Converting a bathroom to a fully accessible wet room in a residential facility for the disabled.

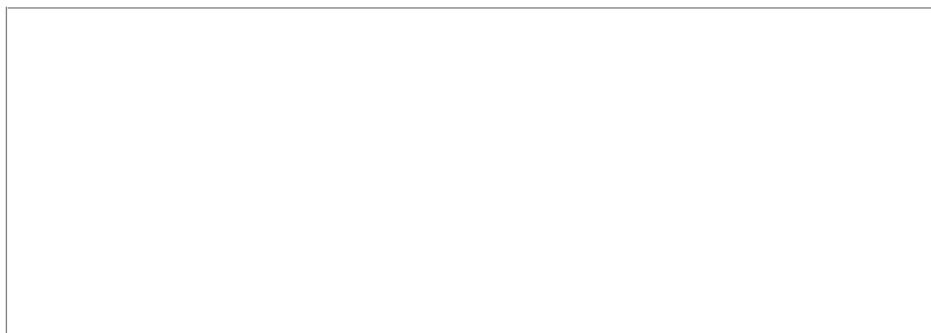
Refurbishment of community outdoor tennis courts.

- Keeping local relevant bodies, organisations, clubs and schools aware of our existence and purpose by email and word of mouth. Our updated website contains contact details and information on how to apply for a grant as well as examples of grants awarded and projects completed.
- Most recipient organisations have referenced the charity in newsletters, on social media and on their website expressing gratitude for our contributions.
- We awarded the following grants:

Market Place Playground (East Finchley Community Trust) £25,000 towards complete refurbishment of an outdoor play area.

Jewish Blind and Disabled £7,770 for purpose built wet room.

Bruce Castle Park (Haringey Tennis) £29,244 for the resurfacing of the community tennis courts.

Ambitious About Autism £10,000 towards the provision of a sensory room for sixth form students at Treehouse School.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of CSDS Foundation
