- (2) To promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of Guiseley and Rawdon ward and the surrounding area the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the conditions of life of said inhabitants.
- (3) to help young people, especially but not exclusively through leisure time activities, so as to develop their capabilities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.

The club promotes participation in rugby league through the provision of facilities, equipment and coaching.

The club operates a number of rugby league teams at different age groups which take part in both competitive and non-competitive structures affiliated to the national governing body of the sport - the Rugby Football League.

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the Main Achievements of the Charity during the Period

The trustees are delighted to report that the 2024 season has seen a 25% increase in the number of players at Primary and Youth level. This has shown the benefits of recruiting players from a younger age including the tots (3-5 year-olds).

In what is an outstanding achievement for the club, six of our under-14s players received scholarships from Bradford, Wakefield and Leeds.

The junior players combined to participate in teams registered within the Yorkshire Junior & Youth League at age groups U6s, U8s, U9s, U10s, U11s Boys, U12s Boys, U13s Boys and U14s Boys

The partnership with Birkenshaw Bluedogs continues to go from strength to strength with a combined team of girls from Guiseley and Birkenshaw competing at U13s level.

The standout performance of the season was by the U12s Boys. In their first competitive season they reached the final of the Continuation Cup which was held in early September at the Fox's Biscuit Stadium in Batley. Although the result didn't go our way, players, coaches and spectators have all benefited from the experience.

Two of our former junior players, Fergus McCormack and Thomas Nicholson-Watton, have both signed full-time contracts with the Leeds Rhinos. It is great motivation for our junior players to see the opportunities available to them.

Open Age

The Open Age have gone from strength to strength and have, on occasion, been able to field two teams. The number of registered players was 43 and included George Bayfield playing alongside his father Alex.

Masters

The number of players in the Masters side have dwindled as some have chosen to play in the Open Age side. The number of registered players was 15.

Financial Review

Review of the Charity's Financial Position at the End of the Period

During this financial period, the club made a small surplus on revenue of £28k. This income represents a significant increase on the previous year, mainly due to an increase in player registrations.

The cold weather during the winter caused several burst pipes which ultimately cost the club around £3000 in increased water consumption.

The club spent a total of £1,900 on training for coaches and volunteers, which is broadly similar to the previous year's amount. Although this cost is significant, the trustees view is that this as an essential investment in the club's future.

The club ended the period with a bank balance of around £44k. The trustees believe this to be sufficient to meet all its future commitments as they fall due, and will hopefully also allow further capital investment in the club's facilities in the coming years.

The Charity's Principal Sources of Funds

The club requires each junior player to pay an annual registration fee to cover costs associated with their participation. For the 2024 season, this remained at £85. A reduced registration fee of £60 is offered to families with more than one child registered.

The trustees may, at their discretion, reduce or cancel the registration fee required for any player for whom the cost would represent a barrier to participation.

The club received £11k in junior registration fees. The Open Age team contributed an additional £1200. Masters players are only required to pay fees on match days and this income amounted to around £200.

Income from sponsorship was £5.5k, a decrease of around £1,000 on the previous year.

Plans for 2025

The trustees would like to increase participation levels at all age groups. Recruitment efforts will target girls in an attempt to increase the number of teams available for them.

The anticipated increase in participation will also require additional volunteer recruitment.

Further changes to be introduced by the RFL in 2025 will see players at U6s, U7s and U8s playing tag rugby.

The club continues to be constrained by the by the existing pitch and hospitality facilities. We will investigate the feasibility of developing these, subject to receiving the necessary permissions from Leeds City Council.



Achievements and Performance

Summary of the Main Achievements of the Charity during the Period

Despite finally being able to put the pandemic behind us, the club were unable to significantly increase the number of registered players. The main reason for this was the disbanding of the previous season's U16s team after six of their players were selected for Scholarships at Leeds Rhinos and Bradford Bulls, leaving the remainder to join our newly formed Open Age team.

We are honoured to be joined by James Simpson as a trustee of the club. James has enjoyed a stellar 10-year career with Leeds Rhinos Wheelchair Rugby team in the Super League, and is a current world cup winner with the England team. James, a former Lance Corporal in the 1st Battalion Yorkshire Regiment, is now the Leeds Rhinos Wheelchair team coach.

Primary & Youth Rugby

During the 2023 season the club had a total of 112 registered junior players and 37 registered volunteers:

The junior players combined to participate in teams registered within the Yorkshire Junior & Youth League at age groups U8s, U9s, U10s, U11s, U12s Boys, U12s Girls and U13s Boys.

As we did not have enough Under 12 girls players to form a team on our own, the club partnered with Birkenshaw Bluedogs who were in a similar position. The joint venture enabled girls from both clubs to play regular competitive matches.

The 2023 season brought mixed fortunes. One of the standout performances was the U12s Boys winning Division 2 after losing only 2 matches all season. The U13s also deserve a mention for their efforts in the Yorkshire Juniors Continuation Cup. Unfortunately, they lost in the final to Featherstone Lions at the Fox's Biscuits Stadium in Batley.

