The biggest event we had in the year was a donation of £250,000 to the East Lancs NHS trust for the purchase of a state of the art Olympus Endosonographic machine. That is used to both detect and take biopsy samples in ultra high resolution. Additionally the machine is semi-mobile and can be relocated to where it is needed in the hospital setting eg operating theatre, A+E dept.

We have had fantastic feedback already on the numbers of patients they have been able to help diagnose already.


