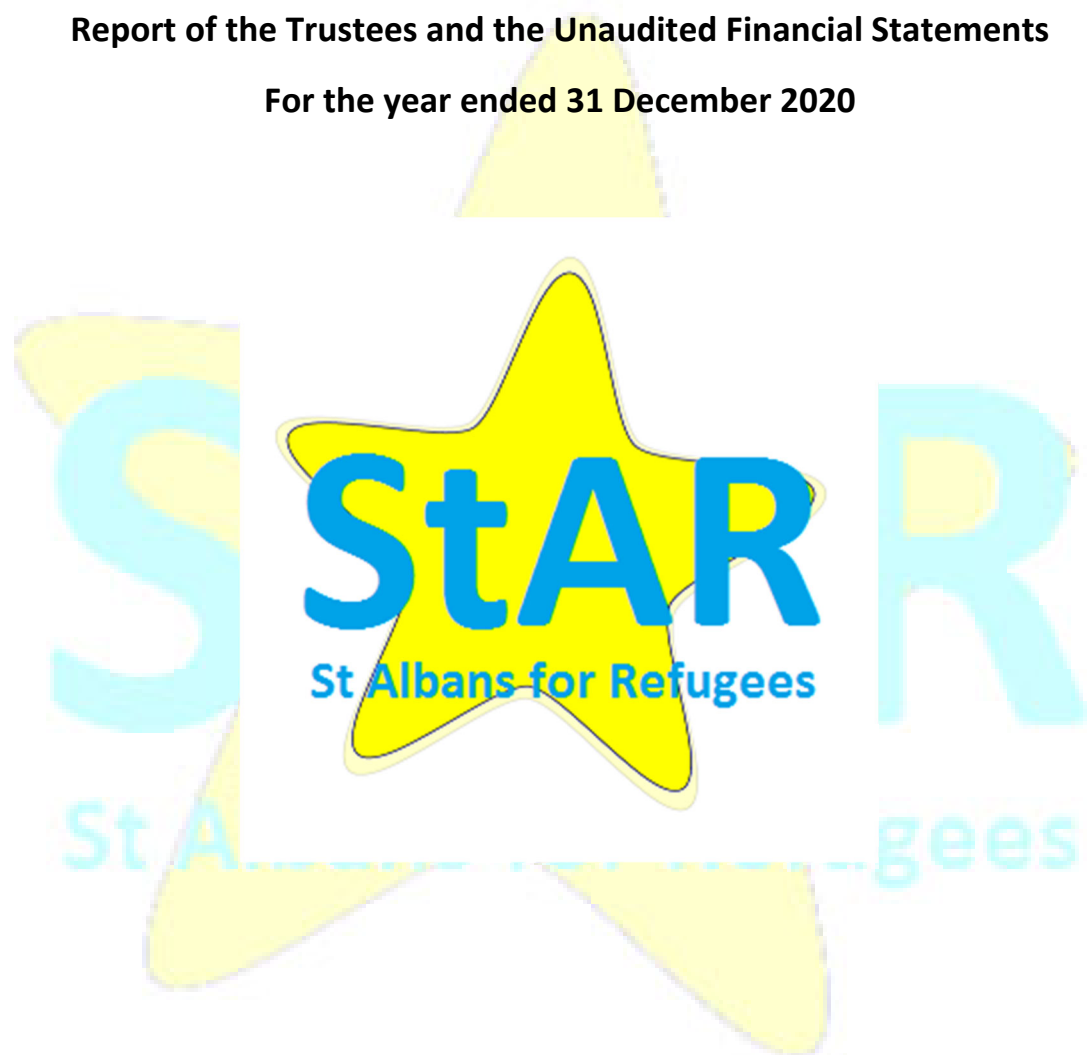

For the year ended 31 December 2020**

The Trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charitable company for the year ended 31 December 2020. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Chair's report

This has been a quiet year for St Albans for Refugees (StAR) due to Covid-19 restrictions, but when permitted we continued the receiving and distribution of donations and putting in place strong foundations for the future which will allow us to do more in the years ahead to support refugees around the world.

It is important to remember that none of what we achieved in the year would not have been possible without the ongoing support of a strong trustee group and the amazing team of volunteers who helped in in the year, some of whom gave an hour and some of whom gave lots of hours, but all of whom are crucial to the continuing work of StAR.

StAR is in a good position to continue its work in the future and we look forward to working with our volunteers in the future.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Our charity objects, as laid out in our Memorandum and Articles, are:

To collect and distribute emergency aid for refugees from war, oppression, natural disasters, climate change, and those being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, or membership of a particular social group or political opinion.