One of our former junior players, Fran Goldthorp, has continued her meteoric rise and is now playing for North Queensland Cowboys, becoming one of the first three UK-based players to sign for a WNRL side.

Open Age

In what is a great addition to the club, we were able to field an Open Age team for the first time in many years. With 30 registered players, the team has competed in the Yorkshire Men's league. This team ensures that we can now provide opportunities to enjoy rugby at Guiseley from age 6 to 106.

Masters

The 20 players in the Masters side have continued to maintain their enthusiastic and enjoyable pursuit of the game at age 35+.

Financial Review

Review of the Charity's Financial Position at the End of the Period

During this financial period, the club broadly broke even on income of £18,700. The income represents a slight decrease on the previous year, mainly due to a reduction in player registrations.

The club spent a total of £2,420 on training for coaches and volunteers. Although this cost is significant, the trustees view this as an essential investment in the club's future.

The club ended the period with a bank balance of around £40k. The trustees believe this to be sufficient to meet all its future commitments as they fall due.

The Charity's Principal Sources of Funds

The club requires each junior player to pay an annual registration fee to cover costs associated with their participation. For the 2023 season, this remained at £85 although this no longer included the RFL registration fee which players now pay in addition. A reduced registration fee of £60 is offered to families with more than one child registered.

The trustees may, at their discretion, reduce or cancel the registration fee required for any player for whom the cost would represent a barrier to participation.

The club received £6,700 in registration fees. Masters players are only required to pay fees on match days and this income amounted to around £330.

Plans for 2024

The trustees would like to increase participation levels at all age groups. Recruitment efforts will target younger children (3 to 5 year-olds) as we feel this age group is already being attracted by other sports. In addition the club will provide taster sessions at all age groups, promoted by campaigns on social media.

New protocols will be introduced by the RFL in 2024 to eliminate contact in the younger age groups in an attempt to promote the sport to new participants.

We will continue to provide opportunities for the younger players to take part in matchday activities at local professional clubs.

The trustees continue to look for opportunities to improve our matchday and training facilities. The junior players combined to participate in teams registered within the Yorkshire Junior & Youth League at age groups U7s, U8s, U10s, U11s, U12s, U14s and U16s.

The 2022 season was generally a successful one for the club, with the U16s deserving of special mention for their exploits in the Yorkshire Juniors Continuation Cup. They won the competition by beating Emley Moor in the final at the Fox's Biscuits Stadium in Batley. Congratulation to Harry Taylor on picking up the man-of-the-match.

On 4th June 2022, Guiseley Rangers player Lloyd McEwan Peters was selected in the Wales Under-16s team who beat England Lions Under-16s.

One of our former junior players, Evie Cousins, has signed with the Leeds Rhinos Women's Super League club while another former player, Fran Goldthorp, continued to impress with her performance in the Rugby League World Cup held in the autumn.

Masters

The trustees are proud that the club has now added a Women's Masters team to the existing Men's Masters with 15 players attending the first training session.

Well done to one of our Men's Masters, Michael Brook, who represented England in the 2022 International Festival of Masters Rugby League at York. The festival, the largest ever held, attracted teams from Australia, Canada, France, Ireland and Wales as well as the hosts, England.

Financial Review

Review of the Charity's Financial Position at the End of the Period

During this financial period, the club broadly broke even on income of around £21k.

Following the trustee's decision to buy the clubhouse the previous year, the trustees were satisfied with the turnover of just over £3,000 that this produced. For the first time this year, this included contactless payments as well as cash.

The increased number of players necessitated further investment in coach and volunteer training which the trustees see as essential to secure the future prosperity of the club.

The club ended the period with a bank balance of £39k. The trustees believe this to be sufficient to meet all its commitments as they fall due.

The Charity's Principal Sources of Funds

The club requires each junior player to pay an annual registration fee to cover costs associated with their participation. For the 2022 season, this was increased from £80 to £85. This included a brand-new cost to all players levied by the RFL at a rate of £12 for Primary players and £18 for Youth players, meaning that the club's income per player actually reduced.

The trustees may, at their discretion, reduce or cancel the registration fee required for any player for whom the cost would represent a barrier to participation.





This summary covers the end of the 2021 playing season. The trustees have decided that it makes more sense to have a financial accounting period which more closely aligns with the playing season. The following therefore only describes the remaining portion of the 2021 season not covered by the previous trustees' annual report.

Primary & Youth Rugby

Mercifully, the 2021 season progressed without further interruption on account of the Covid-19 pandemic and was completed successfully.

During the 2021 season the club had a total of 107 registered junior players and 40 registered volunteers. The number of players represents a 17% increase on the previous year which the trustees found very encouraging after the previous season had been abandoned due to Covid-19.

The junior players combined to participate in teams registered within the Yorkshire Junior & Youth League at age groups U8s, U10s, U11s, U13s and U15s.

The trustees were delighted to see 8 members of the Under 15s team selected for scholarships at two of the local professional clubs – Leeds Rhinos and Bradford Bulls.

