Para 1.17 and 1.19	Cumbria Rural Choirs is made up of singers from local choirs and individuals living in rural communities across North Cumbria. The long-term strategy continues to be the development of the choral singing techniques to achieve the highest possible standard of performance. The choir's repertoire focuses on large scale, complex choral works which, often, would be too demanding for the local choirs to undertake on their own. Its engagement of an internationally renowned music director to lead the rehearsals and conduct the concert, enables all participants to broaden and develop their musical skills. It also provides the opportunity for audiences to hear choral music, accompanied by a professional orchestra and soloists, rarely performed outside large urban conurbations. Cumbria Rural Choirs represents a unique professional / amateur partnership which enhances Cumbria's music scene and provides enormous benefits for the Cumbrian community, through the high standard that it achieves. It helps to counteract rural isolation and the lack of access to high quality educational and cultural provision in rural communities.

Para 1.20	<p>The Choir held its AGM in November 2023 having started the season in September. This was the second year under the new format of the guest conductor also being the guest musical director. This year the post was again filled by Dr Andrew Padmore. Rehearsals were changed to 4 full days on Saturdays which resulted in longer and more concentrated periods of learning and singing. This was supported by on-line material supplied by Andrew enabling members to improve their singing technique and also to learn their part. This greatly enhanced the learning experience. The outcome was a very successful performance In Carlisle Cathedral in April of Elgar's 'The Music Makers'; Faure's Requiem and 'Cantique de Racine'. It was attended by about 375 people ranging in ages from 10 - 90+ years. Very positive reviews were received via e mail following the performance. The choir members also provided very positive written feedback regarding their experience of singing in the cathedral and the rehearsals led by Andrew.</p>

Financial Review

The Charity, however, still has a healthy bank balance which exceeds the minimum reserve.




