Our **charity objectives** are to advance our Bible-based Christian faith to the glory of God and for the benefit of the community around Maidenhead and beyond.



In line with our 4 purpose themes (shown here → and see Appendix for details), we ran a wide range of activities throughout the week and on weekends, such as worship, prayer, music and praise; learning and teaching including an active Sunday school, multi-age youth groups and toddler clubs, and other social, environmental and community development events.

We are pleased to report that Life@Maidenhead Church continued to enjoy growth and a level of community participation through 2020/21 in line with our purpose.

Whilst the COVID-19 pandemic has continued to dominate our focus on community wellbeing and spiritual support, here is a summary of highlights during this reporting period:

- Music, band & praise – incl. via Zoom with Ben @ 6pm Sundays
- Choir & praise – Choir will continue to make recordings and hopefully can sing live again soon
- Website – design refresh and include extra content on prayer and worship

LEARNING & teaching

- Sunday School – 3 classes on-line, wonderful welcome & prayer time, 20+ children; now starting to run 1 per month in-person at York Road
- Sunday Bible Study Group (BSG) – 1 combined class on-line, circa 5-10 teenagers; now running in-person at York Road each Sunday
- Bible Class – Wednesday 8pm, circa 30+ participants on-line, local & further afield
- Initiated a 12-week Spring Bible Learning Programme each Sunday afternoon for our new friends and brothers and sisters seeking asylum, based in Slough and further afield; approx. 10 regular attendees, bi-lingual English-Farsi sessions (oral & written)
- Daily Bible readings – New Testament reading & discussions via Zoom every weekday
- Development of the learning and teaching section of website

FRIENDSHIP & fellowship

- Sunday Services - Our Sunday morning services provide focus for fellowship, with significant levels of attendance and engagement
- Social evenings via Zoom
- 'Cook with Cathy', Brotherley Beer Evening, The Neate family quiz
- Life@MaidenheadChurch – WhatsApp group circa 60 participants, daily connect
- Tea and Talk every Friday
- Toddler story time a great opportunity for Mums to connect on a Friday
- Website – design refresh and include extra content on social activities


CARE & acts of service