Former Guiseley Rangers junior player Francesca Goldthorp had a remarkable season for Leeds Rhinos in the Women's Super League, setting a new club try-scoring record of 20 tries in 12 games, and narrowly losing out on the 2021 Woman of Steel award. She made her international debut against Wales on 26th June 2021, celebrating the occasion with her first international try.

The annual presentation night at Yeadon Town Hall was a highlight to the end-of-season celebrations, involving teams from every age group.

Masters

It was another season of consolidation for the Masters team who ended the season with a total of 22 registered players.

Financial Review

Review of the Charity's Financial Position at the End of the Period

During this shortened financial period (see above), the club made a loss of £4,653 on income of £7,125. The loss was almost entirely down to the one-off cost of £4,000 to obtain secure title to the club house from the previous club chairman. The legal arguments over this had been protracted and the trustees were pleased to finally bring this matter to a satisfactory conclusion in order to fully concentrate on taking the club forward.

Due to the expansion of the club's playing roster, additional coaches were required and the costs of training the coaches and other volunteers amounted to £1,100. The trustees view this as a worthwhile investment in the future development of the club.

The club ended the period with a bank balance of £40k. The trustees believe this to be sufficient to meet all its commitments as they fall due.

The Charity's Principal Sources of Funds

The club requires each junior player to pay an annual registration fee to cover costs associated with their participation. For the 2021 season, this cost remained £80.

The trustees may, at their discretion, reduce or cancel the registration fee required for any player for whom the cost would represent a barrier to participation.

The club received £2.4k in registration fees. Masters players are only required to pay fees on match days and this income amounted to around £200. Both these figures are lower than previous years as this period represents only a partial season.

Plans for 2022

It is the trustees hope that the 2022 season will see a continuing recovery from the effects of the Coronavirus pandemic on sport in general and the club in particular. To this end, the trustees would






The objects of the CIO are:

- (1) to promote community participation in healthy recreation for the benefit of the inhabitants of Guiseley and Rawdon ward by the provision of facilities for the playing of rugby league.
- (2) To promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of Guiseley and Rawdon ward and the surrounding area the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of

individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the conditions of life of said inhabitants.

(3) to help young people, especially but not exclusively through leisure time activities, so as to develop their capabilities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society.

Summary of the Main Activities Undertaken for the Public Benefit in Relation to the Charity's Objects

The club promotes participation in rugby league through the provision of facilities, equipment and coaching.

The club operates a number of rugby league teams at different age groups which take part in both competitive and non-competitive structures affiliated to the national governing body of the sport - the Rugby Football League.

Statutory Declaration

The trustees declare that they have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the Main Achievements of the Charity during the Period

Although severely disrupted by the Covid-19 pandemic, during the 2020 season the club had 91 registered junior players at the following age groups:

Under 7s (6 registered players)

Under 10s (25)

Under 12s (25)

Under 14s (35)

The start of the junior teams' 2020 season was suspended due to the pandemic. Limited training resumed under the RFL *Return To Play* protocols in July 2020, with each team enjoying a couple of friendly matches at the end of the season.

The 2021 season commenced at the end of May and the trustees sincerely hope this heralds the return of more normal activities.

All Masters matches were also suspended on 16th Match 2020 due to the pandemic.

Financial Review

Review of the Charity's Financial Position at the End of the Period

Whilst the impact on the club's activities during the period was devastating, the financial impact of the Covid-19 pandemic was not as great as the trustees initially feared due to the receipt of grants totalling £17,431 from Leeds City Council during the period. These grants were able to counter the effects of the restrictions and off-set the costs related to ensuring participant safety, and came on top of the £10k received in the previous period.

As anticipated, payments under the terms of the lease (which was signed in 2017) commenced in January 2021, with the charges (including arrears) totalling £6,000

The club ended the period with a bank balance of £45k, a figure that was significantly higher than the opening balance of £31k. This was due to one-off income from Covid-related grants, coupled with broadly flat income from other sources (predominantly sponsorship and registration fees), and expenditure which was lower than expected as a result of the pandemic.

The trustees believe this to be sufficient to meet all its commitments as they fall due.

The Charity's Principal Sources of Funds

The club requires each junior player to pay an annual registration fee to cover costs associated with their participation. For the 2020 season, this cost remained £80.

The trustees may, at their discretion, reduce or cancel the registration fee required for any player for whom the cost would represent a barrier to participation.

The club received £6.7k in registration fees which was a slight increase on the figure for the previous year.

Masters players are only required to pay fees on match days and due to no matches being played during the period, there was no income from Masters match fees.

Plans for 2020/21

It is the trustees hope that there will be a diminishing effect of the Coronavirus pandemic in 2020/21. Although the club are naturally keen to see rugby league participation return to pre-pandemic levels, the trustees share the governing body's focus on the need to ensure the safety of all involved. The club will continue to adhere to the protocols set out by the Rugby Football League, along with local and national government guidelines.

There is still an on-going dispute over the club's access to the clubhouse. The club has so far incurred legal costs of £600, and the trustees anticipate that additional expenditure of up to £5k will be required to gain good title to the property.