The relief of financial hardship amongst those granted refugee status and their dependants living (temporarily or permanently) in St Albans and the surrounding area.

To preserve and protect the physical and mental health of those granted refugee status and their dependents.

To advance the education and training of those granted refugee status and their dependents in need thereof so as to advance them in life and assist them to adapt within a new community.


To advance the education of the public in general about the issues relating to refugees and those seeking asylum.

The provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of those persons who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances.

The relief of sickness and financial hardship amongst those seeking asylum in the United Kingdom or who are refugees, and who reside in St Albans and the surrounding area.

The relief of unemployment of those granted refugee status and those seeking asylum in the United Kingdom, and in particular St Albans and the surrounding area, by the provision of vocational and skills training, advice and support.

Objectives and aims

The trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

St Albans for Refugees (StAR) had a quiet year in 2020, primarily due to Covid-19 and logistical problems caused by Brexit. However, we were able to provide aid in the following areas:

- France – At the beginning of the year before lockdowns caused by Covid-19 we did travel to Calais and Dunkirk, distributing clothing, tents and sanitary products. We helped with food preparation and distribution of meals and we provided some telephones to refugees. We provided social interaction with refugees.
- Greece – We co-operated with an aid distribution company to send aid in the form of clothing, sanitary products and toys to refugee camps in Greece.
- Syria - We co-operated with an aid distribution company to send aid in the form of clothing, sanitary products and toys to refugee camps in Greece.

Community outreach

Due to the Covid-19 lockdown we were unable to run our Reverse Father Christmas event at the St Albans Museum in December. However, we ran the event on Zoom instead. The event allows everyone child to see Father Christmas free of charge but they are usually asked to bring a present for distribution to refugees. For 2020 we asked for financial donations instead. St Albans Museum have invited us back for 2021, dependent on further Covid-19 restrictions.

Work with other groups

We worked with Anaya Aid to provide items for Greece – several journeys to visit Anaya Aid in London. Donated towards logistics cost of sending pallets containing winter clothes and other aid sent to CESRT, Chios.

Worked with our Volunteers – When permitted between lockdowns we continued to work with volunteers in the St Albans community who have helped to ensure that at least once a week our garages were open for donations and sorting.

Political pressure - We have worked with other organisations to keep up the political pressure on the UK and European governments to work to resolve refugee concerns.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

StAR's finances consist of a general unrestricted fund. This fund comes from donations and fundraising. These donations are funded through our bank account, Justgiving, Paypal and the occasional cash donation. StAR has also noted an arbitrary figure of £20,000 in respect of donated goods, all of which has been redistributed in the year.

Reserves

At the end of December 2020 there was a reserve of £2,676.

Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

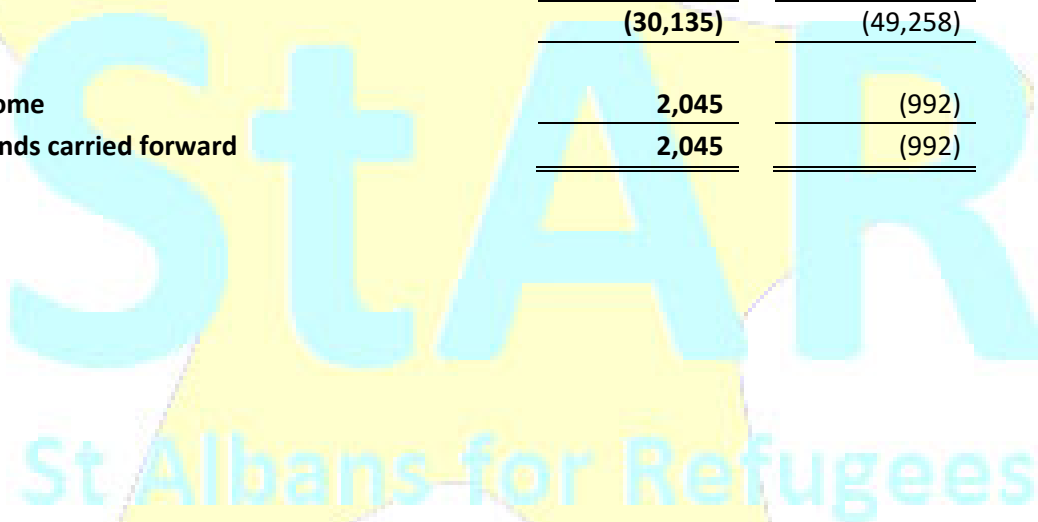


