All the Trustees gave their time freely with no remuneration during the period under review. Two new trustees were appointed in October and November 2024 respectively with the objective of widening the scope and reach of the charity and share responsibilities. Grasiano Takawira was appointed as Chair to replace Alan who has been the Chair since the charity's inception. With the new addition of trustees, Martin will take over the role of Treasurer with Nompumelelo becoming Secretary.






